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Pursuing a Vocation of Compassion

MY INTRODUCTION TO THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS WAS an inauspicious one. I was standing in line buying lunch during freshman orientation and spilled my lunch tray on Brother Gerry Molyneaux. It has been more than 20 years, and I still can picture the cup of Sprite tipping over.

I would be dishonest if I said that Br. Gerry, a communication professor, did not tease me a little in that moment. But when he recognized the pure terror in my freshman eyes, he demonstrated the compassion that I consider one of the hallmarks of a great teacher. He taught me my first important lesson in college: not to take myself too seriously.

That has probably been a life-saving lesson. It has given me the freedom to explore my career and to be open to many new experiences. So, in some basic way, I owe Br. Gerry thanks for helping to shape my career.

I am a pediatrician. But unlike many pediatricians, I care each day for children who have suffered abuse and degradation. Some have been starved. Some have been abandoned. Most have been sexually abused. I am asked all the time why I chose my work as a child-abuse pediatrician. I find myself sometimes wordless as I try to explain the concept of vocation.

Fortunately, I had some help in developing that concept. The La Salle mission statement says: "The programs of the University also aim at preparing students for informed service and progressive leadership in their communities and to fulfill the immediate and final goals of their lives." I never once read the mission statement when I was a student. But the mission was alive in my experience of La Salle.

The faculty who taught me knew that they were not just there to make sure I learned what I needed to be successful in medical school. They knew that in order for me to have a successful life, I needed to be nurtured in my social and spiritual life. They supported my efforts to participate in campus life and to provide service to the larger community.

So, in addition to learning physics and biology, I learned about the world outside the classroom. Some of the lessons challenged my intellect. Some of them challenged my soul.

Through campus ministry, I was given the opportunity to reach out to people who were homeless and living



in cardboard boxes. I learned how soup kitchens work and what poverty in Philadelphia looked like. I learned to talk to people whose life experience was vastly different from my own. Coupling these lessons with those in the classroom helped me to understand emotionally and intellectually many issues of social justice. My La Salle education opened the door to much higher goals.

With this door open, I continued my education and finished medical school. Pediatrics was my chosen field, and I enjoyed working with children and their families, first in a rural setting and then in an urban one. In my work I was often

struck by the reality that mistreatment of children cut across all social strata. It was clear to me that the children who had experienced abuse and neglect needed the best care possible from their physicians. I have dedicated my career to providing that care.

On any given day, I have the opportunity to meet wonderful children. Often I have the opportunity to help families make children safe and help them heal. Some days, I see such harm inflicted upon children that I am left speechless. In those moments I am most aware of the influence of my La Salle experience. I am grateful for the guidance of my mentors who helped me develop an inner sense of what is truly important work.

I had thought the most important lesson Br. Gerry taught me on my first day at La Salle was to not take myself too seriously. But I have since learned the truth. The real lesson was this: Compassion can transform any situation.

Advocating Progress in Africa

AFTER RECONNECTING WITH HER ROOTS IN Yacolidabouo in the Ivory Coast, Yolande Gordon, '99, was inspired to help the village grow. Gordon's passion to improve these West African communities, sparked by her father's own nonprofit work, led to the recent development of Yakoly.org—a nonprofit organization committed to erasing poverty in African villages.

Yakoly.org is not Gordon's first service-related venture. Through the years, she has devoted time to the AIDS Walk, Ronald McDonald House, and Philadelphia Cares. While a student at La Salle, she joined several organizations and learned to live the University's mission by way of its dedicated staff. Assistant Professor of Finance Kathleen McNichol made a profound impact on Gordon while she was a member of Gamma Iota Sigma, the Risk Management and Insurance Society.

"She showed us what dedication to a cause meant, and what it is to be well-organized," Gordon said. "She will probably never take credit for it, but she is an inspiration for me and I am sure for many other students."

Gordon left the insurance industry after eight years to develop her nonprofit. Last December, she and her husband traveled to Yacolidabouo, west of Ghana along the southern shore of the Ivory Coast, to understand the community's struggles and goals. As a result, Yakoly.org pledged to help villagers understand basic health and safety, explore natural resources, create jobs through these resources to increase income, and develop lifelong education and career opportunities for younger generations.

Q: How did you and your husband get introduced to the situation at Yacolidabouo?

My roots are from the Ivory Coast but I never really lived there. I grew up in France and then moved to the United States at the age of 19. I never had a true connection with the Ivory Coast, except for the fact that that's where my genetic pool is from. My father is a huge advocate for helping the less fortunate lead the way, and he created a nonprofit organization called Ouyine.

This nonprofit helps villages reorganize themselves with a modern African approach. In other words, the organization brings an African thought process as opposed to a European thought process to how a village should be organized. So we heard about the progress of Yacoli through Ouyine and decided that this village was a great way to shed some light on development projects led by Africans.

Q: How did you organize Yakoly.org and determine what needed to be done?

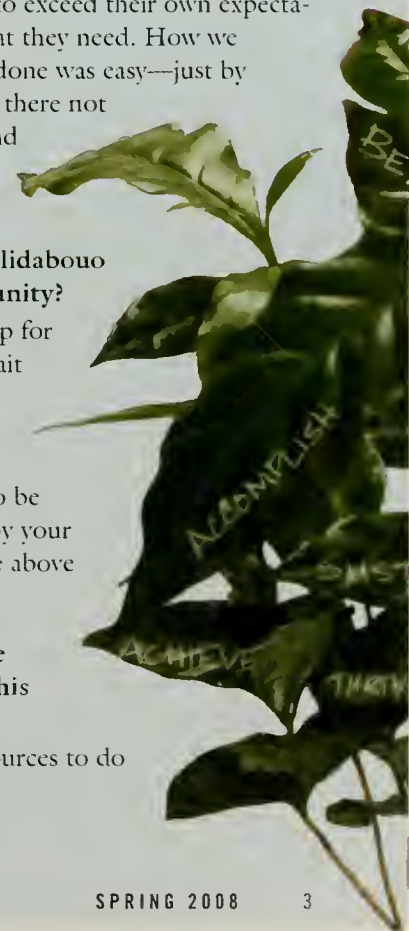
At first, we had no idea what needed to be done ... so we started communicating with Ouyine and other people from the village via e-mail to get an overall idea. We then scheduled a trip to the Ivory Coast that would allow enough time to experience the village life. I have to say that I fell in love with the village and the people's pride in what they have accomplished. What is even more amazing is that they want to go further—they want to exceed their own expectations and they know exactly what they need. How we determined what needed to be done was easy—just by listening. I believe that we were there not to impose but to help, guide, and exchange ideas.

Q: Why have you decided to focus on establishing Yacolidabouo as a self-sustaining community?

They receive government help for their schools, but you cannot wait for government assistance and other nonprofits that work through governments to erase poverty. ... There has to be a clear understanding that it is by your own hard work that you can rise above poverty. No more begging.

Q: How did you find the time and resources to take on this initiative?

There is always time and resources to do a project that you have at heart.





Q: What was the biggest hurdle to overcome as you organized your effort?

Money is always the problem. Everything—the Web site, the trip, etc.—have been financed by my husband and me. It's a challenge that comes to anyone who is building an organization.

Q: How would you encourage others to pursue a life of service, even if they have less time to devote to the cause?

I actually had a similar conversation with a client and a colleague when I was working in the insurance industry in London. I told them that you do not have to pursue a life of service because you really have to go there because your heart leads you there. It is certainly not to make money! What I told them is that everyone should help out in their community, whether it is their church, local youth club, etc...

A life of service does not have to be a full-time activity; it can be one hour a week or two hours every three months. What is important is to share with others.

Q: What can others do for Yakoly.org?

Help us spread the word and understand that development in Africa is possible, but governments are corrupt and that

Protecting the Innocent

EVER HEARD A JOKE ABOUT A LAWYER? IN THE MORE THAN 25 years that Frank Cervone, M.A. '04, has been a lawyer, he's heard plenty. However, in his work as Executive Director of the Support Center for Child Advocates, a nonprofit that links volunteer lawyers with abused and neglected children who need legal representation, Cervone has seen the flip side to the ruthless lawyer stereotype.

"We attract some wonderfully compassionate lawyers who step up to donate their time and expose themselves to tremendous emotional strain," Cervone said. "The opportunity to use this profession for good is wonderful, and when I meet others who are doing the same, as I have throughout my career, I find an affirmation."

Cervone, who holds a master's degree in theology and ministry from La Salle and has received the Signum Fidei Medal from the University's Alumni Association for his work, has been Executive Director of the Support Center for Child Advocates since 1992. The center recruits, trains, and supports lawyers who represent child victims in a variety of legal settings. Working with the center's staff of social workers and lawyers who are child abuse professionals, the volunteer lawyers represent children who have experienced abuse, neglect, and other trauma in their home lives.

"One of the things that's important to us is that we represent the whole child—the need for counseling, how he's doing in school, whether he has a safe and permanent home," Cervone said.

Cervone was initiated into social justice work when he was a student at La Salle College High School and volunteered to visit the elderly in nursing homes. Later, in law school at Villanova, he got involved at the Delaware County Legal Assistance Association in Chester, Pa. In the meantime, he had become a Christian Brother, and, after graduating from law school, he went to work as legal counsel for St. Gabriel's System, a Christian Brothers-run treatment program for juvenile offenders.

is what will slow us down. We will also start organizing fundraisers by the end of the year. Of course, your material contributions, such as school supplies, are much appreciated.

Q: What are your goals and hopes for the organization?

I have confidence in the organization, but I am worried about African governments. Having spent so much time with the villagers, I realize that they want the same thing we all do—the means to be able to prosper and care for their family. But when a corrupt government is in place, the entire country will face difficulty rising above poverty.

I hope that we will get to a level where we can show that there is not just one village worth speaking about. I hope that the Western media will not always show the wars and famines in Africa. ...We never speak about progress, whatever size the progress is. That's what I want to change. I want Africa to be seen truly how it is: a diverse continent that is struggling to find its identity.

Cervone joined the Support Center for Child Advocates as general counsel in 1990 and was named executive director in 1992. Although he left the religious life in 1989, Cervone has carried with him a Lasallian approach to building relationships with and caring for others.

“When I got to see people in need in various social justice works and in poverty law practice, this dimension of feeling the pain of the other built on that sense of being in relationship to the other,” he said. “When you feel the pain of another, you want to relieve that pain. That's common for all of us in the helping professions.”

Through his job, Cervone witnesses firsthand some of the saddest stories told in society—stories of traumatized children, troubled teenagers, suffering families. But, he said, he and those he works with find inspiration in being a part of the healing that comes after the lowest point in a person's life.

“The poor will always be with you,” he said. “The challenge and question is: What are you going to do next? Are you going to turn away? Or are you going to use your resources, your talents to help bring that sad story into some kind of light? When one does that they feel better and more alive as a human being, and it's happened a thousand times to me. Why wouldn't I keep doing it?”

in between, nearly 150 La Salle alumni have devoted their time and talents to the Peace Corps in 55 different countries.

Launched March 1, 1961, the Peace Corps provides an opportunity for people to use their skills to improve the lives of others worldwide. Many La Salle alumni who spent their college years reaching out to the Philadelphia area have elected to continue their mission of service

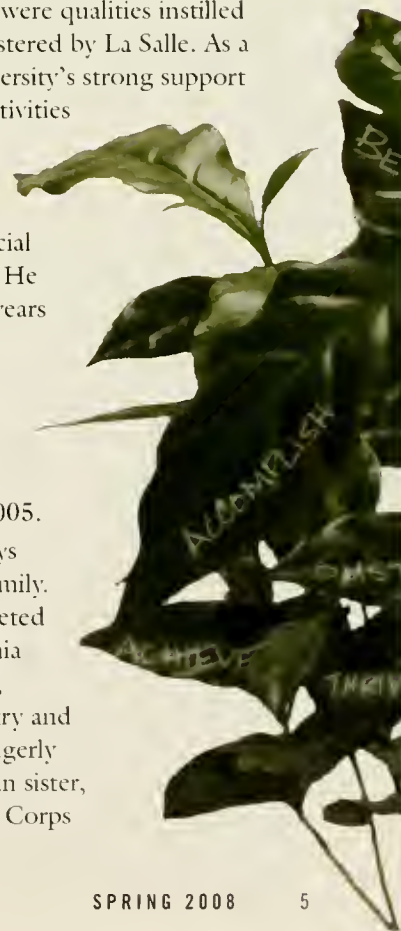
for those in greater need around the globe.

Dan O'Brien, '99, of Haddon Heights, N.J., Elena DiGiovanna, '03, of Roxbury, N.Y., and Carole Kindling, '96, of Erie, Pa., are some of the service-oriented La Salle alumni who felt called to a higher cause. For two years, they rose above the challenges of foreign circumstances to express new ideals, educate their communities, and lay the groundwork for improvement in developing countries.

Volunteerism and selflessness were qualities instilled in O'Brien by his parents and fostered by La Salle. As a student, he recognized the University's strong support for service and participated in activities like Martin Luther King Jr. Day. O'Brien had considered the Peace Corps in college, but he felt the need to address financial responsibilities after graduation. He worked at Vanguard for several years before meeting a Peace Corps volunteer who reinvigorated his interest.

“For better or for worse, I knew I'd grow,” said O'Brien, who headed to Jordan in July 2005.

The spirit of service had always been present in DiGiovanna's family. As an undergraduate, she completed community service in Philadelphia and traveled to Tijuana, Mexico, with La Salle's University Ministry and Service program. DiGiovanna eagerly followed the footsteps of her twin sister, who volunteered with the Peace Corps



in Paraguay, when she joined the organization in September 2005 and headed to the Dominican Republic.

The University Ministry and Service program also played a role in Kindling's college experience as she set aside

time for prison tutoring. She pursued nonprofit work after college, but longed to tackle something more challenging overseas. Kindling joined the Peace Corps in 2005 and headed to the former Soviet republic of Georgia.

The Peace Corps determined each person's location and assignment according to his or her skills and experiences. Both O'Brien and DiGiovanna were assigned to youth and community development, while Kindling worked with a nongovernmental organization on health education and environmental impact.

"Every community is different," DiGiovanna said. "It's a learning process of what the community needs and wants."

In the Dominican Republic, DiGiovanna taught life skills, like self-esteem and conflict resolution, as well as the long-term values of education. "It's more about human development and trying to get people to work together," she said.

O'Brien knew only a few dozen Arabic words when he was assigned to Jordan, but he quickly discovered that his native English language was a highly desired skill. While working at a community youth center, he taught English to high school and college-age boys, coached basketball, and introduced the community to flag football.



Creating an Oasis of Peace

KAREN PUSHAW, '78, TRADED HER SPOT IN A MAIN LINE condominium community for a bedroom in a less-than-impressive house in the Kensington section of Philadelphia about 17 years ago. While just a quick El ride away from the prestigious Center City law firm where she used to work, she moved worlds away to serve the city's poor as a full-time, unpaid volunteer.

Pushaw graduated from La Salle with a bachelor's degree in political science and then received her law degree from the University of Pennsylvania. In her 10 years as a lawyer, she saw Philadelphia's growing homeless population each day during her short walk from the train station to the high-rise where she worked. She felt more and more inclined to serve these people and decided to enroll in a year-long, faith-based volunteer program.

"I didn't want to be in the office in the back doing studies and typing up statistics about the problem. I wanted hands-on interaction with the people," she said. She knew St. Francis Inn would provide her that opportunity from the moment she stepped in the door. "I had been there about

an hour, and I thought it was one of the dirtiest, smelliest places I had ever been, but yet it was where I wanted to be," she said. She left the law firm two years later with her colleagues' blessing to take an offer they couldn't match—a career as a full-time volunteer.

The Philadelphia native has worked as part of the II-person team that runs the Inn since 1991. They all serve as co-directors because their Gospel values promote a fraternal model. The Inn provides basic outreach to the impoverished community, offering home-cooked meals, a secure mailing address, clothing vouchers to its thrift shop, and referrals to social service agencies. Guests come from all over the city to eat at the Inn, which serves 10 meals a week with a minimum of 300 people per meal. Pushaw's legal background also has enabled her to help guests and the organization itself with legal questions and referrals.

"It's a lot more than stirring a pot of soup," she said. "People come to us in crisis and we drop everything to see how we can help." Often that means providing a shoulder to cry on, a friendly voice of reassurance, and a few hours

“The first year can be really difficult as you’re getting the acceptance of the community,” he said. “You have to work with what you know.”

Kindling, too, first found it challenging to meet her goals because of the language barrier. Speaking Georgian has been compared to learning Chinese, she said. “It’s difficult, but they love that you try,” Kindling said. “Some people expect to make a big impact. I made a little impact that I think will remain intact through the people I met.”

Eventually, she picked up the native language with her host family and educated the community on issues like women’s health and hygiene. She also ran an environmental camp for children.

