together adequate markets for their fish. The Yukon River this year will have a market for up to 100,000 pounds of summer chum salmon roe from Anvik and about 200,000 summer chum salmon from the lower Yukon. Kotzebue is expected to have a market for about 1 million pounds. In 2006, the Aleutian Islands had their first significant pink salmon harvest since 1999. And the Coastal Villages Region Fund is planning a new fish processing plant at Platinum, which will allow better utilization of Kuskokwim area stocks.

* And there are some problem areas. There were no herring fisheries in the AYK Region for 2007, with the exception of 3-50 tons of herring for bait in Norton Sound. Limited markets for herring resulted in only about two thirds of the allowable harvest of herring being taken at Togiak in 2007. In the Westward Region, there's a lack of infrastructure such as dock space, public ice machines, dock cranes, etc. that would help small fishing operations develop markets for their catch. And there still is little or no market for Kuskokwim River chum salmon. Both the Yukon and Kuskokwim Rivers will likely have harvestable surpluses of millions of chum salmon for which there is no market.

ADF&G is working with local organizations on research and monitoring programs.

* Community Development Quota (CDQ) groups are funding important projects in Bristol Bay and the AYK Region to study catch size, gather escapement data and do genetic research. We're working with the Bristol Bay Economic Development Corporation, the Yukon Delta Fisheries Development Association, the Coastal Village Regional Fund, the Kuskokwim Native Association, the Norton Sound Economic Development Corporation, the Kodiak Regional Aquaculture Association and numerous others. Many of these projects are funded by the federal Office of Subsistence Management.

ADF&G is working to improve communication with rural residents regarding fishery management.

* The Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) has worked to develop numerous stakeholder groups with which to discuss fishery management and gain input from users.

* Examples of these groups and efforts include weekly Yukon River Drainage Fishery Association meetings, the Kuskokwim River salmon Management Working Group, Prince William Sound Salmon Harvest Task Force, Southeast Alaska Seine Harvest Task Force (and similar groups for the gillnet and troll fisheries), and Kodiak herring fishery preseason stakeholder meetings. Sport Fishing Issues:

* Kodiak:

* The rural town of Kodiak and six villages are concerned with the development of a limited entry program for fresh and saltwater guides. Some residents support a limited entry system, while others do not. Some community members are concerned that a limited entry system will concentrate wealth and reduce the public's ability to receive charter services, which will ultimately hurt the local economy.

* Sport anglers, commercial and subsistence fishermen are concerned about the Litnik sockeye return, which has crashed. These fisheries have been closed for the majority of the past 4 seasons.

* Developing an enhancement project for king salmon along the Kodiak road system is an issue with Kodiak anglers, as well as anglers in Port Lions and Old Harbor, who would also like to see enhancement efforts in their communities.

* Anchorage/North Gulf Coast/Prince William Sound:

§ In these areas, many people are concerned about the impact of urban users on rural natural resources. For example, in Prince William Sound, sport anglers with boats that can go farther from port to find prime halibut fishing areas are causing consternation with some rural users (especially in areas like Chenega). They see recreational anglers in greater numbers or in new areas and the impact their presence has on the rural fishing experience. Likewise, in Cordova, the new fast ferry makes it convenient for anglers to get to a once semi-inaccessible area and the growth of those fisheries is likely to increase.

§ In Prince William Sound, some residents are concerned that the federal subsistence halibut regulations will negatively impact their ability to sport fish halibut. This same issue regarding higher federal limits and means and methods for salmon is an issue on the Copper River Delta.

* Kenai Peninsula:

§ A number of rural users feel there are undue restrictions on their access to fish. In other words if they were the primary users they would be able to consumptively use the resource (for example, with fall spawning closures for Dolly Varden in Upper Kenai tributaries or tight limits on upper Kenai Rainbow Trout).

S These same users object to the level of commercial harvest of northern bound sockeye and coho salmon in the central district.

Bristol Bay:

S Resource development (mining and offshore oil and gas development) and its impacts on fish and wildlife populations and on subsistence, recreational, and commercial fisheries are seen by many in the region as a threat. This is especially true in regards to the possible development of the Pebble Mine and its potential impacts on the fish and wildlife resources of the Nushagak and Iliamna drainages.

Some rural residents have also expressed concern about the possible future implementation of limited entry on guided sport fisheries in the area and its impacts on opportunity and the local economy.

S The Kvichak drainage sockeye salmon is currently a Stock of Management Concern and recent low returns have impacted all user groups. Additionally, reductions of daily sport bag limits, based on escapements and in accordance with the Kvichak In-river Sockeye Salmon Management Plan have raised issues as to whether or not it will be necessary to reduce sport bag limits for conservation.

