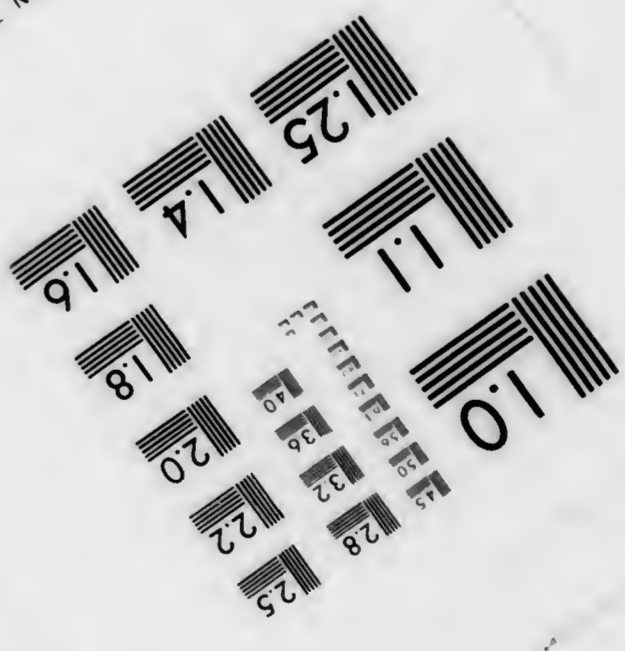

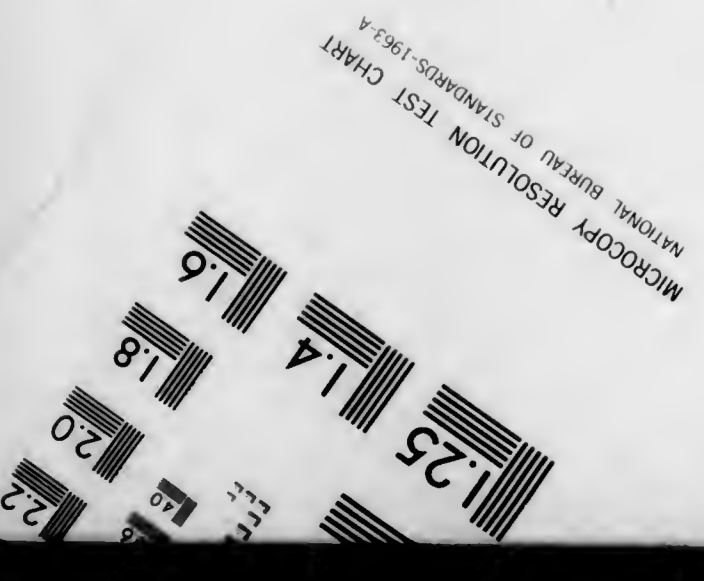

active service outside of the State. This does not include citizens of Ohio who have entered military organizations of other States, because of want of authority to receive them in the Ohio contingent, the number of which is estimated at 10,000. The total amount expended for war purposes to January 1st, 1862, including unpaid liabilities is \$2,339,451; whole amount retained by the United States to Ohio, \$1,077,930. The Governor thinks the ultimate effect of the war will be the extinction of slavery, but deprecates immediate emancipation.

XXXVII CONGRESS—FIRST SESSION.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6. House.—Mr. Conkling rising to a question of privilege called attention to the fact that the second day of the session a resolution was adopted with reference to the battle of Bull Run. The resolution prohibited no investigation into future transactions whatever. It simply requested the Secretary of War to report to the House whether any steps had been taken to ascertain who was responsible for the disaster.