Despite its initial hurdles, the Peace Corps proved to be rewarding, according to the alumni. “The experience was challenging and worthwhile. I wouldn’t have changed any of the obstacles that came about, because I learned from them,” DiGiovanna said.

In the Dominican Republic, DiGiovanna was thrilled to take part of the construction of a small school library and hopes to return for the library’s inauguration. She also coached soccer.

During his second year, O’Brien worked with Operation Smile, which flew hundreds of Iraqi children into Jordan for medical attention. He also introduced the “Phenomenal Woman’s Essay Contest” to promote gender equality and

organized the area’s first computer lab, which helps him keep in touch with the community.

Kindling has already returned to Georgia to attend a wedding. She said the area’s motto, “Guests are a gift from God,” made it easy to maintain communication with her newfound friends. “They need to know we’re still available for advice,” she said.

As the volunteers returned home to contemplate their experiences, they realized their devotion to service had deepened. O’Brien and DiGiovanna are both considering jobs in Washington, D.C., or overseas, where they can apply their international skills. Kindling has considered returning to school and also may pursue work in D.C.

“You have to be able to recognize the progress and don’t focus on the adversity,” O’Brien said. “Then you can appreciate the success.”

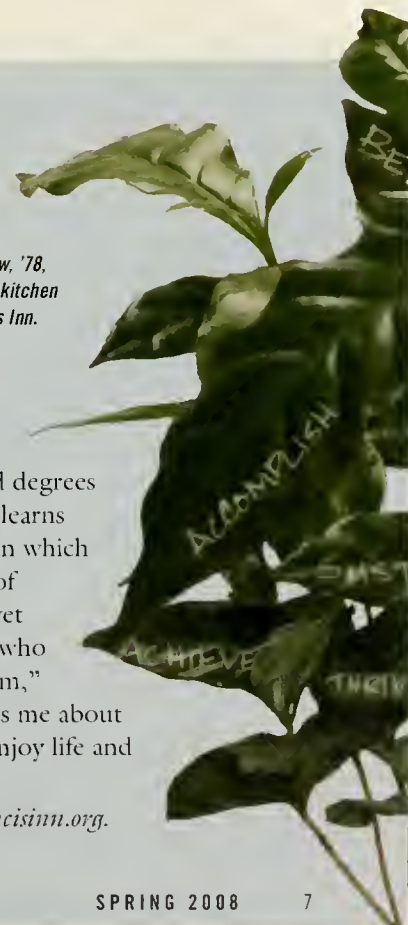

of peace in a violent community. A mural on the outside wall personifies reconciliation and nonviolence, the peacemaking attributes of St. Francis of Assisi. “It captures what we hope to achieve,” she said. “An oasis of peace in the middle of the ghetto, where people can feel they’re appreciated and valued and human.”

La Salle’s decision to recognize Pushaw with an honorary doctorate in 2005 stunned her. She felt the University’s recognition of her service showed its strong institutional commitment to living out Christian values.

Yet no number of honors and degrees could encapsulate what Pushaw learns every day from the community in which she lives and serves. “The level of poverty here is so extreme and yet the guests don’t seem to resent who we are or where we’ve come from,” she said. “The thing that inspires me about them is that they seem able to enjoy life and they have a great resiliency.”

Committing to La Salle's Mission of Compassion

ONE MORNING, AT THE END OF SERVING BREAKFAST TO 50 men and women at the Holy Family Catholic Worker House in Kansas City, Mo., Vicki Kline, '05, noticed one man lying across a few chairs in the back of the dining room. She tried to wake him and noticed that he seemed to be in pain. Worried, Kline led the man, whose name she did not even know, to her car and took him to the hospital.

For most people, and even for Kline up until a few years ago, the story of taking a perfect stranger to the hospital would be one they'd tell for days and perhaps remember for the rest of their lives. During Kline's two years as a Lasallian Volunteer, however, witnessing personal crises among the needy and often homeless individuals and families at Holy Family House was part of the routine.

"Things that we would view as crises outside of that environment are part of daily life—you take people to detox, you break up fights, you confront destructive behavior," she said. "My experience was a crash course in understanding human emotions and in discovering how open you are

to the full experience of service."

Kline, who graduated from La Salle with a degree in social work, joined the Lasallian Volunteers just after college and was assigned to Holy Family House, a soup kitchen and

family shelter. There, she lived in community with other volunteers and a Christian Brother.

She helped to run the soup kitchen, which served 200 people a day, six days a week, and also held another job on the side.

Resident volunteers at Holy Family House agree to live simply and in voluntary poverty by practicing the values of the Catholic Worker Movement, which was founded by Dorothy Day and Peter Maurin, a former Christian Brother.

"Living in a place like Holy Family House makes you strip yourself of all sorts of preconceived notions

Reaching Out to Others

SEVERAL MEMBERS OF THE LA SALLE community have taken the University's commitment to community service to heart with their dedication to the organizations Back On My Feet and City Year.

Back On My Feet (BOMF) is a nonprofit organization that encourages Philadelphia's homeless population to become healthy in mind and body by building confidence and self-esteem through running. Two staff members—Shonta Collins and Andrea Young—are lead runners for BOMF who guide and encourage a group in a several-mile run through the city.

Andrea Young runs with BOMF two mornings each week before coming to work at La Salle as a resident coordinator. She said working at La Salle encouraged

her to become involved. "The University supports people and encourages them to do things for others," she said.

Shonta Collins, the International Education Coordinator for the Multicultural and International Center at La Salle,

of what service is, what faith is, what spirituality is supposed to be in the face of injustice and violence,” Kline said. “You’re trying to pare yourself down to the basic elements of being compassionate and being there for somebody.”

Kline found that being fully engaged in the lives of others comes at a hefty emotional price. Catholic Workers often have a sense of humor about this experience. One volunteer created a list of coping strategies for the stress, including: “Go to your room and cry if necessary, but then come downstairs and do the dishes.”

Today, though her official commitment to the Lasallian Volunteers has ended, Kline is still involved, even as she pursues a master’s degree in social work at the University of Missouri-Kansas City and works with female inmates in an enrichment program at a municipal jail. She has noticed the common link of poverty between the inmates and the people she serves at Holy Family House.

“Speaking out on behalf of the friends I’ve made, who live under bridges or get arrested or get deported, has allowed me to become a part of their lives,” she said. “Nothing that I do is ever completely detached from their reality, and it has shown me how interdependent we are.”

has been involved with BOMF for about seven months. She said that running with the organization empowers her. When she runs, she feels “healthier, lighter, and better all around.”

Like Back On My Feet, City Year is an organization that brings people together. City Year organizes diverse groups of young people between the ages of 18 to 24 and provides them with the opportunity to spend a year doing full-time service. Sean McDevitt, '00, and Tim Hannigan, '96, became involved in City Year after graduating.

“I had the desire to do something involving service and education,” said Hannigan who earned a bachelor’s degree in education from La Salle. “I didn’t want to jump directly into a classroom teaching job.” Hannigan became involved in City Year when the organization started its Philadelphia chapter in 1997, and he was active in the organization for two years.

McDevitt worked for City Year Boston, spending his time as part of a group of 10 leading an after-school program for seventh-graders. He and his group tutored the children and

A HISTORY OF SERVICE

Since the Lasallian Volunteer Program began in 1989, more than 400 lay volunteers have joined Christian Brothers in their mission around the country. Over the years, 17 La Salle graduates have committed one or two years to service as teachers, tutors, coaches, social workers, and staff members at schools, homeless shelters, soup kitchens, and recreation centers.

And even after their commitments ended, a few alums have remained closely connected to the Lasallian Volunteers. Kelly Burke Laflamme, '93, a Lasallian Volunteer from 1993 to 1995, is Co-Chair of the organization's Advisory Board, and David Shronk, '93, a program volunteer from 1993 to 1994, serves on the Lasallian Volunteer Program's fundraising committee.

Kline said that the opportunities she had at La Salle to explore Philadelphia, to speak up on issues she felt passionate about, and to interact with faculty who encouraged her to think critically about what she could do for others, solidified her goals.

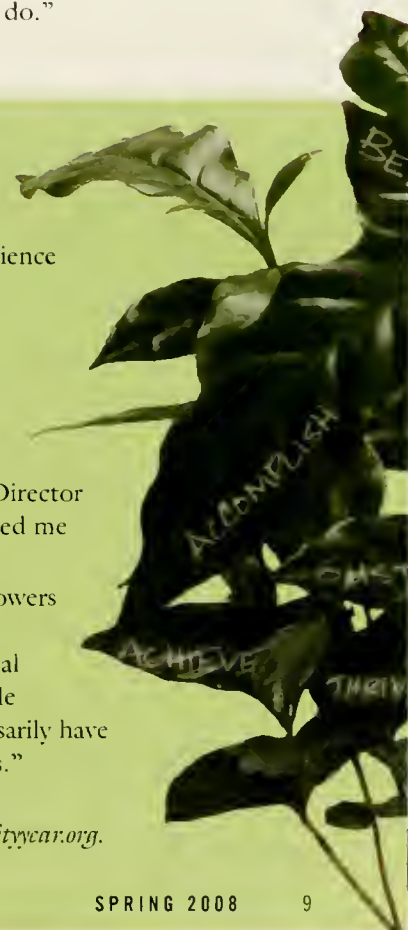

AS ONE OF THE AREA'S LARGEST CHARITIES, VARIETY—The Children's Charity of Greater Philadelphia provides programs and services to approximately 10,000 children with disabilities in the Delaware Valley.

Variety's Executive Director, Andrew Pack, '95, has improved the organization's status to that of a premier chapter in the country, which has earned it the Fiscal Excellence Award. This honor has been bestowed upon Variety of Philadelphia both years Pack has served as its director. It recognizes the chapter that has shown the greatest increase in revenue, the lowest administrative costs, and the largest development of new programs for children with disabilities.

"I love being able to give back," Pack said. "It's great to be in a position to apply a business philosophy to the nonprofit sector, developing cost-effective programs through fundraising, which truly make an impact on the lives of the children we serve."

The center collaborates with social workers and medical professionals to provide the best care for children on the spectrum, especially during the vital time immediately following diagnosis.

"A child with autism in Philadelphia is forced to wait for an average of two years before receiving health care," Pack said. "The Family Resource Center helps children and their families receive immediate help."

Pack has also enlisted the support of many La Salle alums for Variety. "I am surrounded by unbelievable people who give of themselves while asking nothing in return," he said.

Nurturing the Needy

"I GET MY DRIVE FROM BEING ABLE to provide services to people who have a need, in the hope that their troubles will ease, even just a bit," said Melanie Gavin, MSN '97.

"People actually do go on to an improved quality of life." Gavin turned a nursing practicum requirement for the master's program at La Salle into an opportunity to serve the needs of the community for a decade.

"The need was there. The community was there," Gavin said. St. Vincent's Health Center, located in Germantown, was born to meet the needs of St. Vincent Dining Room guests by improving health of mind,

spirit, and body. Respect and emotional support are at the core of St. Vincent Health Center's services, which provides relief from the everyday discomforts of the poor and homeless.

Gavin's goal upon arriving at St. Vincent's was to expand the health center in order to make the services more widely available. The center provides nursing care, health education, and assistance by linking people to the appropriate health and social services. "The volunteer nurses at St. Vincent's had been talking about expanding, but no one had enough time to take it on," Gavin said. At the time, the health center was open only one hour on Sunday for three Sundays each month.

During Gavin's employment, staff expanded from a strictly volunteer basis to include an administrative employee, two staff nurses, and a volunteer nurse for each shift. The health center broadened its hours as well, opening

Encouraging the Next Generation

"VISITING THE CHILDREN IS A GREAT WAY TO RECHARGE. The preschool is a happy place," said Jim Mullan, '61, MBA '78, about Early Years, Counseling or Referral Agency (CORA) Services' state-licensed preschool program in the Fox Chase neighborhood of Northeast Philadelphia.

It's no wonder the preschool is such a happy place. When CORA recently constructed its new facility, they didn't build typical, run-of-the-mill classrooms to house their child-care center; instead, they paved the halls like city streets and painted the walls with towering skyscrapers, creating a unique, child-sized city for the preschoolers to care about and learn within.

Mullan, who serves as Chair of CORA Services' Board of Directors, said the nonprofit treats all of its clients with this kind of specialized attention—which is one of the reasons, he believes, the nonprofit improves the lives of the more than 20,000 children and families it works with each year.

When Mullan retired from his position as Chairman and CEO of PrimeSource Corp. four years ago, he thought carefully about how to best spend the energy once devoted to his profession. Of course, he wanted to see more of his family, but, believing that "success reflects not just your career, but the spectrum of your entire life," he wanted to use his retirement to contribute to the community.

Since then, Mullan has actively dedicated his talents as a business leader to CORA Services, though his relationship with the organization began about 20 years ago.

Founded in 1971 under the sponsorship of the Sisters of Good Shepherd, CORA Services provides a range of educational and counseling programs in the Greater Philadelphia region, including the city's East Germantown section, where Mullan was born and raised.

In part, it was this neighborhood tie that acquainted Mullan with CORA in the 1980s. The involvement of the Good Shepherd nuns, who Mullan recalled "had been a positive presence in the neighborhood growing up," especially led him to support the nonprofit. Now, after years of working with the organization, its core value of individualized care reminds Mullan of the Lasallian tradition that both motivated him as a student and inspired his dedication to service.

"Much like La Salle, what CORA offers is not a one-fits-all, cookie-cutter approach to care," he said.

for four hours on Saturdays and three hours on Sundays. "We eventually got a social worker, which was a huge God-send," Gavin said. "She could take the next step with our guests with regard to housing and jobs."

Gavin said that spending one-on-one time with health center guests—who may be homeless, elderly, uninsured, or living with addictions and depression—is vital to its success. The nurses at St. Vincent's teach the message of primary health care and prevention to those who live in poverty and deal with addictions. Gavin said, "At times, it's as simple as blood pressure check and a bar of soap."

Gavin became Director of St. Vincent Health Center in 1997, a position she held until her departure in 2006. She currently works through Einstein Hospital as a visiting nurse for the Immune Deficiency Center for the hospital's HIV clinic.

"Much like the mission of the Christian Brothers, the nurses at St. Vincent's Health Center serve the community. The clients keep us going," Gavin said. "In many ways, we benefit as much as they do from the encounters in the health center. You get enough small successes that make it worthwhile."

Achieving Victory Against All Odds

GROWING UP IN A TOUGH PHILADELPHIA NEIGHBORHOOD with a passion for the city's impressive, but often disheartening, sports teams, it's no wonder Sister Mary Alan Barszczewski, '75, has a fighting spirit.

Sr. Alan, originally of Fishtown, recently received the President's Medallion from Felician College, her first *alma mater*, for her lifelong dedication to St. Anthony's High School in Jersey City, N.J. The inner-city Catholic school's story of survival—with Sr. Alan working 24 years as the unlikely Athletic Director—is also in the works as a movie.

Home of the nation's No. 1 high school boy's basketball team, St. Anthony's is often mistaken for a prosperous private school to those unaware of its circumstances. Since her placement at St. Anthony's 30 years ago, Sr. Alan has struggled to overcome the school's financial troubles and has led its students to success. Even today, as she battles reoccurring liver cancer, Sr. Alan makes the school her first priority.

"We're giving them a sense of hope," she said. "When I became a sister, I desired to help kids and always wanted to be in education. I didn't find my niche until I was doing it."

After earning her associate's degree at Felician College, Sr. Alan went to work

as a teacher in Wilmington, Del. While teaching, she began attending night classes at La Salle to pursue her bachelor's degree in education. She earned her master's degree from Villanova.

Her assignment to St. Anthony's in 1977 was disappointing. "For a Philly kid at heart, I was less than thrilled," Sr. Alan said. "Wilmington was closer to Philly." Although farther from home, she found that she easily related to the school's inner-city kids.

At that point, St. Anthony's already had a phenomenal basketball team and outsiders were contemplating whether the high school was cheating. The principal suggested Sr. Alan, a history teacher who had played basketball in high school, become Athletic Director to ease the tension. A tenacious group from Hudson County with the reputation for being the area's "good ol' boys" held the first athletic meeting in the back of a bar—but to their surprise, the nun showed up.

"I learned as I went," she said.

Sr. Alan and basketball Coach Bob Hurley developed a strong bond to the benefit of their students. Hurley was a strict disciplinarian on the court, and Sr. Alan lent a compassionate ear to students when things weren't going right.

“We used basketball to better their lives,” she said. “To this day, we get a lot of kids who are below level in basic skills, and we bring them up to the next level. It’s an ongoing battle.”

Many of the students excel in basketball, but they feel they can’t accomplish anything else, Sr. Alan said. Those at St. Anthony’s are driven to change that attitude.

“The kids are just looking for people who will be positive with them and give them hope and encouragement,” Sr. Alan said. “They need someone to listen to them.”