* Interior:

S There is a perception among some rural residents that sport fisheries (or personal use and urban subsistence users) compete with rural subsistence users (and rural sport anglers) for fishing and harvest opportunities. This is usually the result of increasing use of an area by non-local (whether urban residents, non-residents or guided anglers) and/or a decrease in subsistence fishing opportunity due to declining abundance of target species.

S

Another area of concern is maintaining access to sport fisheries in rural areas

and addressing some confusion by non-rural anglers as to which lands are public and which are private (Native corporation and private) when trying to participate in sport fisheries.

Predator Management:

* Due to tradition, preference, availability, as well as the high cost of store-bought foods, rural Alaskans depend heavily on harvesting wild game. As such they are pragmatic about wildlife management and generally support predator management programs to increase the size of moose and caribou herds and to decrease competition between people and predators.

* Many rural residents would like to see expanded efforts by the State to reduce predator densities in their area. However, it is less widely recognized that the high cost and time necessary for collecting scientific data needed to defend such programs affects our ability to plan and implement predator control in new areas.

* Also, since predator control is not allowed on Fish & Wildlife Service or Park Service lands, the state cannot effectively reduce predation in regions of the state with large proportions of federal conservation unit lands.

Subsistence:

* The state provides a preference for all Alaskans for subsistence. State subsistence regulations allow rural and non-rural residents to hunt and fish on all lands (private, state, and federal) unless the federal government closes its lands to uses other than subsistence harvest by federally qualified individuals.

* The state's approach protects the ability of rural residents who move to urban areas to continue subsistence activities in rural areas. It also protects the ability of rural residents not covered by a customary and traditional (C&T) use determination to continue subsistence activities on federal public lands, unless closed. Once the federal government adopts a C&T determination for a species in an area, rural residents not covered by that determination can only subsistence hunt or fish on federal public lands under state regulations.

* Having dual wildlife regulatory systems (federal subsistence management overlaid on traditional state fish and wildlife management) continues to be an important issue for rural Alaskans. In many areas rural users are moving away from involvement in the state system because the federal subsistence program seems to grant the desires of rural residents, often at the expense of other Alaskans and sometimes to the detriment of the resource.

* Paradoxically, since predator management is not allowed on federal refuges, parks, and preserves, the federal system precludes attempts to increase wildlife abundance, which in turn exacerbates the tensions between local subsistence users and non-locals.

* Federal Subsistence Board

S The Secretaries of Interior and Agriculture have proposed changes to the list of "rural" and "non-rural" determinations for communities based on the 2000 census and other factors in federal subsistence regulations. These revisions could affect Adak, Prudhoe Bay and parts of the Kenai, Wasilla/Palmer and Homer areas. Saxman has protested being listed as non-rural and part of Ketchikan; and a number of communities connected by road near Kenai might be lumped together. There has been widespread opposition to the Board's decision to authorize subsistence fisheries for residents of Ninilchik, Hope and Cooper Landing on the Kenai and Kasilof Rivers. Kodiak was proposed to change to non-rural, but under the final rule is still classified as rural. The State took no position on individual communities but protested the lack of evenhandedness in the federal process.

S The Federal Board continues to adopt regulations that duplicate State regulations and, thus, create confusion on the ground due to regulatory drift of the two sets of regulations because Federal lands are not marked on the ground. The duplicative regulations also establish a priority for rural residents that are not based on criteria to determine customary and traditional use and without determining the amount of use reasonably necessary for subsistence before restricting other uses. The State frequently protests the Board's inconsistent process and lack of factual evidence for determining customary and traditional uses (e.g., sporadic use anywhere is used instead of evidence of a community pattern of use).

Endangered Species Act

* Polar Bear. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) proposed listing the polar bear as threatened throughout its entire range, solicited public comment, and expects to make a final decision by the end of this year. If it is listed, the Service will consider designating critical habitat along the north and west coastline of Alaska which could affect ongoing and proposed activities, such as shipping, oil and gas leasing, land and offshore developments. North Slope residents are very concerned about increasing erosion, increasing late-summer ice free areas, and other effects of Arctic climate change, but the State does not believe listing the polar bear or designating critical habitat will be helpful and may actually be detrimental to conservation of polar bear.