The resolution was handed to the Adjutant General, who submitted it to the Command-in-Chief. He (Conkling) was unwilling to believe that the Command-in-Chief had read the resolution, because he could not impute to him the desire to trifle with the House and return an evasive answer. If he had read it he certainly understood its purpose. He seemed to have received the impression that a future enquiry was to be instituted, and that of a very general character, and he accordingly expressed an opinion to the Adjutant General which was reported to the Secretary of War and by the latter transmitted to the House. The answer to the resolution did not inform the House that steps had been taken to show who was blame for the Bull Run disaster—the response was evasive. Now this was a disregard of the privileges of the House which ought to receive and requires a prompt notice. Unless we consent to a trampling on our rights we should watch with a jealous eye the right of wholesome inquiry. The enquiry related to a great national calamity, and to the most atrocious military murder ever committed in our history, and the most humiliating triumph of the rebellion. A blunder so gross that every man can see it, and no one has ever dared to deny and deny it. Besides the defeat and the large loss of arms and munitions of war, there was a sacrifice of 930 men. The resolution to which (Conkling) referred, proposed, not of respect to the memory of those men, and in deference to the public property and self-respect of the nation, to inquire whether the military authorities have taken any steps to ascertain who is responsible for the slaughter of the sons of New York, Massachusetts, and Pennsylvania. General Stone, who was at the time in command of the member of the regular army, Col. Baker was a volunteer. The respective friends of these gentlemen have raised a question as to the merits of the case involving the efficiency of regulars and volunteers. Mr. Conkling had no toleration for such a controversy. An enquiry was absolutely necessary. The man that is to blame should fall upon his knees and beg pardon. If Col. Baker was responsible most laudably he should be forgiven. If General Stone is responsible, a greater weight of guilt never rested upon a man than rests upon him.

Senator—Mr. Nesmith presented the credentials of Hon. Benjamin Stark, who was appointed Senator to fill the vacancy occasioned by the death of Senator Baker. Mr. Essenden moved that the administrator of the oath be moved to the present, and the credentials of Mr. Stark, together with certain papers which he held in his (presiding) hands, be referred to a Judiciary Committee. The papers were well attested by many of the most respectable portion of the inhabitants of Portland. The papers state that Mr. Stark is understood to be an open and avowed secessionist, that he defends the course of the South, and had given utterance to statements at war with the Government, such as expressing the attack on Fort Sumter, and declaring that in the case of war he would sell his property, go South and fight for the rebels. He (Essenden) had examined the papers with deliberation, and therefore made the motion. Mr. Bright said that there was no precedent for such a motion. He never knew of a case where a Senator had refused the oath. He thought the Senator had better be sworn, and then let the Senate take cognizance of the latter property. Never had better falsehoods been offered, than those in regard to himself which had been sent to the Senate here. He had in his pocket a copy of the New York Herald, where it was stated that he (Bright) was a Brigadier General in the army. Mr. Essenden said it was true that there was no precedent, but the state of the country was not without precedent, and we had no time to make precedents. These papers in reference to Mr. Stark were well attested by his neighbors and townsmen. Mr. Bayard thought the case had better go over until to-morrow, that Senators might have time to look into it. Mr. Trumbull said the case was without precedent, and referred to the case of Mr. Latham of Iowa, where credentials were referred, and also to the case of Mr. Griswold of Ohio, whose credentials were also referred.

Mr. Sumner said the case was unprecedented. The Senate is now examining the loyalty of certain members. Mr. Bright said there were members in the Senate in 1812 who were opposed to the war with Great Britain, and with the action of the Government. Mr. Bright said he supposed he was referred to by the Senator from Massachusetts (Sumner) at any rate he was in the category. He (Bright) was glad the Senate was examining, and so far as he was concerned he was only sorry that they were so slow. He was anxious for a result. Mr. Lane of Indiana, thought that sufficient for the day was the evil thereof. When other cases come up the Senate will be ready to vote. There could be no difference of opinion in regard to the present war by any party. The credentials of Mr. Stark, and the papers handed by Mr. Essenden, were then laid on the table for the present. Mr. Wilson presented a petition from the citizens of Pennsylvania that John C. Fremont be appointed Lieut. General. Mr. Wilson also presented a petition in reference to Gen. McIntosh, representing that he was confined in prison clearly in violation of the rules of war.

Foreign News.

HAVRE, Jan. 6. The steamer Bohemian from Liverpool 26th, via London 27th, has arrived. Business generally in Liverpool and London had been suspended, owing to the holidays. No provision nor breakfast market. Hon. Anson Burlingame, Minister to China, had arrived at Canton and was well received. Placards were posted in the streets of Hong Kong threatening the extermination of all Europeans. There was great excitement at Lisbon and the body of the King was to be disinterred.