For more than three decades, Sr. Alan has witnessed the impact of having provided a positive voice for her students. But possibly the most appreciated moment came recently, when current and former students returned sentiments of care and optimism during the fight of her life. For the past six years, she has sought vigorous and experimental treatments to battle liver cancer. The situation looked bleak last year, so friends recently threw her a “thank you” party.

“What stands out in my mind is how caring the kids were,” Sr. Alan said. “It’s the most wonderful feeling of success. They come back and visit and have become good contributors of society. They’re parents who are bringing their children back to school.”

Amazingly, doctors offered Sr. Alan a new pill—without the negative side effects of chemotherapy—and were thrilled with the results. She is back to St. Anthony’s several times a week to continue the school’s plan for the future.

Each year, the school must raise \$1.5 million to survive. A core group at St. Anthony’s, including Sr. Alan as Vice President of the school, has worked tirelessly to develop a board of trustees who can continue the school’s mission.

“It takes a tremendous amount of energy,” she said. “When it’s time for me to retire, I hope there’s a good development office in place and an endowment established so the work of the school can continue.”

Looking back at her vocation is humbling, she said. “It’s not just my work—so many people make it happen.” The love, coaching, encouragement, fundraising, and care that occur at St. Anthony’s have written

a happy ending for countless students. Their story, *The Miracle of St. Anthony’s*, has been successful as a book and will soon be developed into a movie. Sr. Alan’s wish is that this recognition gets the message out to “keep the mission going.”

“I’d like people to realize we’re like a lot of other struggling Catholic schools,” she said. “We’d like to make the world a better place and help kids become better people.”

WHY I GIVE BACK: THOMAS, '54, AND JANET KEAN

ALTHOUGH THEY HAVE NOT LIVED IN THE PHILADELPHIA area for more than 40 years, Tom and Janet Kean have stayed connected with La Salle through their generous support of the University.

Tom, who earned a bachelor's degree in accounting from La Salle in 1954, and Janet Kean have been faithful donors to the Annual Fund and the Explorer Club for many years, and they also have endowed a scholarship for a member of La Salle's swim team.

Recently, the Keans gave a generous donation to *Shoulder to Shoulder: Securing the Future*, a major gift initiative to fund a new science and technology center and strengthen the University's endowment. Over the seven-year life of *Shoulder to Shoulder*, the University broke new philanthropic ground by raising \$84 million. Part of the Keans' gift went toward the couple's second endowed scholarship for a La Salle student.

The new scholarship, awarded for the first time in the 2007-08 academic year, will benefit one student each year who has encountered an emergency financial situation and needs assistance in order to continue at La Salle. The goal is to keep a talented, motivated student from dropping out as a result of a financial hardship.

Tom Kean, who attended La Salle on a swimming scholarship, said he feels it is important to give back and give students the same opportunity he had to get a college education.

"I probably wouldn't have had the choices I had in my life and my career if it hadn't been for La Salle," he said.

After graduating from La Salle and spending five years in the Army, Kean and his family relocated to Albemarle, N.C. In 1960, he took a job with Jefferies Southern Processors, a commercial textile dyeing and finishing plant. He retired as the company's President and CEO in 1991.

The Keans have two daughters, Teresa Anne and Ann Marie, and one granddaughter, Ashley.

The Keans' dedication to providing educational opportunities has not been limited to La Salle. Avid Tar Heels athletics fans, they have established five swimming scholarships

at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Tom Kean also serves on the Executive Board of the Educational Foundation, a nonprofit that raises funds for scholarships for University of North Carolina student-athletes.

Tom Kean has served on the organization's Board of Directors for more than two decades, overseeing a large-scale renovation of the facility and the building of a new aquatic center. The Keans have received numerous accolades for their dedication to the institutions and causes they have supported over the years. However, they get the most satisfaction out of the relationships they have forged with various scholarship recipients and the tokens of appreciation they have received—including Christmas cards, letters, and family photos—from former students who have benefited from the couple's generosity.

Athletes Team Up for Neighboring Community

FOUNDED IN 1863 BY THE CHRISTIAN BROTHERS, LA SALLE University values service to others as an important characteristic of a well-rounded individual. Of the several goals listed in the University's mission statement, one specifically states "to continue to provide to the residents of the immediate La Salle neighborhood the educational resources and expertise to improve the quality of their lives."

This Catholic tradition set forth by St. John Baptist de La Salle could be plainly seen at the Explorers' men's basketball game against Richmond on Jan. 9.

That afternoon, a large percentage of those in attendance were students from local elementary schools, who received free Explorer rally towels and a luncheon before the game. This treat is just one example of a program implemented through an Athletic Department initiative called Project Teamwork.

Project Teamwork is a community service initiative sponsored by the La Salle Athletic Department. It was developed as a way to get Explorer student-athletes involved in the community surrounding the University. One of the strongest relationships stemming from the program is the Adopt-a-School initiative, in which La Salle Athletics has partnered with Logan Elementary School. At Logan, Explorer student-athletes have the opportunity to participate in an after-school mentoring program as a partnership with Big Brothers Big Sisters.

"The Logan-La Salle partnership has opened an entirely new world for students at Logan Elementary School," said Principal Mark Wilicki. "It has given them new experiences that they would otherwise not encounter."

La Salle student-athletes also have felt a sense of accomplishment. "My little sister is always so excited

to see me," said La Salle field hockey player and program participant Kara Harpel. "That lets me know I'm making a difference."

Other Project Teamwork events that have taken place over the years include the Fairmount Park cleanup, tree-planting projects, Christmas toy drive and gift wrapping, food bank, book drive, and sports clinics. Philadelphia native Mike Ellerson, '07, Director of Project Teamwork, is happy to be a part of a group that serves the community. "I'm very fortunate

to be in the position to give back to the neighborhood that I grew up in," he said.

The Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) has taken a leadership role in helping get students actively involved with Project Teamwork. These members are viewed as the voice of the student-athletes and are represented by student-athletes from each of La Salle's sports.

La Salle also is actively involved in the National Consortium for Academics and Sports (NCAS). The NCAS is based on the idea of using the positive impact of sports as a catalyst for change in our society. Athletic Director Tom Brennan, Ed.D., is a member of the NCAS Executive

Committee. Ellerson recently was on hand to accept the NCAS Outstanding Outreach and Community Service award at the organization's annual conference in Orlando, Fla. This marks the sixth consecutive year that La Salle Athletics has been recognized by the NCAS for its commitment to community service and outreach.

"It is a testament to La Salle University and its student-athletes to consistently receive such high praise for work done in the community," Brennan said. "The special emphasis that we place upon work in the immediate neighborhood mirrors the efforts of the University to reinvest in the community."

“Good Kids Who Make Bad Decisions”

AT TIMES, SOMEONE ASKS ME in reference to my past work as Dean of Students and my current work as Director of Saint Gabriel's Hall, a residential program for juvenile delinquent boys, “How are you doing with those bad children?” I always respond, “They are not bad, they are good kids who make bad decisions.”

As a Christian Brother of 28 years, I have primarily served inner-city teenagers, working frequently with the wayward, lost, and ultimately marginalized youngsters of schools and our society. Throughout, I have found these youngsters to be down to earth—what you see is what you get—finding underneath their demeanor a good soul of God and heir to heaven.

The experience of St. John Baptist de La Salle heartens me. He discovered within himself, and thus inspired our Institute of Brothers along with a wide network of colleagues, an appreciation for the goodness within the children characterized as “poor” in his time. De La Salle wrote in his meditations, “Recognize Jesus beneath the poor rags of the children whom you have to instruct. Adore him in them.” St. La Salle did not see these children as poor so much as they were of poor circumstances.

The teenage boys at Saint Gabriel's Hall are good kids afflicted significantly by what St. La Salle observed as emotional trauma that leads to their moral deterioration, which directly contributes to their emotional and behavioral impairment. St. La Salle further linked trauma, deterioration, and impairment with the struggles of families to free themselves from poverty, sacrificing attention to a more adequate family life, which further afflicts youngsters.

These realities described by John Baptist de La Salle are realities today.

However, St. La Salle also pointed out the importance of what I continue to discover and reaffirm during my ministerial work everyday, “The first and basic transformation that occurs in the lives of youngsters—especially those who are in need—is that adults are interested in them, seek them out, and recognize them as persons.”

Some accomplishments of former youngsters of poor circumstances whom I have encountered inspire me. Just recently, while preparing to attend a board meeting at St. Frances Academy, an inner-city Catholic high school in the second-poorest area of Baltimore where I served as Dean of Students 10 years ago, a former student I encoun-

tered frequently as Dean tapped me on the shoulder. He greeted me warmly and informed me that he could not talk long because he now does what I did—keep kids out of trouble and in the classrooms! Currently, St. Frances Academy employs four fine faculty members who were students during my tenure there, all of them having overcome difficulties. A particularly potential marginalized soul when he came to St. Frances, he not only graduated from high school but also from college in Pittsburgh. I once witnessed him presenting to an auditorium of high school students from low economic areas of Pittsburgh, where he said, “You must work to become

a product of yourself, not of your circumstances." I was astounded by the wisdom of his words, quite proud of him, and glad to have worked with him during his time of struggle.

St. La Salle possessed a clear and great love for children of poor circumstances. His writings, even for the audience of today, are keenly insightful and accurate descriptions of what creates poor circumstances that afflict children, and they offer effective prescriptions for solid comprehensive education and transformation.

I continue to be proud of the "troubled" young people who are now "capable" young adults shepherding the next generation of "troubled" youngsters as credible witnesses of becoming a product of themselves, not of their circumstances. This, to me, is the ultimate outcome of faithfully living the mandate of St. John Baptist de La Salle, "To touch the hearts of your pupils and to inspire them with the Christian Spirit is the greatest miracle you can perform and one which God expects of you."

Burns, who sits on the University's Board of Trustees, had been a top negotiator for nuclear disarmament during the Reagan Administration. He previously instructed ROTC as a faculty member at La Salle.

Eligible students who are awarded the ROTC scholarship will receive full tuition for four years, as well as paid room and board at La Salle. Students who are currently enrolled in the University also may apply for the scholarship.

"We're pleased to offer this scholarship both as a way to honor Major General Burns and to attract some of the best and brightest students to our school," said John Dolan, Vice President for Enrollment Services. "The values and ethics they will learn at La Salle will be of great value to them when they assume military leadership roles."

During more than 50 years of committed service, Burns held a number of important positions, including commanding a field artillery brigade in Germany and serving in Vietnam. In 1981, he became the military representative on the Intermediate-Range Nuclear Forces Treaty delegation in Geneva, Switzerland,

negotiating what was to become the only U.S.-Soviet treaty that eliminated an entire class of nuclear weapons. Later, he served as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Political Military Affairs, and in 1987 President Ronald Reagan named him Director of the U.S. Arms Control and Disarmament Agency.

In 1993, Pennsylvania Gov. Robert Casey appointed him to the Commonwealth Court of Judicial Discipline of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

La Salle University is one of 25 colleges in the Philadelphia area to participate in the ROTC scholarship program.

La Salle's Neighborhood Nursing Center Receives Grant for Community-Based Abstinence Education Program

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Administration for Children and Families has awarded a one-year \$510,089 grant to La Salle University's Neighborhood Nursing Center to work with youth and parents and guardians about the benefits of postponing sexual activity until marriage.

"Telling them to 'just say no' is not enough—they need to understand themselves, their values, and the consequences of their choices. They need skills that will empower them to make good choices," said Ana Maria Catanzaro, R.N., Ph.D., Director of La Salle's Neighborhood Nursing Center. "Each piece (of the program)—self-esteem, effective communication, and having the skills that will help them develop healthy relationships—lays the foundation for helping our youth make informed decisions."

The initial grant for the 10-week Community-Based Abstinence Education (CBAE) program totals \$510,089; however,

if funding is approved for each of the program's five years, the grant will total \$2,715,806. The grant also requires the program to reserve 15 percent of its budget for evaluation.

Each year, La Salle hopes to reach out to at least 500 Philadelphia youth, ages 12 to 18, and their parents and guardians. In Philadelphia, 6.8 percent of births are to women under the age of 18, and 62.1 percent are to unmarried mothers. According to the Philadelphia Department of Public Health, the rates are much higher among the North, West, and Northwest communities.

La Salle has partnered with two local organizations, Neighborhoods United Against Drugs (NUAD) and The Women's Institute for Family Health (WIFH), to reach youth in these communities with the 10-week CBAE program. La Salle will focus on the Northwest Philadelphia community, while NUAD and WIFH will cover North and West Philadelphia communities, respectively.

Each 45-minute session will be taught by Health Ambassadors, who are trained to teach the course content. The "Sex Can Wait" curriculum includes worksheets and activities for the students to do with their parents and guardians.

"For many parents and guardians, talking about sex with their children is very difficult," Catanzaro said. "One of the objectives of the CBAE program is to involve parents and guardians to encourage family communication."

To promote family dialogue, communication workshops will be held three times a year to encourage parents and guardians of the program's participants to supplement the program's educational content. In addition, La Salle will host a daylong Youth Explosion event on its campus each summer with motivational speakers and activities for CBAE program participants and their parents and guardians.

The La Salle University Art Museum began in 1965 as a study collection for the University's art history majors. It opened in its current location, on the

lower level of Olney Hall, in 1976. The museum houses more than 4,000 objects, and La Salle is currently the only university in the Philadelphia area to own a permanent display of paintings, drawings, and sculptures from the Renaissance to the present. In 2007,

with a generous grant from the Connelly Foundation and support from the University's Brother Daniel Burke Endowment, the museum developed and implemented a K-12 Education and Community Outreach Program.

La Salle Honors Alumni for Athletic Achievements

Four alumni were recently honored as 2008 inductees into La Salle University's Hall of Athletes. Chosen for their outstanding athletic performance as students were Rasual Butler, '02, men's basketball; John E. Butler was the sixth Explorer to score more than 2,000 points while playing men's basketball at La Salle. He ranks fourth among the University's all-time scorers and was named to First Team All Atlantic 10 in both 2001 and 2002. He currently plays for the New Orleans Hornets in the NBA.

In 1986, Madden set both Explorer and Kirk Pool scoring records. He became a MAAC Champion in 1986 and 1987 and placed 16th at the NCAA Championship in 1987. Madden also was a two-time NCAA qualifier in one-meter diving in 1986 and 1987.

Myles captured the Atlantic 10 1,000-meter championship in 1997.

University Discontinues Football Program

La Salle University announced the discontinuation of its football program in November, citing the diminished pool of suitable opponents as the key factor in the decision.

"This was a very difficult decision, and I announce it with a real sense of disappointment," said Thomas Brennan, Ed.D, Director of Athletics.

"It is important to note that this decision was not the result of the performance of our team, nor is it a reflection on the team and the young men who have competed for La Salle," Brennan added. "We admire the dedication and manner with which our football players represented La Salle University. We are proud of the hard work these student

athletes have exhibited on the field, in the classroom, and in the community."

Football was brought back to La Salle in 1997 after a 56-year hiatus. Two years later, La Salle joined the MAAC Football League, which consisted of 10 schools with similar academic and athletic profiles. Over the last eight years, Georgetown decided to change conferences, while Fairfield, Canisius, Siena, St. John's, and St. Peter's dropped their football programs.

Last spring Duquesne announced plans to compete at the limited scholarship level by joining the Northeast Conference effective with the 2008 season. This would leave only three remaining teams for 2008—Iona, Marist, and La Salle, not enough for a league.

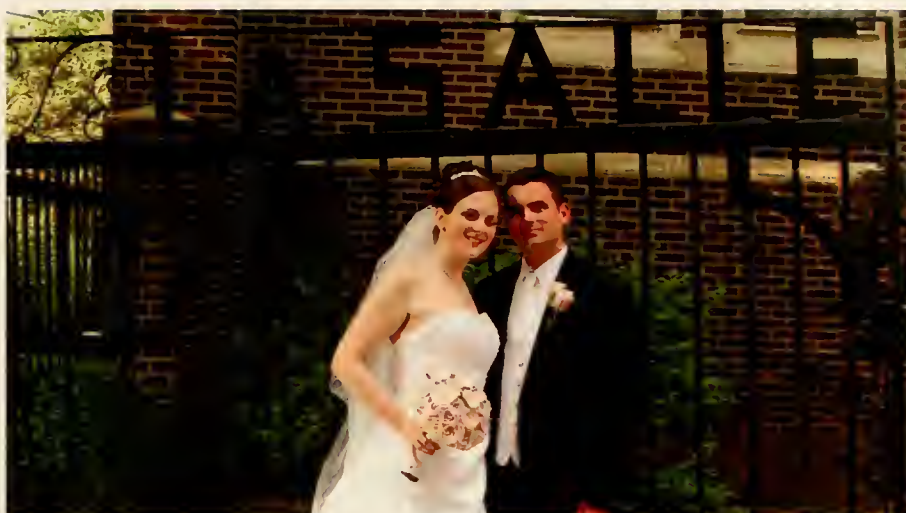

In Memoriam: Michael A. Duzy, Ph.D.