* Cook Inlet Beluga. The National Marine Fisheries Service published a proposed rule to list Cook Inlet Beluga as Endangered with Extinction. If it is listed and critical habitat is designated in Cook Inlet, activities throughout the watershed of the entire Cook Inlet as well as in the marine areas could be subject to ESA permit stipulations or restrictions, such as recreational, personal use, and commercial fishing; waste water treatment of the Kenai Borough, City of Anchorage, Mat-Su Borough, and other communities; oil and gas leasing; proposed coal and other mining; the proposed Knik Bridge; fast ferry; small boat traffic, shipping, and other transportation activities both in the water and in the air. Communities throughout Cook Inlet could suffer economic impacts. The State is concerned that this listing is being proposed and the conservation plan has never been funded to provide population and habitat information.

* Yellow-Billed Loon. USFWS announced it intends to do a 90-day status review of the Yellow-Billed Loon population in northern and western Alaska based on possible impacts due to disturbance and loss of habitat in the coastal and low tundra areas. This could affect village activities, including fishing and hunting, development, motorized access, and other activities throughout the area if critical habitat is designated. The state recently participated in a multi-party effort to develop a conservation plan for this species, hoping that the plan would deal with loon conservation issues and obviate the need to consider a listing process.

Avian Influenza:

* In many rural areas, waterfowl and other birds taken in the spring and summer subsistence hunts form an important source of fresh meat. Although the threat to human health should wild birds arrive carrying a highly pathogenic form of avian influenza is very low, the fact that there is ANY risk of human infection has caused great concern.

* ADF&G has partnered with other state agencies through the Multi-Agency Coordination Group established by governor's proclamation to bring solid information to communities around the state. The agencies have emphasized information on how citizens can protect themselves against exposure to HPAI virus, as well as the need to prepare for community emergencies such as a flu pandemic.

* Also, ADF&G has cooperated with federal agencies in an early detection program designed to find the HPAI virus if it occurs in wild birds migrating to Alaska. State community outreach efforts and wild bird sampling are continuing this summer.

Fuel Prices:

* Rural hunters, fishers, and trappers are being affected by rising fuel prices, which affects their ability to harvest wild resources for personal consumption, sharing within the community, and (in the case of fur) income. To the extent that this reduces trapping effort and participation, wildlife management efforts to change predation levels could be affected, which could in turn result in reduced availability of wild meat.

Governor:

I want to extend an open invitation to you, Todd, and members of your staff to visit or participate in any of the activities, field camps, special use areas, or surveys conducted or managed by the Alaska Department of Fish and Game. For example, as commissioner I am allowed to issue special permits for visitors (outside of the regular public lottery) to the McNeil River State Game Sanctuary for world-class viewing of coastal brown bears. Also, we conduct a number of interesting field projects (e.g., moose and caribou aerial surveys, radio-tagging of northern pike, stream-walk spawning surveys for salmon, medicinal baiting of wolves, etc.) that you could visit and join in. Your participation would not only be a boon to ADF&G staff, but also a way for you to become more acquainted with our programs and to see some of the lesser-visited portions of Alaska.

Some particular ideas include:

In a few weeks, the department in conjunction with the Hunter Heritage Foundation is conducting a weekend workshop of training activities called "Becoming an Outdoors Woman." BOW has become a very popular program, and I will be attending a portion of this June's program (June 15-17) at Lost Lake south of Fairbanks. As Alaska's premier "outdoors woman" you would certainly be a welcome addition to this, or any future, program. Soon, we will likely be holding a BOW training session in Southeast Alaska. For information, please see: http://www.sf.adfg.state.ak.us/Region3/Programs/BOW/BOWhome.cfm

While this year's permits have already been issued, if you would like to visit the McNeil River bear-viewing program in lower Cook Inlet, I would be happy to reserve slots for you next year. For more information, see: http://www.wildlife.alaska.gov/index.cfm? adfg=mcneil_river.main

Or, perhaps we could arrange a trip for you and Todd this year or next to visit the Round Island (Walrus Islands) State Game Sanctuary, west of Togiak, in association with your fishing season in Dillingham: http://www.wildlife.alaska.gov/index.cfm?adfg=refuge.rnd_is

Or, perhaps a trip into the upper portions of the Bristol Bay drainages, to witness some of Alaska's premier trout sport fisheries: http://www.sf.adfg.state.ak.us/region2/areas/index.cfm/FA/BB.overview

Another trip idea would be to visit Kodiak, perhaps meet with fishermen, and then fly by charter to the south end of the Island to view the set gill net and purse seine sockeye salmon fishery enroute to our Frazer Lake fishpass, where there are not only brown bears but also thousands of sockeye salmon ascending a fish ladder around a natural barrier falls. While passing through Kodiak city, it might be possible to arrange a short trip on a small, local trawl or longline vessel, as well as visit some of the state and federal research and management facilities. This fall you might be interested in joining me on a potential trip to the Noatak and Kobuk Rivers, out of Kotzebue, in order to see the massive Northwest Arctic caribou herd and to see firsthand some of the contentious guide/outfitter/subsistence hunter conflicts

occurring in that part of the state. And, there are certainly opportunities for me to help arrange for you to visit any of the national parks, national wildlife refuges, etc. around the state.