President Emeritus Michael A. Duzy, Ph.D., a former Christian Brother who oversaw major expansion at La Salle, including the construction of the Union Building, died on Nov. 19, 2007, at age 92.

Originally from Schuylkill County, Pa., Duzy took vows with the Christian Brothers as Brother E. Stanislaus. He earned his bachelor's and master's degrees and his doctorate in philosophy from Catholic University.

Duzy began teaching philosophy at La Salle in 1941 and served as moderator for the yearbook, tennis team, and athletics. He later served as Dean of Men, in charge of veterans affairs and extra-curricular activities, and Dean of the College before being named President in 1952.

During his presidency, the University increased its enrollment, facilities, and faculty. La Salle grew to more than 4,000 students, completed a new library, constructed two dorms, built a \$1 million Union Building, and laid out plans for a new science center, which was completed after Duzy's departure. He also initiated the La Salle Alumni Development Program—the precursor to University Advancement.

According to his son, Michael, one of Duzy's greatest accomplishments during his presidency was recruiting Tom Gola, '55, as an Explorer basketball player. Gola was named most outstanding player as part of the 1954 men's NCAA championship basketball team.

Duzy eventually left the Christian Brothers, married Nancy Curtis, and departed La Salle in 1957. He served as acting president of the University of Texas at Dallas and president of Harcum College in Bryn Mawr, Pa., before retiring in 1983.

Duzy is survived by his wife, two sons, three daughters, and seven grandchildren.

In Memoriam: Michael Kerlin, Ph.D., '57, MBA '88



Michael Kerlin, Ph.D., '57, MBA '88, a longtime philosophy professor who epitomized lifelong learning for his students and colleagues, died after a long battle with leukemia on Nov. 23, 2007, at the age of 71.

Kerlin, who was born in Northeast Philadelphia and lived in Lafayette Hill, Pa., attended West Catholic High School and joined the Christian Brothers at age 16. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in English from La Salle in 1957 and received a doctorate in philosophy from Gregorian University in Rome in 1967 and a doctorate in religion from Temple University in 1974. At age 52, he completed his MBA while working at La Salle.

Kerlin started his teaching career at La Salle University while serving as a Christian Brother. In 1970, he left the Christian Brothers and subsequently married.

Kerlin chaired the Philosophy Department for 28 years.

"As Chair, Mike Kerlin oversaw the department's transformation into a more diverse and more politically engaged department, one that could and did address the 'isms' of the day—including communism, feminism, and post-modernism—while tapping its roots in the Catholic intellectual tradition," said Marc Moreau, current Chair of the Philosophy Department.

La Salle President Brother Michael J. McGinniss, F.S.C., Ph.D., '70, was a student of Kerlin's and later awarded Kerlin the 2006 Distinguished Lasallian Educator Award.

"I know first-hand why he was selected for this award," Br. Michael said during the presentation. "I profited from his knowledge of subject matter, from the contagious enthusiasm he brought to his teaching, and from the friendship he naturally and unfailingly extended to his students."

In Memoriam: Joseph P. Mooney, '49

Former Professor of Economics Joseph P. Mooney, '49, who served La Salle University for more than 40 years, died of pneumonia on Feb. 3, 2008, at the age of 81.

Mooney graduated from North Catholic High School before enlisting in the U.S. Navy, where he served on the minesweeper USS Quest in the Pacific during World War II.

He received his bachelor's degree in economics from La Salle and earned his master's degree and Ph.D. in economics from the University of Pennsylvania. Mooney specialized in Latin American economics and was a consultant for the U.S. State Department on El Salvador.

Mooney joined La Salle's faculty in 1957. Mark Ratkus, Ph.D., '69, assistant professor in the Economics Department, had Mooney as a professor and said he possessed "an easygoing manner (that) made seminar sessions a treat. Similarly, as Chair, Joe led in a laidback manner that allowed economics faculty wide latitude in how to approach their courses."

After 37 years of teaching, Mooney retired in 1993, but he remained a consultant at the University until 2000.

A 1973 recipient of the Lindback Award for Distinguished Teaching, Mooney also dedicated 11 years to the Faculty Senate, including two terms as President. He was a rabid La Salle basketball fan who also chaired the University's Athletic Committee.

John Grady, Director of the University's Honors Program and a colleague in the Economics Department, said, "One of Joe's more endearing qualities was his self-deprecating sense of humor, making himself the butt of many of his jokes and anecdotes."

Mooney is survived by his wife, Maria, four sons, three daughters, seven grandchildren, and two great-grandchildren.

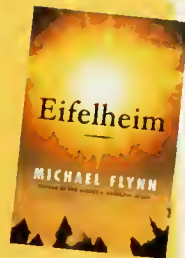

THE DEMOGRAPHIC CHANGE EXPERIENCED IN THE UNITED States during the past two decades has been monumental. In the phrase coined by Andy Grove, founder of Intel Corp., when referring to crucial technological innovations, the demographic change derived from such mass migration is clearly a sociological “inflection point.” Both legal and illegal immigration have created new parameters that affect the operations of institutions, government, social and legal services, businesses, housing, and endless other services.

Nearly 50 million Hispanics now reside in the United States, and approximately 75 percent of immigrants to the United States are of Hispanic origin. The cultural diversity among Hispanics has become increasingly complex due to accelerated immigration patterns from several Spanish-speaking countries that previously did not contribute large numbers of immigrants. In addition, the traditional immigration patterns by those of Hispanic origin to particular regions of the country have changed. Hispanics are moving from urban and rural areas into suburban neighborhoods and small towns, and many institutions, government agencies, schools, and other entities are struggling to deal with the change.

Taking the lead among many local universities, La Salle recognized the role it must play in order to effectively address these demographic changes. Our University is in the business of forming professionals. Those who graduate from La Salle and continue in the professional world will invariably find themselves in need of cultural and linguistic knowledge—an understanding that will be crucial when working with different cultures. In addition, immigrants and the generations to come will desire educational goals that will lift them to higher levels of social and economic achievement.

La Salle must remain in a position to provide this required knowledge and formation. More than 25 years ago, the University formulated a master’s degree program in bilingual and bicultural studies, which provided professionals from all fields with cultural and linguistic (Spanish) understanding. This program evolved and grew into the Hispanic Institute, which also houses master’s degree and certificate programs.



This year also marks the 15th anniversary of Bilingual Undergraduate Studies for Collegiate Advancement (BUSCA), an academic program for Spanish-speaking students who wish to further their education with an associate’s degree in liberal arts. The curriculum focuses on English language acquisition and prepares students for a seamless transition to a bachelor’s degree program.

Both of these programs address specific educational needs and are designed to evolve as other academic challenges arise.

Clearly, few other educational programs could be as beneficial to the Hispanic community. Through the Hispanic Institute and BUSCA, La Salle is able to foster education and understanding not only for Hispanics

In addition to its academic programs, the University’s on- and off-campus organizations, services, and ongoing efforts fulfill a dual objective—to be consistent with its mission and to provide professional formation of the highest order. St. John Baptist de La Salle’s early teachings provided the framework to make modern education available to everyone. La Salle University continues that tradition by delivering quality intellectual and spiritual development to all who desire it.

We are being guided by the reality of momentous social and demographic changes throughout the United States and the desire to play a positive role in the education of professionals who must deal with a changing environment. At La Salle, Hispanic student enrollment in undergraduate and graduate programs has increased by 98 percent in the past 10 years.

In keeping with the Lasallian tradition of creating a welcoming environment for students of all backgrounds, the University has implemented academic programs to meet the needs of bilingual students and to prepare Hispanic and non-Hispanic professionals alike to work in a multicultural community. Additionally, alumni initiatives, extracurricular offerings, and other campus services have evolved to reflect the diversity of La Salle's community.

"Given La Salle's long history of being responsive to societal needs in general and to our own community in particular, it's most appropriate for us to find meaningful ways to serve the Hispanic community," said Brother Michael J. McGinniss, F.S.C., Ph.D., '70, La Salle's President.

Efforts to connect to the local Hispanic community are nothing new at La Salle. In 1982, the University's master's program in Bilingual/Bicultural Studies was launched, and, a few years later, the University began offering a non-credit Spanish course to members of the Philadelphia Police Department.

From those initiatives grew the Bilingual Undergraduate Studies for Collegiate Advancement (BUSCA) program, an associate's degree program that prepares Spanish-speaking students for college-level study in English, and the Hispanic Institute, which encompasses master's degree and certificate programs that prepare professionals to serve the Hispanic community.

"Graduates of BUSCA and programs sponsored by the Hispanic Institute will make a positive impact on the quality of services that will be available to members of the Hispanic community," said Tom Keagy, Ph.D., Dean of the School of Arts and Sciences, to which BUSCA and the Hispanic Institute belong. "When members of the community are better able to take advantage of health and legal services, they become more productive contributors to the overall wellbeing of the region. As their technical and communication skills improve, they can begin to fill positions that will return benefits to all citizens of the region."

BUSCA graduates have shown strong motivation to continue their college education, said BUSCA Director Sister Suzanne Neisser, R.S.M.

"We are proud of and encouraged by the rising numbers of BUSCA grads each year, the majority of whom are choosing to continue their studies at La Salle toward the bachelor's degree," Sr. Suzanne said.

In addition, graduates of La Salle's Hispanic Institute meet a demand for professionals who possess the linguistic skills and

multicultural savvy necessary to interact with the Hispanic community.

Catalina Natalini, a full-time court interpreter who is also an adjunct faculty member for the Hispanic Institute, can attest to the need for well-trained professionals.

"(La Salle's programs are) having a positive effect in the professional world because they are bringing the awareness that we are a multilingual society," Natalini said. "It is also opening opportunities to all those individuals with multilingual backgrounds to make use of their skills and to be able to share their multilingual experience and heritage."

Beyond these academic initiatives, student recruitment efforts are evolving as more Hispanic students enter the prospective college pool.

Those responsible for recruiting students to La Salle are closely watching trends. According to a report published recently in the *Chronicle of Higher Education*, the number of high school graduates is expected to decline in the coming

years, but the number of Hispanic and Asian students will continue to grow. By 2022, nearly half of all high school graduates will be minorities, and Hispanics will make up one-quarter of high school graduates.

According to La Salle’s student recruiters in the Office of Undergraduate Admission, La Salle is well-positioned to attract an expected surge of Hispanic students, who are often looking for close-knit college communities with Catholic values that mirror those of their families.

“La Salle’s message is a universal message that reaches all prospective students regardless of their cultural

background,” said Jim Plunkett, ’95, M.A. ’06, Executive Director of Admission.

As a result, the University’s Admission staff is engaging in increased outreach to Hispanic students. The Admission staff is considering offering certain parts of the Admission Web site, recruitment publications, and applications in Spanish. The office also has partnered with Philadelphia-based Hispanic community organizations, to host campus tours, offer advice on financial aid, and participate in college fairs targeted to Hispanic high school students.

La Salle’s interest in the success of Hispanic students does not end

when they enroll. According to Lane Neubauer, Ph.D., Associate Dean of Students, available bilingual staff or doctoral students in Counseling and Health Services offer guidance to full-time bicultural students. Counseling and Health Services also identifies community translators and services outside of the University to help students.

In addition, the University has made strides in offering extracurricular activities geared toward Latino students. OLAS, the Organization of Latino American Students, sponsors cultural events and presentations by guest speakers, and gets involved in outreach efforts throughout Philadelphia.

Erimar Hernandez, ’10, president of OLAS, said she is exploring ways to get La Salle students more involved in Latino community organizations.

“We strive to make the La Salle community aware of the Latino heritage,” Hernandez said.

Hispanic Institute Unites Programs, Students

FOR YEARS BEFORE EARNING a certificate in translation from La Salle in 2007, Cecilia Spearing had been an informal interpreter, bridging the language gap between her non-Spanish-speaking husband and her Puerto Rican family. Now, she provides interpreting services in courtrooms, school classrooms, and doctor’s offices.

“I always enjoyed interpreting because I could help people to understand each other more fully,” said Spearing, who also earned a master’s degree in bilingual/bicultural studies from La Salle in 1985. “It is a reality that we have people from many different cultures who live here. The more prepared people are to work with them, the better, so we can avoid confusion and misunderstanding.”



HISPANIC INSTITUTE AT LA SALLE UNIVERSITY

Promoting understanding and dialogue between cultures is one of the hallmarks of La Salle’s Hispanic Institute, which houses master’s degree programs in Bilingual/Bicultural Studies and Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) as well

as certificate programs in translation and English as a Second Language (ESL).

The seed was planted for the Hispanic Institute in 1982, when the master’s program in Bilingual/Bicultural Studies began. At first, the program attracted primarily social workers and teachers, but since then, a variety of professionals have enrolled to enhance their linguistic and cultural skills.

“From my perspective, the program prepares both Hispanic and non-Hispanic students for the professional world by preparing them to gain the necessary skills to become more culturally sensitive instructors, case-workers, medical professionals, or entrepreneurs,” said Steve Kopec, ’89, M.A. ’92, an adjunct instructor in the

a master's program in translating and interpreting are in the planning stages.

"I can see firsthand the need for competent bilingual personnel, especially in the languages of Spanish and English, because of the growth of the Spanish-speaking community in recent years and their need to have access to services in the legal, business, and medical areas," said Catalina Natalini, a court interpreter and adjunct instructor in the Hispanic Institute.

"When I was working in the school as a teacher's aide, the principal noticed the effort that I had and the way the children connected with me and engaged with me in the classes. She told me, 'You need to go back to school. You need to pursue your dreams.'"

Bilingual/Bicultural Studies program, from which he is also a graduate. Additionally, Kopec directs La Salle's Adult Learning Program, which offers several ESL classes, and teaches in the master's program in TESOL.

Elise Favilla, who earned her master's from the Bilingual/Bicultural Studies program in 2005, credits the program with helping her get a full-time teaching job at Camden County College. Growing up in Spain, Spanish was her first language, but she said she can now offer students a well-rounded education in language and culture.

"When you teach them that Hispanic people come from many countries and have unique traditions, backgrounds, and ways of life, it becomes more than just a language," Favilla said.

When the state began to require ESL instructors to be certified in the subject, La Salle responded by developing a program leading to ESL certification. A grant from the Philadelphia School District helped many city teachers meet the new requirements.

As these programs developed, according to Hispanic Institute Director Luis Gomez, Ph.D., the need emerged to organize existing programs dealing with Spanish language and culture under a unifying umbrella.

"The Hispanic Institute was created as an organizational entity to manage, control, and develop La Salle University's response to the educational issues associated with demographic changes," Gomez said. "In particular, the University is responding to changes related to the Hispanic population in need of services, and the non-Hispanic populations that are and will be crucial in assuring the successful integration of Hispanic immigrants into American society."

The Institute also watches workplace trends to develop new programs for professionals who are working in the Hispanic community.

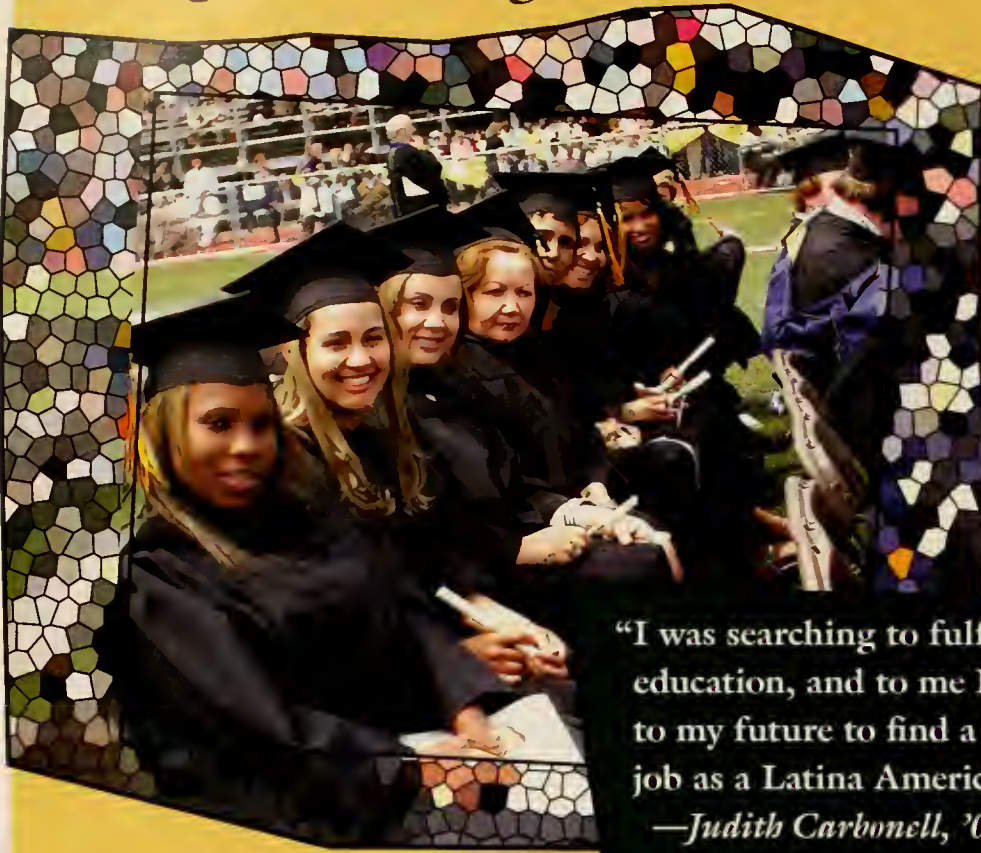
The certificate in translation began a few years ago to address the growing need for professionals who can translate documents in legal, medical, and business settings. The program, which focuses on the skills required to translate Spanish documents into English and vice versa, also provides some instruction in simultaneous interpreting for oral communication. A new certificate program specifically for interpreting and

The newest addition to the Hispanic Institute, the master's in TESOL program, launched in fall 2007 as an extension of the certificate in ESL. The program offers advanced instruction in methodologies, techniques, and strategies related to teaching English to non-native speakers.

Moving forward, Gomez envisions the Hispanic Institute becoming even more multidisciplinary by partnering with other La Salle departments to prepare students to work in bilingual environments. Gomez also is working to forge stronger relationships with groups that work with the Hispanic community.

"I envision the integration of the degrees and certificates we offer with those communities by means of providing direct services, delivered by our students, in the fields of expertise we teach," Gomez said. "Our students will greatly benefit from the real-life experiences and La Salle would again be providing a service that is supportive of its mission."

A 'Quest' for Higher Education BY LIZ VARGO

FIFTEEN YEARS AGO, FEWER THAN 10 people gathered at a round table in an administrative office for the first meeting of BUSCA—the Bilingual Undergraduate Studies for Collegiate Advancement. Today, more than 120 students are enrolled in the program.

"Little by little, we're growing," said Sr. Suzanne Neisser, R.S.M., Director of BUSCA.

BUSCA, which translates to "quest" in Spanish, has been just that for La Salle University and those students enrolled in the program.

Since its debut at La Salle under the direction of Leonard Brownstein, Ph.D., in 1993, more than 500 people have joined BUSCA to earn an Associate of Arts degree. Brownstein, former Director of the Bilingual/Bicultural Studies program, developed BUSCA at La Salle to help Philadelphia's growing Hispanic population further their

education. La Salle was one of the first universities in Philadelphia to serve the Hispanic community in this way.

Karen Morante, Ph.D., who has been an adjunct professor with the program since day one, said BUSCA "started with basically a skeleton and over the years, it expanded." In its infancy, she recalled holding her breath to see if it would survive. "It was so well-received and you could see the educational hunger," she said. "It held on, simply because of the need and the dedication of its faculty."

"BUSCA is a direct response to the Lasallian mandate to teach the minds and touch the hearts of (students in need)," said Brother Patrick Duffy, F.S.C. "BUSCA provides the groundwork for future academic success."

Br. Patrick, who served as Director of BUSCA from 2001 to 2006, revised

the curriculum and helped to integrate BUSCA under the School of Arts and Sciences. Originally, the Associate of Arts degree included 20 courses, which were mostly taught in Spanish. As adviser of the program, Br. Patrick became aware of the students' desire to become more proficient in English.

Now, half of the 60-course degree focuses on English for academic purposes, and the remaining courses, which are taught in English, fulfill the core curriculum of the School of Arts and Sciences. Since then, Sr. Suzanne said, more BUSCA students have pursued a bachelor's degree, and most

have done so at La Salle. Twenty-five of the 28 students who graduated in January enrolled in a bachelor's degree program at La Salle. In the past 15 years, 19 percent of BUSCA graduates have continued their studies at La Salle and 10 percent of those students have graduated with their bachelor's degree.

BUSCA students range from ages 17 to 58, are mostly female, and come from a variety of family situations. "More than half the students work full time and raise a family," Sr. Suzanne said. Others still offer support to family members who still live in their native countries.

Despite these obstacles, BUSCA students display amazing resilience and dedication. Over the past 15 years, Morante's most emotional moments have been watching students overcome difficulties to graduate from the program. "This was an avenue for them to succeed," she said.

Students study in BUSCA full time for five semesters. Most attend evening classes from Monday through Thursday so that they can continue to work during the day.

The program provides tutors, full-time bilingual financial counselors, and part-time motivational and academic counselors.

“BUSCA students love the program and are grateful for the opportunity,” Sr. Suzanne said. “They love the personal attention and support from faculty.”

Although other colleges and universities have instituted similar programs, Morante said BUSCA stands apart.

“The mission of this University makes this unique and makes the program work. This is what St. John Baptist de La Salle has been doing since the beginning,” she said. “He would be smiling.”

WHILE HE WAS GROWING UP, LUIS Gonzalez frequently traveled between his native Puerto Rico and the United States, his new home. He attended Edison High School, a 75 percent Hispanic public school in Philadelphia, and admitted that his English was "very limited" upon graduation. Gonzalez had considered returning to Puerto Rico to continue his education, but said the country's economy was unstable.

It was through his introduction to La Salle and the University's Bilingual Undergraduate Studies for Collegiate Advancement (BUSCA) program that Gonzales found comfort and guidance in higher education.

"That was the beginning of my life," Gonzalez said.

Choosing to attend a university outside of Puerto Rico was daunting, but Gonzalez said BUSCA helped him attain his goals.

"My primary goal was to improve my English skills and use that as a way to continue my education," he said. "I always wanted to continue my bachelor's degree at La Salle."

As a BUSCA student and now as an accounting major, Gonzalez works during the day and attends evening classes. In BUSCA, he was one of the youngest of about 25 students learning to balance family, work, and education.

Although Gonzalez said time management during BUSCA could be difficult, his teachers, fellow students, and family remained supportive.

"We helped each other like brothers and sisters," he said.

Entering BUSCA after high school created a seamless transition to college, Gonzalez said. The program helped him not to feel intimidated upon starting his undergraduate degree. As Gonzalez prepares for his final year at La Salle and anticipates his May 2009 graduation, he encourages others to enroll.

"I believe that BUSCA is right for every person who wants to improve their English," he said. "The worst-case scenario is that you need more practice. It's better to try than not try at all."



WHY I GIVE BACK: ROSALIND WILSON SUTCH, CPA, '02

WHEN ROSALIND WILSON SUTCH, CPA, '02, BEGAN HER college search nearly a decade ago, she had a few criteria in mind.

The school had to be close to her family's East Falls home so she could commute. It also needed a well-regarded business program. Most importantly, as the youngest of 11 children and the first to attend college, it had to offer quality financial assistance.

"I was accepted at La Salle with a pretty sturdy financial package," Sutch said. "My family would not have been able to pay tuition. My whole college career was made possible through scholarships and being a (resident assistant)."

That is why Sutch, now a managing associate with Drucker & Scaccetti, P.C., wasted no time returning the favor. Upon graduation, she made a commitment to give back to La Salle University as previous alumni had done for her.

"One of the main reasons I give back to the University is because I want to give other people the same chance I had," Sutch said. "It made a big difference in my life, obviously. Who knows what I'd be doing otherwise?"

Sutch entered La Salle as an accounting and management information systems major in 1998. As a new student, she made the 15-minute commute daily from East Falls to attend classes at La Salle. Sutch said it didn't seem worth the added expense to live on campus, until she realized she was missing a vital part of the college experience.

"I commuted until I learned of on-campus life, then I decided to move here," she said.

At La Salle, Sutch said she never felt like an outcast. She met one of her best friends during orientation day and said simply maintaining that friendship made it worth going to La Salle.

"La Salle is a quality school," Sutch said. "I feel blessed that I got the chance to go to school here."

Sutch excelled at her major and joined several business honor societies, including Beta Gamma Sigma and Beta Alpha. As a junior, she became a resident assistant and got involved in community development.

During her senior year, Sutch attended a Network Night at La Salle, where she met with representatives of Drucker & Scaccetti, P.C., one of whom was a La Salle alum. The introduction landed Sutch her first job with the firm in January 2002, prior to her graduation.

"Education is the key to success," she said. "This was a huge achievement in my family. I'm trying to set an example for my son and my nieces and nephews, not to be the only one (to graduate from college), but to start a trend."

"There isn't a course that I took at La Salle that I haven't drawn from both in my professional life, and as a leader in Fralinger."

In February 2007, the band performed in Hong Kong. "We were fortunate enough to march in the largest Chinese New Year parade in the world," Coper recalled. Also in 2007, Fralinger marched in Disney's SpectroMagic, down Main Street in the Magic Kingdom. In addition, the band typically plays 50 engagements each year.

Coper's membership in the Mummers tradition did not begin with Fralinger, however. His became interested as a child while tagging along with his uncle, John Fritz, to Polish American String Band practices. In 1970, he joined this string band and, 17 years later, he left to become a member of Fralinger.

For this father of three, the family tradition continues. Coper's son, Jamie, 17, has been a member since he was 12 and plays the saxophone like his father. Brett, 12, is a marshal, which is a non-playing, non-costumed assistant.

For the Fralinger performance to go as planned, the 67 performers require more than 100 marshals to support the movement of the props. "They make it all look easy," said Coper, referencing how props, such as the multi-level saloon, traveled seamlessly throughout the performance.

As a management consultant for The W Group, an IT service provider in New York City, Coper remembers how he valued his professors at La Salle, who were also his peers. "They brought us real-world experience, since they were beside us working in the industry. They weren't just in it for the academia. There isn't a course that I took at La Salle that I haven't drawn from both in my professional life, and as a leader in Fralinger," Coper said.

Drawing upon his La Salle experience, Coper recounts Jan. 1 as "more than just a parade." He explains the New Year's Day spectacle, when he joins his sons and fellow Fralinger members in an ensemble of sequins and feathers, as "an opportunity to bring about a sense of community through this time-tested tradition to my fellow Philadelphians."





From Law

OVER THE YEARS, SEAMUS MCCAFFERY, '76, HAS BEEN accustomed to holding multiple titles. His multitasking may have reached its peak in the 1970s, when, in a single day, he could be called husband, father, police officer, Marine reservist, student, and security guard. Later, he would add law student, then lawyer, then judge to that list.

These days, the list has been whittled down to four crucial roles: husband, father, grandfather—and Pennsylvania Supreme Court justice.

But don't dare think he's slowing down. Since being elected to the Supreme Court in November 2007, he works all day on cases in his 17th-floor Old City Philadelphia chambers, then takes paperwork home to work from his easy chair until after midnight some nights. He takes his laptop and portable printer on vacations to Florida to visit his parents.

And don't dare think he's complaining. In so many ways, more than 50 years after stepping off a boat from Ireland with his family, he feels he has finally arrived.

"I've done things most people have never been able to achieve, and I'm satisfied with my accomplishments," McCaffery said. "I'm one of the top jurists in the state, and the first to go from beat cop to Supreme Court justice. What's not to like?"

McCaffery's eventful life began in Belfast, Northern Ireland. When McCaffery was 2 years old, his father left Ireland, his wife, and his children, and with \$21 and the phone number of a distant relative, he moved to Montreal to start a better life for his family. Two years later, McCaffery's father was able to bring his wife and children to Montreal, where they spent two years before immigrating to the United States. The family, ultimately growing to include six children, settled in the Germantown section of Philadelphia, close to La Salle's campus. McCaffery's connection to La Salle began early, when he came to the Explorer's Den for cheesesteaks as a teenager.

"If you were going to go to college, there was no other college—it was always La Salle," McCaffery said.

McCaffery put his college education on hold after graduating from Cardinal Dougherty High School. He enlisted in the Marines and then, after leaving active duty, joined the Philadelphia Police Department. While raising three sons and working full time as a patrolman and part time as a security guard at La Salle's Hayman Hall, he started taking night classes at La Salle, often coming to class still in uniform after a shift. Five and a half years later, he had earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice.

"La Salle was my springboard into formal education," McCaffery said. "It provided me with an affordable education and the discipline and flexibility I needed. With the support I received at La Salle, I managed not to be overwhelmed by the magnitude of my dreams."

Along the way, as McCaffery rose through the police department ranks to become a vice/narcotics investigator and then a homicide and major crimes detective and sergeant, his career goal came into sharp focus. After witnessing so much crime and injustice, he realized that the place he needed to be to effect change was on the judge's bench.

"Courts were where everything ended up if you were seeking justice," he said. "So, I identified my goal, and then backtracked: to become a judge, I knew I needed to become a lawyer; to become a lawyer, I had to go to law school; to go to law school, I had to go to college."

McCaffery put his plan into action. Less than 10 years after graduating from Temple Law School, and less than five years after retiring from the police department, McCaffery was elected to serve on the Philadelphia Municipal Court.

McCaffery certainly left his mark on the Philadelphia judicial system. In addition to handling a heavy daily trial load, he implemented the nation's first neighborhood night court in 1996, hearing cases of petty and nuisance crimes on weekends until 3 a.m. From that brainstorm emerged another—Eagles Court. In 1998, the NFL's first court opened in Veterans Stadium to rein in rowdy fan behavior. After several years, Eagles Court has virtually put itself out of business, as incidents of bad behavior at football games have decreased enough to nearly eliminate the need.

Once he was elected to the Pennsylvania Superior Court in 2003, McCaffery set his sights on the next rung of the judicial ladder: the Pennsylvania Supreme Court. Last year, he embarked on his third state-wide race, one that took him to every county in Pennsylvania. In November 2007, he won a seat on the Supreme Court and was the top vote-getter in Pennsylvania.

Which brings us back to the notion of Seamus McCaffery slowing down. He retired from the Air Force Reserve as a colonel in January, allowing him to grow the goatee he was never allowed as a military man. And he's relishing his rides to work on his motorcycle on sunny days and his role as Grandpop to his four grandchildren.

Still, the drive to continue into his fifth decade of public service is strong as he juggles family, charity work, and the Supreme Court's enormous caseload. But his wife, Lise Rapaport, Esq., has drawn the line at any higher ambitions.

"She thanks God I was born in Ireland so I can't run for president," he said.

Finding Inspiration in St. La Salle's Teaching

AS A PROFESSOR, TEACHER-EDUCATOR, researcher, and parent, I think deeply and often about the status of education today, sometimes with despair. However, my work with teacher candidates, as well as my recent exposure to the writings of St. John Baptist de La Salle through the Lasallian Leadership Institute, has reinvigorated my resolve that the educational system holds promise for the future. Nearly 300 years ago, St. La Salle's pioneering work with teachers benefitted children whom society deemed uneducable. His vision has empowered me to strive for similar dispositions among my teacher candidates.

A major aspect of St. La Salle's innovative ideas is that disenfranchised children have the potential to learn and be saved. At that time in 17th-century France, society viewed poor children, delinquents, and orphans as unworthy of educational consideration. More recently, humanistic and cognitive theories recognize that all students have the potential to achieve. Contemporary views on diversity also encompass a broader range of groups, such as students with disabilities, students from different racial and ethnic backgrounds, and students for whom English is a second language.

St. La Salle's writings emphasize that education is about relationships and touching hearts, which is an idea that has reemerged in education today. St. La Salle believed that students who are disenfranchised are less open and therefore more resistant to learning. This is true of many students today who are challenged by disability, poverty, language, and cultural differences. My students and I have personally witnessed many issues facing these students every day. The 12 virtues

developed by St. La Salle for his teachers (gravity, silence, humility, prudence, wisdom, patience, reserve, gentleness, zeal, vigilance, piety, and generosity) help to create positive and caring learning communities.

The challenge is to instill in our teacher candidates a positive disposition toward diverse students, much like St. La Salle did for his community.

In a junior-level course that I teach, for example, students learn to develop and teach a unit of instruction to their urban field placement students. Teacher candidates are taught about culturally proficient instruction and classroom management while engaging in the teaching/learning process. These experiences have sharply heightened my students' awareness of the inequities that exist between and within schools. As a result, many have been instilled with a strong desire to work with students who are less fortunate or less able.

Lasallian Brothers viewed their work as a vocation and thus dedicated their lives to reaching children on both spiritual and academic levels.

In the Words of the Founder

"One of the main concerns of those who instruct others is to be able to understand their students and to discern the right way to guide them. There are those who call for much patience, those who need to be stimulated and spurred on. ... This guidance requires understanding and discernment of spirits, qualities you should frequently and earnestly ask of God, for they are most necessary for you in the guidance of those placed in your care."