Orphaned Moose Calves - May 25, 2007, Anchorage Daily News

Dear Commissioner Lloyd:

In a recent Anchorage Daily News front page article (May 26, 2007)(see attached), Tyonek Native Corporation learned that two moose calves were orphaned after an unfortunate incident involving a cow moose and an 8 year old child in Anchorage.

Under the Freedom of Information Act, we request a copy of the official report from the Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) on the disposal of those calves after the incident.

According to the ADN story, the incident happened on Friday, May 25, 2007 in South Anchorage near Kendall Loop and 84th Avenue. The Fish and Game representative was Rick Sinnott.

In prior years it has been reported to us that the majority of the calves orphaned on the road system were considered "nuisance" moose and there were no facilities to care for them. As a result the majority of those calves were euthanized by ADF&G or by Alaska Department of Public Safety (ADPS) at the direction of ADF&G.

Over the last 15 years Alaska has lost more than 50% of its moose population, or more than any other place on the planet. As a result of this population loss, Alaska has lost its status as a premier wildlife resource state. In fact, as of 2001, 48 other States now harvest 100% to 1,000% more hoofed wildlife per acre than does Alaska, as noted in research completed by Alaska Village Initiatives in 2005.

As such Alaska can no longer afford to euthanize orphaned calves and, thanks to the Alaska Moose Federation and its network of participating groups, we can provide alternatives to euthanasia. The Alaska Moose Federation and its partners, including the Anchorage Zoo, can offer professionally managed facilities and resources including care

by licensed veterinarians. Those calves will be cared for in secure sites until the calves can be released safely into prepared habitats in the wild each fall.

TNC requests your support in this effort in two ways.

- 1. By publicly disclosing information on all orphaned moose calves (including the two involved in the May 25, 2007 incident in Anchorage, and
- 2. By fully complying with the proposed moose calf rescue program recently approved by Governor Palin.

TNC stands ready to support this program to achieve the restoration of Alaska's moose population for the benefit of all Alaskans.

Cow moose shot after kicking 8-year-old to protect calves Trying to protect calves, moose targets 8-year-old, then gets shot

An Anchorage police officer shot and killed a cow moose that was trying to trample an 8-year-old boy in South Anchorage Friday morning. The shooting orphaned the moose's newly born twins.

Police and wildlife officials say the moose likely was protecting its calves when it kicked the boy, causing minor injuries, before police put it down.

The child, the moose and the moose's two newborns were cornered between homes with no easy way out, said Anchorage area Fish and Game biologist Rick Sinnott. "It was a like a closet back there," Sinnott said. "There was no way the police officer could do anything but shoot the moose."

The boy, his playmates and other children in the neighborhood of dense single-family homes, it seems, did nothing to provoke the moose other than being in the wrong place at the wrong time, police said.

The moose likely gave birth to the twins within the past week and probably at or near where the incident occurred on Kendall Loop near 84th Avenue and Spruce Street, Sinnott said.

The boy was outside playing between houses in the mid-morning when the moose appeared and charged, police spokesman Lt. Paul Honeman said. The boy's friends were able to get away, but the boy stumbled and fell. He rolled on the ground, ending up against a fence, and protected his head with his arms, while the moose began kicking with her front legs.

Anthony Oder, 15, was playing basketball nearby with friends on his first day of summer vacation when he heard a faint cry from somewhere behind the houses. "I thought it was a dog whining," he said.

The Service High teenager followed the sound and found the moose on the other side of a backyard fence threatening the 8-year-old. He called 911.

The moose was trapped because she had to pass the boy to leave the yard, but she would not do that with her calves, Sinnott said.

Oder and his friends shook the fence and threw rocks at the moose to distract her. She backed off briefly and made a move toward them, then went back to the boy, Oder said.

The police officer was on the scene within minutes. He shot the mother moose with a long gun,

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likely a shotgun, Honeman said.

Oder said two shots put her down.

The male and female calves were put into large dog kennels and taken away by Fish and Game. Sinnott said they will likely be going to conservation or research facilities. The cow will be donated to a charity for its meat.

Sinnott said the end of May and beginning of June are the most dangerous time of year in Anchorage for moose encounters. Mother moose protecting their new young and children just out of school and playing outside can be a hazardous mix, he said.