Further Reflections

"It is said that to teach is to touch one's life forever, but you cannot have a true impact in the life of children if you know nothing about them. St. La Salle: Educational Pioneer

French not Latin

Although it was customary to teach spelling and reading in Latin, St. La Salle saw that the charity school students needed facility in reading and writing the everyday language of business, commerce, and catechesis. He wrote *Teaching French Syllables* to teach reading in the native tongue. The syllabary is credited by French historians as one reason for the eventual standardization of French pronunciation throughout the country.

Simultaneous method of instruction

It had been customary for teachers to engage one student at a time in a classroom of dozens of students. St. La Salle began a new method by dividing large classes into small groups according to their skill level and to involve whole groups in the lesson. The goal was to engage every student every day in as many ways as possible.

Psychological observation

St. La Salle wrote, "All minds are not attracted in the same way and it is necessary to know how to deal with each in order to lead it to give itself over to the task." The Brothers' practice of studying each child's capability, character, and needs and then passing their notes to the student's next teacher became widespread in the 18th and 19th centuries and is now habitual.

What distinguished early Lasallian schools from traditional schools was the idea that schools should meet the needs of students, instead of students conforming to the rigid structure of schools. For example, students were taught first in the vernacular, French, instead of traditional Latin. Moreover, the curriculum was adapted to meet the vocational needs of the community. Thus, in addition to learning how to read, write, and do arithmetic, students in seafaring towns were exposed to navigation.

We are experiencing a similar paradigm shift in education that builds the skills, dispositions, and attitudes of teachers to meet the needs of all students in the classroom. Schools have had to adjust to higher demands for achievement and, simultaneously, embrace the needs of an increasingly diverse school population.

As I reflect upon St. La Salle's life work, I realize how much of an influence St. John Baptist de La Salle's writings and life work have had on me personally and, more broadly, on the field of education. His then-novel approach to education of the poor and disenfranchised has established a strong foundation for the emergence of a new educational standard.

A Home for 'Rent'

THE FIRST FEW NOTES OF THE FAMILIAR SONG STRIKE chords with audiences. The lyrics captivate: "525,600 minutes, 525,000 moments so dear." These sounds from the Broadway production *Rent* resonate from its home stage in New York and travel to stages across the country. Thanks to Louis Volpe, '69, this tale of love, friendship, and AIDS also has been performed at Harry S. Truman High School in Levittown, Pa., and will debut at high schools across the country.

Volpe, who obtained his bachelor's degree in English from La Salle, spent much of his summer of 2007 editing the mature production for its first high school translation. Having received an offer from licensing company Music Theater International to have a hand in the editing for the school edition, Volpe "jumped at the chance." With the full support of Truman's principal and school board, Volpe brought the warm songs of *Rent* to the high school, known nationally for its musical theater program.

Students gave up their last month of summer vacation in August to start rehearsals, and three short months later, *Rent—School Edition* premiered in front of a sold-out theater. "I was scared to death. I was so nervous," Volpe said. Volpe's nerves were justified, since in the audience on opening night sat the family of playwright Jonathan Larson, who died shortly before his show premiered on Broadway in 1996.

Following the final curtain, Jonathan Larson's father, who traveled by bus for the show with the New York producers, spoke of how he believed his son was in the room that night. "The emotion in the room was palpable," Volpe said.

This was not Volpe's first experience translating a production for a high school assembly. Music Theater International approached Volpe in 2001 for the school debut of *Les Misérables*.

Volpe has taught at Truman for 39 years. As Chair of the Fine and Performing Arts Department, Volpe directs

Truman's fall and spring shows each year, in addition to teaching four theater classes a day.

"Over the years, I've always told my students that my objective is never to train actors. I am not a professional acting coach. I am a teacher," Volpe said. "I've always looked at high school theater as educational theater. It's about the learning experience and how the students grow."

During his first year walking the halls of Truman as an English teacher, Volpe's interests were aroused as he passed the auditorium during rehearsals, and he began to take time out to watch them. "I used to sit in and think, 'I wouldn't do it that way' as I watched the drama teacher," Volpe said.

Less than a year later, Volpe would get his chance to do things his way. The drama coach had resigned, and instead of taking over the assistant's position, Volpe found himself taking the Head Director's chair.

For Volpe's first show, he chose the Greek play *Antigone*. "I staged this bizarre interpretation with costumes made out of trash bags and aluminum foil," he said. Volpe recalled the memory of the sound of four people in the audience clapping after his first show.

He has come a long way since then. Shortly after taking over as Director, he began writing theater courses that the school board approved, and, soon thereafter, theater was offered as an elective.

Evidence of Volpe's accomplishments can be seen covering the walls of the Truman auditorium. Banners dating back to 1975 hold testament to the journey Volpe and Truman High School have taken, noting most recent awards for Best Play, Best Director, Best Actor, and Best Supporting Actress. "It's all very mini-Tony Awards," Volpe said.

Look for the next Broadway smash to hit Truman High School, as Volpe plans to continue to astound audiences by challenging student thespians with both personal and theatrical growth.

A Salute to Student-Athletes

IT WAS A BANNER YEAR FOR A CROP OF STANDOUT Explorers in their final season of competition

Sean Quigley—Arguably the greatest runner in Atlantic 10 history, Quigley continued his remarkable run by earning a seventh career All-American honor with a sixth-place finish in the 10,000 meters at the NCAA Outdoor Track Championships in June. In another All-American performance, he finished third at the NCAA Indoor Track Championships and as the top American in the indoor 5,000 meters. He ran the fastest time in the country in the 10,000 meters and qualified for the U.S. Olympic Trials in the 10,000-meter and 5,000-meter events after his races at the Stanford Invitational and the Mt. SAC Relays.

Rachel Papin—Papin qualified for the NCAA Championships in cross country after an 11th-place finish at regionals and was named to the NCAA All-Region team. She led the Explorers cross country team to its fourth overall team title and was named Atlantic 10 Cross Country All-Conference. She was named A-10 Indoor Track Championship's "Most Outstanding Performer of the Meet" after taking the 5K title and anchoring the distance medley relay team, setting a new school record and Mackal Field House records in both events, as well as provisionally qualifying her for the NCAA Championships in the 5K. In outdoor track, Papin was the first-ever three-time 5K winner at the A-10 Championships. Papin was a member of the A-10 Championships' winning 4x800-meter relay team, and she was an NCAA Regional qualifier in the 5K and 4x800-meter relay.

Darnell Harris—Harris systematically rewrote the La Salle, Atlantic 10, and Big 5 record books for career three-pointers, then proved he was the best shooter in the country by winning the NCAA Three-Point

Contest at the Final Four in San Antonio, Texas. He finished second-team All-Atlantic 10 and first-team All-Big 5.

Carlene Hightower—Hightower was named a finalist for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award for exemplifying the values of a student-athlete. She is the third woman from La Salle named Philadelphia Big 5 Player of the Year and the first two-time All-Conference

first-team member. She also earned a Second-Team Lowe's Senior CLASS selection. She finished her career among the top 10 all-time in 10 career and seven single-season categories.

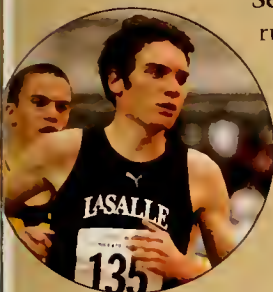
Jeremy Ortiz—Ortiz, the senior co-captain, was the first-round draft pick of the New Jersey Ironmen of the Major Indoor Soccer League. He finished his career a two-time Atlantic 10

All-Conference selection with 17 goals and 45 points.

Kristin Hextall—Hextall led the Atlantic 10 Conference in goals (15) and points (36) while finishing 14th nationally in both categories. She had the second-best output ever at La Salle. She became the fifth Explorer to make

First Team All-Conference and is the fourth to be named All-Region by the National Soccer Coaches Association of America and *Soccer Buzz* magazine. She finished her career second all-time in goals (33) and points (83).

Emily Bonczek—Bonczek finished her career second on La Salle's all-time lacrosse scoring list with 199 points, led the NCAA with 61 goals scored and was second in the country with an average of 3.81 goals per game.

Brother Michael McGinniss Elected to Third Term as La Salle President

Brother Michael J. McGinniss, F.S.C., Ph.D., '70, La Salle's President since 1999, has been elected unanimously by the Board of Trustees to a third five-year term as President.

The announcement was made by Board Chair William R. Sautter, who said, "Under Br. Michael's leadership, La Salle University has flourished, and the Board of Trustees has confidence that the positive momentum will continue."

Br. Michael is beginning the final year of his second term. The third term will commence July 1, 2009, and continue until June 30, 2013.

"I am delighted with the prospect of further advancing this wonderful University," said Br. Michael. "It has been a privilege

to be in a position to guide my *alma mater*, and I look forward to working with the Board of Trustees, alumni leadership, and the rest of the La Salle family to build on what we have accomplished together in recent years."

Recent accomplishments include the building and opening of St. Basil Court, a residence hall for 428 students, and adjoining dining facility, Treetops Café, in 2005, and expanding the Bucks County Center in Newtown, Pa., in 2006.

In cooperation with the Board of Trustees, Br. Michael launched *Shoulder to Shoulder: Securing the Future*, a fundraising initiative with a \$25 million goal for the construction of a new science and technology center and the strengthening of the endowment for student scholarships. Completed in 2007, this major gift initiative raised more than \$28 million.

At the same time, the University expanded its campus by approximately 30 acres with the purchase of the Germantown Hospital property and two adjoining lots. Over the past year, the University has renovated enough of the facilities to relocate the School of Nursing and Health Sciences and some administrative offices to what is called the West Campus.

In January 2008, the University opened its own Montgomery County Campus in Plymouth Meeting, Pa., and in March a groundbreaking ceremony took place on campus for the renovated and expanded Holroyd Hall, featuring the Hugh and Nancy Devlin Center for Science and Technology. In the meantime, construction is continuing on the Shoppes at La Salle, the shopping center being developed on La Salle's Good Shepherd property.

As for the future, Br. Michael created a Planning Advisory Board (PAB) a year ago to work on La Salle's next Strategic Plan. The PAB, a broad-based, representative University group, is charged with bringing all the resources of the University to bear in meeting the challenges of 21st-century higher education.

La Salle Honors Markmann at Holroyd Lecture

La Salle University recently welcomed James F. Markmann, M.D., Ph.D., '83, as speaker and honoree for the 28th annual Holroyd Award and Lecture.

A Philadelphia native with deep roots at La Salle, Markmann delivered his lecture on "Problems in Transplantation: Foreshadowing Medicine of the Future?"

Markmann received the Holroyd Award, named in honor of Professor Roland Holroyd, Ph.D., for his significant contributions to the medical field. He was a multi-organ transplant surgeon and Director of the Pancreas Transplant Program at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania for many years. He is now Clinical Director of the Division of Transplantation in the Department of Surgery at Massachusetts General Hospital and is a professor of surgery at Harvard Medical School.

"Dr. Markmann is a person who combines the technical expertise of a surgeon with a deep understanding of the ethical issues that surround the field of organ transplantation," said Tom Keagy, Ph.D., Dean of the School of Arts and Sciences. "His work epitomizes the benefits of a values-based liberal arts education that connects theory to practice and serves the greater good."

LA SALLE'S MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPY PROGRAM EARNS CANDIDACY STATUS

Culp was recently awarded La Salle University's Brother Scubillion Rousseau Justice Award for dedicating nearly 40 years as a civil rights lawyer to representing those who have been discriminated against and underserved.

"Dave is known to students and faculty alike as a person who habitually speaks out for the disenfranchised and the disempowered. Anyone who has taken his classes will readily



tell you that he has infused his classes with a respect for the dignity for all people, and he has sensitized our students with a sense of social responsibility for those less

fortunate than themselves," said Majid Tavana, Ph.D., professor of management information systems.

Culp earned his Master of Law degree, with a concentration in constitutional law, from the Columbia University School of Law. In 1975, he began working for

the United States Department of Health Education and Welfare, where he helped desegregate school districts in the Midwest.

Curley Lauded for Defense of First Amendment

As summer kicks into high gear, Americans prepare for the ultimate hot-weather holiday—July 4. It's a chance for many to enjoy the day off, fire up the grill, and perhaps take in a fireworks display. But more importantly, it's an opportunity to relish the freedoms that have endured in this nation for more than two centuries.

Long after the barbecues are quenched, Tom Curley, '70, continues to appreciate the importance of these rights and to fight to ensure their protection. This year, the Radio and Television News Directors Association and Foundation recognized his efforts by presenting him with the First Amendment Leadership Award. As President and Chief Executive Officer of the Associated Press (AP), Curley was recognized for pushing for more openness in the government and emphasizing First Amendment issues in reporting. Other recipients of the 2008 First Amendment Awards were Paula Madison of NBC Universal, Bob Schieffer of CBS News, and Richard Wiley of Wiley Rein, LLP.

Curley nurtured his interest in government issues during his years at La Salle as a political science major. "La Salle creates a very special environment that accelerates educational experiences in a challenging but encouraging setting," he said. "You are exposed to people who provide you the opportunity to grow." And he certainly took that opportunity. After Curley was assigned to study the feasibility of a national newspaper in 1979, he went on to serve as the original news staffer on the project that led to the creation of *USA Today*.

He worked in every department of the newspaper before eventually becoming *USA Today's* President and Publisher. In 2003, he took the position to lead the AP and helped to establish the Sunshine in Government Initiative just one year later. The coalition of news organizations and journalism-related groups promotes accessible, accountable, and open government. "What became clear by 2004 was that media were remaining too passive about being watchdogs on press and other freedoms," Curley said. "The Sunshine coalition effectively has spotlighted how freedom of information benefits the public directly."

Journalism has provided Curley not only with a creative outlet, but also with the opportunity to keep the American public informed and vigilant. "As the late David Halberstam has pointed out, journalists are bit players when times are good," he said. "But when those who seek to pander or even abuse power get carried away, journalists are put to the ultimate test. Fortunately for us, facts and justice eventually prevail."

In Memoriam: Peter Paranzino

Peter Paranzino, affectionately known as "Pete the Barber" at La Salle, died March 7, 2008, at the age of 94.

Born in South Philadelphia as the son of a well-educated banker, Paranzino's family had always hoped he would seek higher education. As the oldest of five, Paranzino had to drop out of school at age 12 to support the family when his father died, but he still found his way to college.

For nearly 70 years, Paranzino cut the hair of Christian Brothers, faculty, staff, and students at La Salle. Upon his father's death, Paranzino learned the trade from his uncle at Tony's Barber Shop in North Philadelphia, near a former location of La Salle College. The Christian Brothers became regular customers of Paranzino, who, at the time, charged 25 cents a clip.

When the college relocated to 20th Street and Olney Avenue in 1929, Paranzino made house calls for the Christian Brothers. Eleven years later, he was granted permission to open a barbershop in McShain Hall.

Having grown up during the Depression, Paranzino valued affordability and charged only 50 cents for students and 20 cents for Brothers. His price never exceeded \$7. He started La Salle's first "bookstore" and eventually relocated his services to the Union Building.

Paranzino cut hair for so many ROTC students during his career that he received an award from the military. When the Beatles inspired longer hairstyles in the 1960s, Paranzino displayed a campus sign saying, "Keep La Salle beautiful, keep your hair trimmed." Over the years, alumni often returned to Paranzino's barber chair for a cut and a good chat.

When asked about retiring, Paranzino replied, "I try to keep busy. It's the best thing for you." He worked at La Salle until the spring of 2007.

Paranzino was preceded in death by his wife, Lillian Saleba, in 1991. He is survived by his son, Dominic, '83, and two grandchildren, one of whom is enrolled as a nursing student at La Salle.

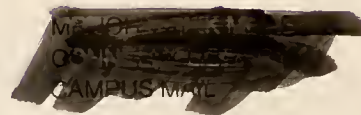

Saturday kicked off with the annual reunion golf outing at Limekiln Golf Club in Ambler, Pa. In honor of the

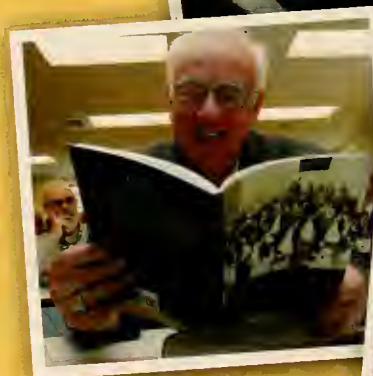
REUNION '08 ... *reunite, revisit, rediscover*

The Report that follows will bring you up to date on the University's progress over the past year, as well as provide a preview of the new Strategic Plan.

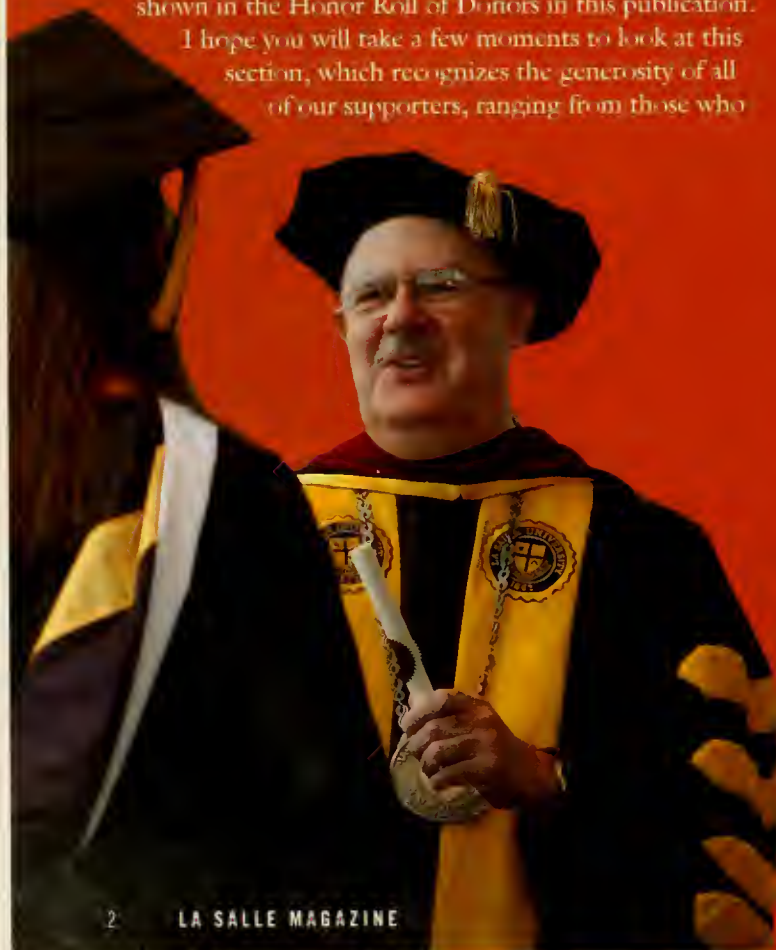

2007–2008 Highlights

Campus Expansion and Development

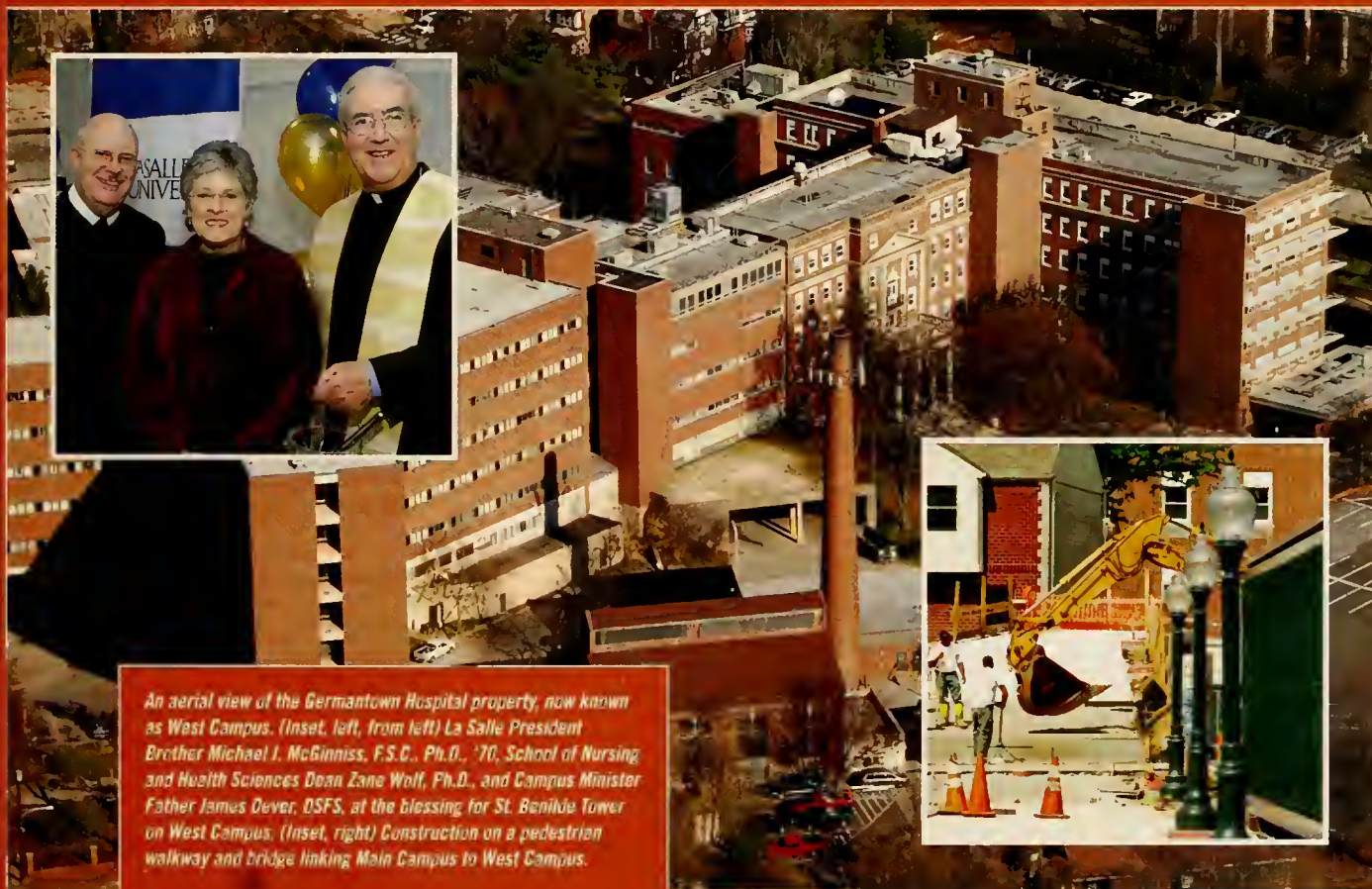
Following our May purchase of the Germantown Hospital property, now known as West Campus, a whirlwind of activity ensued at the University in the summer of 2007. One of the buildings that we acquired was renamed St. Benilde Tower, and before the summer was over, one floor of the building was renovated to accommodate our University Advancement offices.

Work continued throughout the fall on an ambitious schedule to prepare four floors for the relocation of our School of Nursing and Health Sciences from Wister Hall in time for the start of the spring semester in January. The new facilities feature state-of-the-art classrooms and laboratories for our students in nursing, nutrition, and speech-language-hearing science.

The whirlwind continued as we renovated additional space in adjoining West Campus buildings for the temporary (one-year) relocation of most of our science programs while the expansion of Holroyd Hall is under way.

The Holroyd Hall construction project is in full swing. Made possible by the success of our *Shoulder to Shoulder: Securing the Future* fundraising initiative, which raised \$28 million, the new building is on target to open in August 2009. Featuring the Hugh and Nancy Devlin Center for Science and Technology, the expanded facility will have a “make science visible” theme—with windows into the labs and high-definition LCD displays showcasing students’ work and experiments. The building will feature a “green” roof and other environmentally friendly features.

Also under construction—and soon to be completed—is a bridge over Wister Street that will connect the well-lighted and beautifully landscaped pedestrian walkway on Main

Campus to an attractive glass atrium entrance at St. Benilde Tower on West Campus, creating a safe and convenient passageway for students, faculty, and staff.

In addition to this year's on-campus development, we celebrated the opening of our new Montgomery County Center in January. Located in Plymouth Meeting, Pa., at the Metroplex Corporate Center, our well-established MBA and graduate Clinical-Counseling Psychology programs have been supplemented by new course offerings in the College of Professional and Continuing Studies.

Another area of academic growth last year was the implementation of La Salle's new master's degree program in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL).

Under the auspices of our Hispanic Institute, the M.A. in TESOL expands our offerings in support of the Hispanic community, and the Institute also includes Bilingual/Bicultural Studies master's program and certificates in Translation—English/Spanish and ESL Specialist. In addition to the programs of the Hispanic Institute, La Salle meets the needs of undergraduate Hispanic students through our Bilingual Undergraduate Studies for Collegiate Advancement (BUSCA) program. Last year marked the 15th anniversary of BUSCA.

Academics and Student Life

The College of Professional and Continuing Studies, now in its third year, continues to develop new programs for part-time adult students not only at our Main Campus but also at La Salle's Bucks County Center and Montgomery County Center. New Graduate Accounting CPA and Post-Baccalaureate Premedical certificate programs have been added to those in Fraud and Forensic Accounting and Negotiation and Conflict Resolution. The College has introduced accelerated programs in Business Administration, Corporate Communication, and Organizational Leadership and has taken a leadership role in online programming at the University. Further, the College developed and received state approval for a master's degree program in Instructional Technology Management, which will be launched in January.

In an initiative led by the Provost's Office this past year, a concerted effort has been started to enhance academic support for our freshman students. The goal is to improve the University's already strong reputation for student retention. Our focus on first-year students has involved more research to identify high-risk students, advances in advising, and a renewed emphasis on tutoring and study skills, as well as an assessment of the First Year Odyssey program.

Student organizations and individual students were recognized for their achievements this past year—too many to enumerate. One that is particularly noteworthy because of its centrality to our mission: the wide variety of service initiatives led by University Ministry and Service earned La Salle a spot on the President of the United States' Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll.

Alumni Engagement

Once again, our alumni have stepped up to increase their engagement with, and support of, their *alma mater*. This past year, alumni not only participated actively in Alumni Relations events, but they also significantly increased their partnership with the Office of Undergraduate Admission in support of student recruitment and with the University's Career Services Center for career networking.

The La Salle Alumni Admission Network (LAAN) added new volunteers in the Lehigh Valley, Pittsburgh, and the southern Connecticut/Westchester County, N.Y., region. The total number of LAAN volunteers grew from 110 to 154, a 40 percent increase, and alumni participated in 64 college fairs in nine states, a more than 83 percent increase from the previous year. In the career-networking program, alumni volunteers in the directory jumped to nearly 400, a 10 percent increase from the year before.

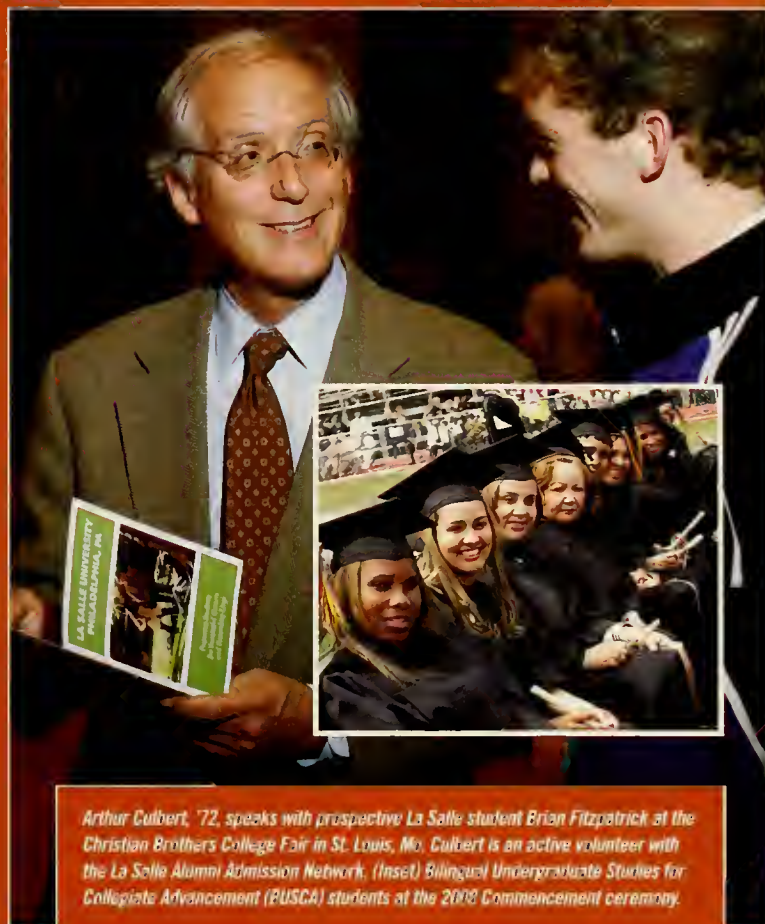
In addition, the Alumni Association Board of Directors took a leadership role in support of the Annual Fund, which raised \$2.26 million, exceeding its goal.

Community Involvement and Economic Impact

La Salle's involvement with its neighborhood and wider community took a major leap forward this past year with the groundbreaking ceremony last fall for the Shoppes at La Salle, the shopping center being developed on the University's Good Shepherd property.

In partnership with Moreland Development, the Shoppes at La Salle are now under construction. The opening of the Shoppes is projected to take place in stages—from November for Rite Aid to January for most others and April for the Fresh Grocer. The new shopping center will be a benefit not only for the students, faculty, and staff of La Salle, but also for our neighbors, fostering a shared community spirit and contributing to the quality of life in our community.

The University's commitment to improving the quality of life in the community, supported by a grant from the William Penn Foundation, has made tangible progress this year. La Salle added a Community Liaison position to the Government and Community Relations staff, thereby increasing direct contact, and promoting better understanding, between the University and community members. Working in partnership with the Greater Philadelphia Urban Affairs Coalition, La Salle is designing a long-term plan that will

facilitate dialogue and greater cooperation with our neighbors and lead to community and economic developments that will be mutually beneficial.

Further, the University's offices of Economic and Community Development and Government and Community Relations met regularly with local officials and community leaders to plan for the future. Our positive economic impact is important to our neighborhood, our city, our region, and our state, and it is important to La Salle that we use it wisely and collaboratively. A report that we issued during the past year, based on a study that we commissioned, determined that our economic impact on Pennsylvania last year was \$255 million. La Salle employs approximately 1,300 people, more than half of whom live in Philadelphia County and 20 percent of whom live in neighborhoods adjacent to the University.

While these newer initiatives are being developed, last year La Salle continued to do what it has done for decades to contribute to our community. Because we believe that education should be applied to service to others, our academic programs supported our Neighborhood Nursing Center, a Speech-Language-Hearing Community Clinic, and Community Psychological Services. Students in nutrition and education contributed their service in community and school settings. Our Nonprofit Center, Adult Literacy Program, and students in more than 30 service-learning courses continued to contribute to the greater good in their own special ways.

Last year, under the guidance of University Ministry and Service, more than 400 La Salle students donated almost 32,000 hours to community service activities, including neighborhood cleanups, home-rebuilding projects, and tutoring. In addition, 80 percent of La Salle's 350 student-athletes, through Project Teamwork, volunteered 3,600 hours to such worthy projects as Adopt-a-School, Big Brothers and Big Sisters, tutoring, and food drives. The Alumni Association joined with Project Teamwork in adopting nearby Logan Elementary School and conducting a successful book drive, among other activities.

New Strategic Plan

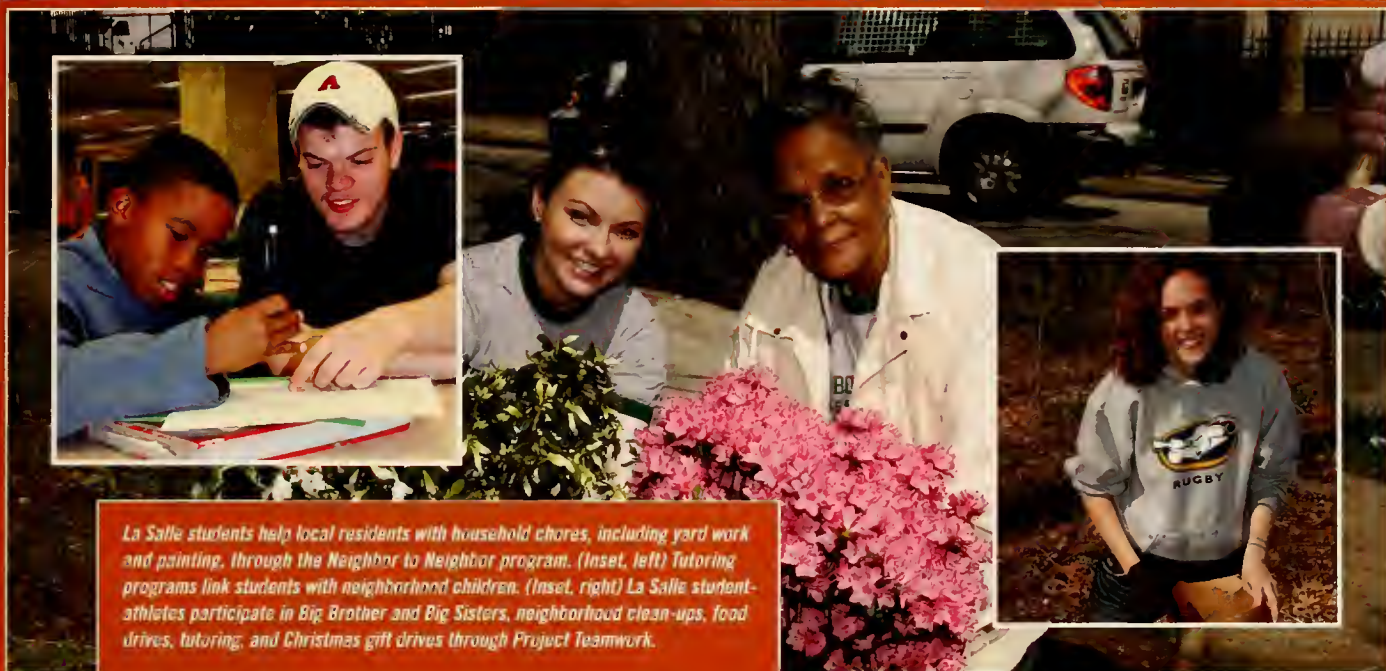
In addition to all of the "doing" this past year, 2007–2008 could be called a year of planning. The Planning Advisory Board, the committee created to facilitate development of the new Strategic Plan, formed six University-wide teams and added an outside planning consultant to the group. After nine months of review and development—a process that included focus groups, a Web portal for inviting La Salle community feedback, and a review by our Board of Trustees Planning Committee, the plan will be submitted to the full Board of Trustees in October.