Oder said after the shooting the two baby moose kept on frolicking in the bright green grass, seemingly unaffected by the death of their mother.

ANCHORAGE, Alaska -- State biologists said this is the worst time of year for moose encounters because females are giving birth and kids are out of school.

One young boy learned that the hard way today when he was attacked by a mother moose.

Residents of a South Anchorage neighborhood said they've seen the female moose around for months, but this was the first time they've seen her with her twin calves.

The calves, which are less than a week old, are now orphaned. The mother was shot by police after it charged Joseph Kihlstadius, 8, while he walked through the neighborhood.

"We were just walking on that trail and then just hid and then we were gonna go over here, but then I slipped and then the moose trampled me and then trampled me again," Kihlstadius said.

Kihlstadius said he tried to protect himself by curling up near a fence, but the moose kept coming. Anthony Oder and his friends were playing basketball nearby when they heard a commotion coming from the backyard.

"We thought it was like a puppy, we heard like some squealing, so we went through my back window and we saw a little kid huddled against our fence," Oder said.

Anthony and his friends tried to pull Kihistadius out of harm's way by reaching over top of the fence, but when they tried to grab him the moose turned her attention on them.

"We wanted to get the kid out of there really bad, because he was really little and we didn't really know what to do," Oder said.

There was nothing they could do but wait for police.

When officers arrived, the moose was still ready to charge, so they made the decision to shoot her.

Alaska Department of Fish and Game Biologist Rick Sinnott said moose should be avoided this time of year.

"This is the worst time of year for moose because they're having their caives, and they've very defensive - the cows are very

defensive with their calves," Sinnott said.

Paramedics treated Kihlstadius for scrapes and bruises before sending him on his way with his very grateful father. Jeremy Kihlstadius said he was just happy his boy was OK.

Sinnott said this is definitely the worst moose run-in he's seen this year. But he said it isn't the first and it won't be the last.

"The calves don't move very much the first week or so and they have them in people's backyards in the greenbeits and stuff like that. The kids are out of school, moose are having babies -- it's the absolute worst time of year to have kids and moose mixing it up," Sinnott said.

Sinnott said he'll determine the sex of the orphaned calves before sending them on to a sanctuary or preserve. The mother moose has been butchered and her meat will be given to local charities and homeless shelters.

Sinnott said the best thing to do if you run into an aggressive moose is run, but to remember that applies to moose only and not bears or any other animal. If you fall down or can't get away, Sinnott recommends covering your head and trying not to move. He said moose would rather get away with their calves than attack.

On Thursday, May 31st, an orphaned famale moose calf was rescued from a residence on Upper O'Malley Road by Tom Harris, CEO of Tyonek Native Corporation. The calf's mother was last seen 3 days earlier when a hungry bear attacked her, as she appeared to lead the bear away to protect the calf. After 3 days, the calf had slowly weakened without its mother's milk and scon did not stand when approached, Alaska Moose Federation Chairman Gary Olson was asked to assist with the calf transport to the Alaska Zoo and whether the transport to the calf stand when approached with the calf transport to the Alaska Zoo and whether the transport to the transport to the Alaska Zoo and whether the veterinary care

Following intravenous feeding, antibiotics, a health screen, and suturing a puncture wound from the beer, the calf was picked up by the Alaska Zoo and now resides under their care, under their ADF&G permit. She gained 4 pounds her first night and today is back to being a bright, alert and responsive little calf. Sadly, this time of year Anchorage sees many calves orphaned from situations such as this and from vehicle collisions with their mothers that are not being helped. This calf was named Sarah first in honor of Alaska's First Female Governor and second in recognition of Governor Palin's campaign mandate to have Urban and Rural Alaskans to work together with the State to restore Alaska's diminishing moose populations through wildlife management for abundance.

Tom Harris participated in the rescue to prevent the loss of the calf and to help verify whether the calf could be the first calf of a new pilot project to rescue, care for and release healthy moose caives back to the wild. The Moose Recovery pilot project was modeled after similar 1950's and 1960's projects also designed to initiate or expedite Alaska's rural moose recovery; and is proposed by the Alaska Moose Federation and Alaska Village Initiatives with the full support of Cliff Judkins, Chairman of the Board of Game, and Tyonek Native Corporation, among many others.

Former ADF&G Deputy Commissioner Wayne Reglin stated that saving orphaned moose calves "is not in keeping with our mission to successfully manage wildlife populations" however ADF&G does "work with several animal rehabilitation organizations that restore injured raptors or marine mammals to good health." Thanks to this new Moose Recovery pilot project, the State of Alaska now has several new Rural and Urban partnering organizations working together to recover and restore injured and orphaned moose calves. This critical renewable resource is worth more to the state alive than dead. Furthermore, Urban and Rural Alaskans now have a new reason to be hopeful and, through this new caf, a new symbol through which we will restore Alaska's moose populations together, and her name is Sarah! <I-Iff tymi]->

P.S. The following disturbing quote from ADF&G was printed in the June 9, 2005 version of the Anchorage Daily News. The article was titled <u>Citv wildlife, a blend of beauty</u>, <u>dancer</u> which detailed the loss of a new born calf that was stuck in a fence. The quote is as follows: 'One day after shooting the calf, he returned to the neighborhood between the Old and New Seward highways and between Huffman and DeArmoun roads to retrieve the carcass and take it to 'my secret calf disposal site'; Simot said.' We do not have a problem with the fact that Simot put a severely injured calf mose out of its misery. This was the humane act to do. What we have a problem with is with all of the annual summer vehicle collisions that cow moose have with cars and the multitude of other occurrences, including shooting cows in defense of life and property which is becoming all to common in the lest couple of weeks both in Anchorage and in Fairbanks, where are all the other calves? What is happening to them?

Governor,

DEC has, as part of what we have been calling our "Early Season Program," contracted to put environmental professionals on at least one leg of the first voyage of each large cruise vessel entering Alaska waters. There have been 25 such vessels so far this season, all of which have had an environmental professional on board at some point. There were 6 environmental professionals serving as observers. We have called them "environmental professionals" because they are not U.S. Coast Guard certified marine engineers. Their primary task has been to use and refine the checklists we will use when we convert to the full Ocean Ranger program.

We will be putting an RFP out within the week for a three-year contract for the Ocean Ranger program. The RFP will ask the contractor to provide Ocean Rangers on each large cruise ship for the remainder of this cruise season and the next two seasons. We expect to be ramped up to the full Ocean Ranger Program at the start of next cruise season.

We are holding a public forum from 5 to 8 pm this Thursday night (June 7) at Centennial Hall in Juneau to present an overview of the Ocean Ranger Program and other components of DEC's oversight of cruise ship vessels. It will also be broadcast over the GCI internet service. We will have links on DEC website to an electronic recording of the forum if someone wants to view it later. We will have another forum at the end of the cruise season to go over what we learned this season and our plans for next year.

We understand that Governor Palin will also attend, and given the importance of Alaska to Canada, Ambassador Wilson is very interested in meeting with Governor Palin to discuss priority issues for Alaska and Canada, specifically the natural gas pipeline project and the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiate (WHTI).

Oil and gas are essential elements of both the Canadian and Alaskan economies, and as you know, a number of Canadian companies are active in oil and gas exploration in Alaska, in addition to mining and other industries. We understand that the Alaska Gasline Inducement Act was signed by the Governor in Fairbanks today (June 6). Canada supports bringing northern gas to market and has watched with interest the AGIA process. Today's signature makes a meeting between the Governor and the Canadian Ambassador early next week particularly timely.

As well, Alaska and Canada share 1,500 miles of border, and Canada is committed to working with Alaska to ensure your State's geographic reality and the unique Canada-Alaska relationship are taken into account in the implementation of WHTI.

I was advised today by the Department of Defense that there is an excellent likelihood that you could visit the mid-East during the week of July 16th.

If this works, you would fly into DC on Sunday and would travel to the Pentagon on Monday morning for briefings. You would then fly, probably on a DoD aircraft, to Kuwait to visit Alaska troops. It is also likely that you would be taken into Iraq for a short visit followed by a flight to Germany to visit with wounded troops.

DoD asks that you block out the full week of July 16th. If you are able to go, they will provide additional details soon. In the past, DoD has taken care of everything beginning with the briefings on Monday morning and bringing you back to the Pentagon at the end of the trip. All other arrangements are our responsibility.

General Campbell asked me to determine whether he could accompany you. Unfortunately, the answer is in the negative. No Adjutant Generals or gubernatorial staff have been permitted on these trips. However, Dan Wilmont, who has been on many similar trips previously, would be your escort. In addition, at least one other Governor is expected to go.

Dod needs to know the disposition of Alaska National Guard troops in Kuwait so that arrangements can be made for you to see them. Iraq will be more problematic for security reasons. DoD says that we should look to General Campbell for information on the location of Alaska units you would like to visit.