Our new strategic plan, titled *The Will to Excel*, will focus on a Lasallian education rooted in three key dimensions of the Christian Brothers' heritage: context—our urban location; practicality—linking theory and practice; and the social ends of learning—commitment to others.

Guided by *The Will to Excel*, the La Salle University of the future will be characterized by tangible and vibrant signs of the Lasallian mission in action. La Salle will be a place where students and faculty share in a process of exploration in the context of a real community, one that links theory and practice and focuses on a commitment to others. It will be

fiscally responsible and optimize all of its resources, including its dedicated faculty and staff. It will be international in perspective, yet remain a truly Philadelphia institution and a good neighbor.

**Here are the six broad priorities of the new plan:
Integrating Mission**

The University will expand the ways that its faculty, staff, and students understand and can be inspired by, the life and legacy of St. John Baptist de La Salle and its relationship to Lasalian and Catholic heritage—enabling students to explore the connections between faith and life and demonstrate their commitment to service of others.

**Creating Academic Distinctiveness
and Promoting Student Success**

The University will ensure that students have the opportunity to achieve academic success by providing them with professors committed to excellence in teaching, an engaging learning environment, a focus on community as the central means by which learning occurs, and a curriculum that is not only creative, innovative, and practical, but is one that also integrates the Lasalian tradition and Catholic social teaching where possible.

Managing Enrollment

The University will manage its enrollment by employing the concept of optimum enrollment, which takes into account desired student demographics, academic program demand and capacity, mission-based target groups, and expansion of the University's physical plant. It will achieve optimum enrollment through effective marketing, solid retention initiatives, and academic program development.

Impacting Our Neighborhood

The University will enhance its visibility and presence among all sectors of its local community, creating and promoting its competitive advantages, and will be recognized among regional constituencies as a readily accessible, high-quality, and responsive resource that is vital to the economic, social, and cultural growth and development of Philadelphia.

Optimizing Our Human Resources

The University—recognizing that dedicated and highly skilled faculty and staff are essential to achieving its vision—will use proactive, creative approaches to hiring, developing, rewarding, and utilizing its employees. Also appreciating the value of alumni as a resource, it will increase the number

of alumni connected to and involved in advancing the educational heritage of La Salle.

Maximizing Resources and Enhancing Institutional Capacity for Success

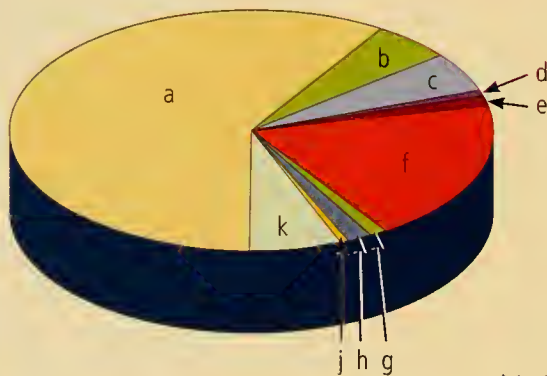

The steadfast implementation of *The Will to Excel* will mean that the La Salle of the future will take the best of its past and present and make it even better.

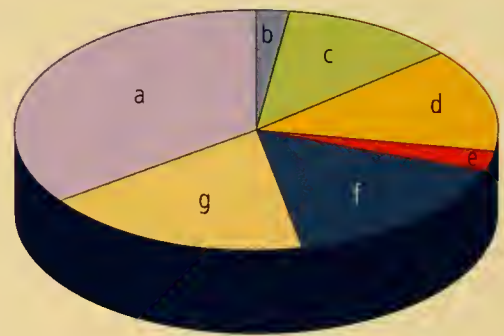
Operating Revenue*

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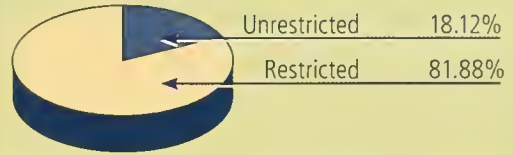
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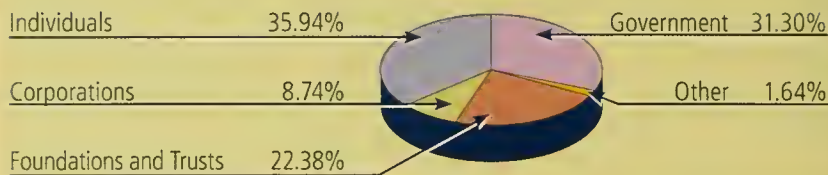

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Alumni Association to Bestow Awards on University, Community Leaders

This November, La Salle's Alumni Association will bestow awards upon individuals who have dedicated their service to La Salle and to the community. Al Cantello, '55, will receive the John J. Finley, '24, Award and Jane Golden will receive the Signum Fidei Medal.

The John J. Finley, '24, Award honors a La Salle graduate who has exhibited outstanding leadership and service to the University. The award is named after Finley, a former Alumni Association president who was known to many as "Mr. La Salle."

Cantello, Head Coach of the cross country team at the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Md., has been a catalyst for countless La Salle projects, including the construction of the Verdeur Memorial in Hayman Hall, the "Arboretum Project," the Butcher Memorial, the construction of Wetzler Track, and the organizing of the only NCAA Cross Country meet ever held at La Salle.

A charter member of the La Salle University Hall of Athletes, Cantello has been named NCAA Mid-Atlantic Regional Coach of the Year three times. In 1997, he received both the Distinguished Athletic Leadership Award from the Naval Academy Alumni Association and the Tom Hamilton Teaching/Coaching Award. Cantello competed for the U.S. Olympic Team in 1960 and once held every national and international record in the javelin. He was voted world's greatest competitor in the javelin by *Sport* magazine in 1964.



Since 1942, the Signum Fidei Medal has honored individuals or groups for their contributions to humanitarian principles and for upholding the mission and goals of La Salle University and the Christian Brothers. Signum Fidei, which means "sign of faith," is the motto of the Christian Brothers.

Golden's commitment to service as Director of Philadelphia's Mural Arts Program highlights two important vocations of La Salle and the Christian Brothers. Through the Mural Arts Program, Golden helps make education accessible and simultaneously beautifies many of Philadelphia's forgotten neighborhoods.

The Mural Arts Program has become world-renowned under Golden's leadership, and she received an honorary doctorate from La Salle in 2005.

Before coming to Philadelphia, Golden was Director and co-Founder of the Los Angeles Public Arts Foundation. She worked with Philadelphia's Anti-Graffiti network for 11 years, where she introduced graffiti artists to painting and helped them complete court-appointed workshops in Philadelphia churches and schools.

In 1984, Golden began an effort to revitalize city neighborhoods by working diligently to make the Anti-Graffiti Network a comprehensive and collaborative program. She has helped the Mural Arts Program become the most successful of its kind in the nation and has helped hundreds of artists and volunteers dedicate their talents to creating more than 2,400 murals citywide.

Prominent Philadelphians Receive Honorary Degrees at La Salle

During spring Commencement, La Salle University awarded honorary degrees to two Philadelphia natives who have made significant contributions in their fields.

Jeremy Nowak, President of The Reinvestment Fund (TRF), and Pat Ciarrocchi, anchor for CBS 3 Eyewitness News at noon, received the honor for dedication to their profession and commitment to their community.

As founder of TRF in 1985, Nowak has been committed to rebuilding cities while creating opportunities for low-income families. Nowak, who grew up in Philadelphia's West Oak Lane section near La Salle, said his focus on revitalizing urban communities came from his interest in social sciences.

Through TRF's Fresh Food Financing Initiative, 35 fresh food markets have been developed in underserved Pennsylvania communities. Last summer, this initiative helped to secure a Fresh Grocer supermarket as part of the future Shoppes at La Salle on Chew Avenue, marking the neighborhood's first grocery store in more than 40 years.

TRF's financing has resulted in the creation of 17,000 housing units, 30,000 charter school and child-care placements, and 6 million square feet of commercial real estate. The organization has more than \$450 million in assets and has

invested in cities from Washington, D.C., to Newark, N.J.

Ciarrocchi, a graduate of Rosemont College, began her career in radio in Wilmington, Del. She soon moved into television as an anchor, reporter, and producer for WHAG-TV in Hagerstown, Md. Ciarrocchi joined CBS 3 in 1982 to anchor the early morning news. From 1991 to 1992, she co-hosted *Evening Magazine*, traveling to places such as Great Britain and Israel for special reports. She also served as the station's medical reporter for five years.

"From covering the news of the day to developing the health beat in this region, Pat has kept her responsibility to viewers front and center throughout her career," said Michael Smith, Ph.D., associate professor of communication and Director

of the Graduate Program in Professional Communication at La Salle.

Ciarrocchi said some of her most memorable career moments were reporting live from the Vatican. Most recently, she reported live from Washington, D.C. during Pope Benedict XVI's first papal visit to the United States.

Through her work at CBS 3, Ciarrocchi earned a Philadelphia Emmy Award. In addition, she won the Gabriel Award from the National Catholic Association of Broadcasters and the Sarah Award from the local Women in Communications. In 2000, she was inducted into the Philadelphia Broadcast Pioneers Hall of Fame for her accomplishments in the television industry.

GRADUATE MARK COSTELLO DELIVERS LA SALLE'S COMMENCEMENT ADDRESS

This year's Commencement speaker, Mark Costello, '08, recognized that La Salle's 1,758 graduates had a different history behind them and a different journey ahead of them—but they are forever members of the La Salle community.

In addressing his fellow graduates, Costello said, "La Salle, as a community, can be described aptly in one word: reaching. When my professors planned my future with me rather than for me, they were reaching out to me. When the University reviewed my application and made me an offer, they reached out to me."

Costello, an English major from the Roxborough section of Philadelphia, served as a student writing tutor, was named a University Writing Fellow, and was selected as a member of the Honors Program Board. He was also a writer and editor for the *Collegian*, the student-run newspaper, and was involved in The Masque theater group. Costello hopes to continue his education by pursuing a graduate degree in theater.

In Memoriam: John Grady

John "Jack" Grady, an economics professor and Director of La Salle's Honors Program for nearly 40 years, died of cancer on July 15, 2008, at age 70.

Grady, a son of Irish immigrants, grew up in Philadelphia's Olney section and graduated from North Catholic High School. He attended the University of Notre Dame on a Ford Foundation Scholarship and earned his bachelor's degree in economics. He also studied economics at the University of Pennsylvania on a Woodrow Wilson Scholarship and then completed his master's in economics at Temple University.

In 1960, Grady accepted a temporary job at La Salle teaching economics. He kept that position and took on the responsibility of Director of the Honors Program in 1969.

"I have had the privilege of knowing Jack Grady since he became Director of the Honors Program. ... For almost



four decades, he was the heart and soul of this nationally recognized program, serving as a mentor, adviser, and friend to many of the best and brightest students who ever attended La Salle," said La Salle President Brother Michael J. McGinniss, F.S.C., Ph.D., '70. "His personal commitment to, and influence on, our students and La Salle has been incredible."

Grady was well known for his work with the National Collegiate Honors Council as founding Chair of the Honors Assessment and Evaluation Committee.

For several years, he also served as moderator of the University's Debate Team, which won the state championship in 1966.

Former students and colleagues described Grady as a dedicated professor who was involved with his students. His dedication earned him the Lindback Award for Distinguished Teaching in 1972. In 2003, graduates of the Honors Program established a scholarship in his honor.

His wife, Helen, noted that he called each scholarship student individually to discuss his or her goals and still found the energy to meet with incoming freshmen this past May. She also said their family lived in Philadelphia's East Oak Lane section for many years because Grady wanted to be able to walk to work at La Salle.

In addition to his wife of 45 years, Grady is survived by two sons, three daughters, and 14 grandchildren.

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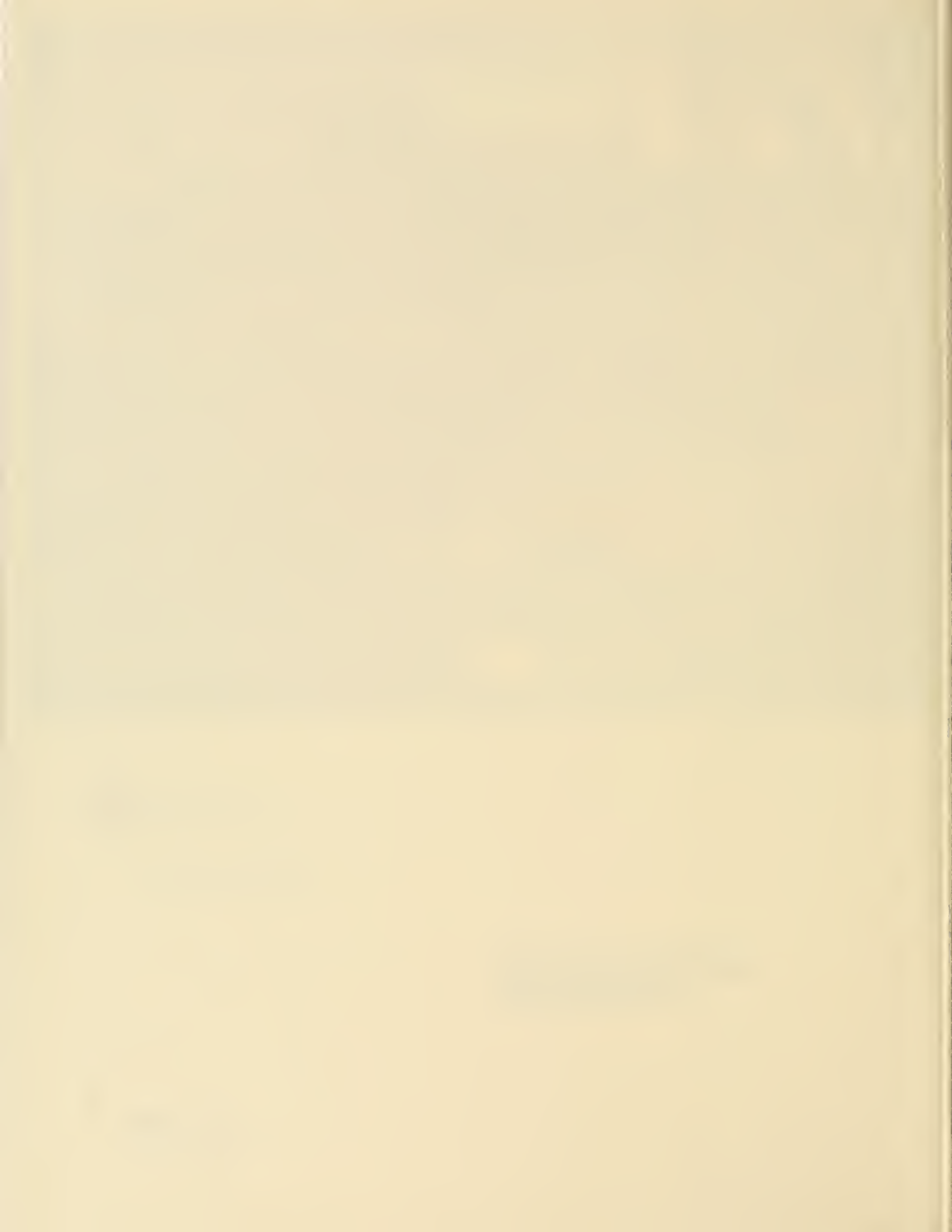
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