In addition, Governors come equipped with lapel pins, flags, and most importantly, coins

to distribute to the troops they visit. I wasn't involved in this phase of Governor Murkowski's trip, but General Campbell or Kari Spencer probably know what was done to fulfill this need.

For security reasons, we have been advised to keep our plans to a very small group. Please let me know how you would like to proceed.

The losses between January and April alone were \$700,000.00, far more than expected and they had not even sought that much of an appropriation.

In addition to the producers there will be about 44 jobs at the creamery that will end.

The alternate federal grant for another creamery which would have been a competitor of sorts is being appealed and is therefore on hold for now. It may be that that was being indirectly being appealed by Mat Maid itself through another entity. So, that appeal may lose momentum, but in any event, there will be a gap for quite some time were there is no local market for the dairy farmers short of transporting the milk to the Northern Lights dairy in Fairbanks which does not seem to have the capicity to process all of the milk should it actually get there.

Chitina Dip Net Fishery Encourages: Trespass onto Ahtna and CNC Property

Causing Safety Hazards to Life and

Environmental Damage to Lands

The Chitina Dip Net Fishery created by the State on the Copper River has become a popular recreational activity and an important source of fishery resources to the people of the State of Alaska. The O'Brien Creek area along the Copper River Highway is a primary Recreational Use point for this fishery. Other Recreational Use points include Eskilida Creek and Haley Creek. CNC is the owner of the surface estate for the land in the O'Brien Creek area. Ahtna is the upland owner in the Eskilida Creek and Haley Creek areas.

DOT&PF asserts an easement over portions of CNC's and Ahtna's land for the Copper River Highway right-of-way (the "State ROW"). This fishery has resulted in the creation of a Recreational Use Area at O'Brien Creek which draws approximately 30,000 people each year.

Participants in these recreational activities at O'Brien Creek often cross CNC's land. The majority of parking and camping areas in the vicinity of O'Brien Creek are on lands owned by CNC. Other participants use land owned by CNC or Ahtna while engaging in recreational activities at other points on both the east and west banks of the Copper River.

In order to control access, DOT&PF has been asked to fund construction of fencing and gates adequate to isolate the Ahtna and Chitina lands at O'Brien, Haley, and Eskilida Creeks from the State ROW, and to allow better control of the use of the lands. DOT&PF also has been asked to fund the cost of print and electronic media along with signage to inform the public of the private land, and that entry without an appropriate permit constitutes trespass.

Safety of the participants and protection of AI and CNC lands would be served if the State would provide adequate bear-proof trash receptacles and garbage removal services; port-a-potties reasonable toilet facilities including port-a-potties and permanent facilities.

CNC and AI are willing to allow for parking and camping on its land; installation and maintain any signage necessary (including signage provide by the state); a potable water station and dump station (if the State will fund).

When issuing permits, DF&G should provide a brochure to all persons obtaining Chitina Dip Net Fishery Permits explaining the need for a permit when using the State ROW, CNC lands, or Ahtna lands. There should be a statement clearly setting forth the dangers involved in the fishery and that all participants are proceeding at their own risk.

Ahtna and Chitina are subjected to multiple trespass incidents and destruction of property. The State has not protected Ahtna and Chitina lands from the trespass risk and does not enforce criminal trespass laws, which the State has a duty to enforce. When State Troopers or Officers are present in such areas and witness or are informed of violations of the criminal trespass laws they should take reasonable steps to enforce such laws.

Chitina Dip Net Fishery Encourages: Trespass onto Ahtna and CNC Property Causing Safety Hazards to Life and Environmental Damage to Lands The Chitina Dip Net Fishery created by the State on the Copper River has become a popular recreational activity and an important source of fishery resources to the people of the State of Alaska. The O'Brien Creek area along the Copper River Highway is a primary Recreational Use point for this fishery. Other Recreational Use points include Eskilida Creek and Haley Creek. CNC is the owner of the surface estate for the land in the O'Brien Creek area. Ahtna is the upland owner in the Eskilida Creek and Haley Creek areas.

DOT&PF asserts an easement over portions of CNC's and Ahtna's land for the Copper River Highway right-of-way (the "State ROW"). This fishery has resulted in the creation of a Recreational Use Area at O'Brien Creek which draws approximately 30,000 people each year. Participants in these recreational activities at O'Brien Creek often cross CNC's land. The majority of parking and camping areas in the vicinity of O'Brien

Creek are on lands owned by CNC. Other participants use land owned by CNC or Ahtna while engaging in recreational activities at other points on both the east and west banks of the Copper River. In order to control access, DOT&PF has been asked to fund construction of fencing and gates adequate to isolate the Ahtna and Chitina lands at O'Brien, Haley, and Eskilida Creeks from the State ROW, and to allow better control of the use of the lands. DOT&PF also has been asked to fund the cost of print and electronic media along with signage to inform the public of the private land, and that entry without an appropriate permit constitutes trespass. Safety of the participants and protection of AI and CNC lands would be served if the State would provide adequate bear-proof trash receptacles and garbage removal services; port-a-potties reasonable toilet facilities including port-a-potties and permanent facilities.

CNC and AI are willing to allow for parking and camping on its land; installation and maintain any signage necessary (including signage provide by the state); a potable water station and dump station (if the State will fund).

When issuing permits, DF&G should provide a brochure to all persons obtaining Chitina Dip Net Fishery Permits explaining the need for a permit when using the State ROW, CNC lands, or Ahtna lands. There should be a statement clearly setting forth the dangers involved in the fishery and that all participants are proceeding at their own risk. Ahtna and Chitina are subjected to multiple trespass incidents and destruction of property. The State has

not protected Ahtna and Chitina lands from the trespass risk and does not enforce criminal trespass laws, which the State has a duty to enforce. When State Troopers or Officers are present in such areas and witness or are informed of violations of the criminal trespass laws they should take reasonable steps to enforce such laws.

Talking Points

for

Protection of our Subsistence Rights and Way of Life

These *Talking Points* were prepared by Ahtna, Incorporated, in response to the State of Alaska Board of Game's regulatory restrictions which have a negative impact to the rights of local subsistence users within the Ahtna Region.

Background

• On December 18th, 1971, Congress passed the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) with the expectation of preserving our rights to continue our traditional subsistence way of life.

• When neither the State nor the Secretary of the Interior fulfilled Congress' expectation, we Alaskan Natives petitioned for systematic and comprehensive statutory protections for our way of live.

• In Title VIII of ANILCA, Congress did not provide explicit protection of Alaska Native subsistence uses, choosing instead to enact a priority for subsistence uses by Alaska's "rural" residents – an action taken in response to objections by the State of Alaska to a Native preference.

• The State of Alaska then enacted its own conforming law giving a rural priority, thereby gaining the right to manage subsistence hunting and fishing on all federal public lands and waters in Alaska.

• In 1990, the State lost its right to manage subsistence fishing and hunting on federal lands and waters when the Alaska Supreme Court found that the State's rural-priority subsistence law violated its own Constitution.

• Since 1990, the Alaska Legislature, stymied by a minority of its members who oppose subsistence, has refused to allow a vote on a constitutional amendment that would allow a state law consistent with federal law, advocating instead for the repeal or weakening of Title VIII in order to strip Native villages of the only protection they still have for their subsistence way of life.

• In 1990, the federal government took over management of subsistence hunting on feral lands in Alaska; and later in the decade, its jurisdiction was expanded (by the *Katie John* suit) to cover subsistence fishing on reserved navigable waters, which are on or adjacent to those lands.

• The Federal Subsistence Board (FSB) adopted the state system as its starting point, incorporating into federal regulations all state subsistence regulations in place at the time; however, the state system has been manipulated to the point that state law provides little or no protection for the subsistence way o life, while federal regulations more accurately reflect customary and traditional practices of rural subsistence users.

• Since at least early 2005, the State has mounted a calculated campaign to enhance its own role in the federal management system and to change a number of important policies in ways that can

negatively impact the way subsistence is managed - all in order to bring the federal management system more in line with the state management system.

• In October 2006, the State Board of Game held meetings to consider 8 proposals directly related to units 11, 12, 13 and 20, six (6) of which would have negatively impacted the right of local subsistence users while opening these same units to sport and non-resident use. Evidence of their objectives are in the following actions taken:

- Reducing the number of hunts a proxy hunter can perform to one; which prevents our skilled hunter from providing for our elders and disabled.
- Requiring that a proxy hunter also be a Tier II permit holder which further prevents our skilled hunters from providing for our elders and disabled.
- Reducing the take from three to two further reducing our ability to provide for ourselves and others in need in the community.
- Forcing Tier II users to split horns traditionally, we would leave the horns in the field, now we'll have to take the time to saw through the horns before bringing them out.
- It should be noted that at this meeting, the Board of Game sponsored a proposal that would have created a "super exclusive" hunting area – which would have severely reduced our hunting grounds to a small area while opening certain lands within units 11, 12, 13 and 20 to sport and non-resident use without similar restrictions.

• In March 2007, the State Board of Game continued with their objective in systematically eliminating the rights of subsistence users while enhancing and protecting the rights of sport and non-resident hunter. Evidence of their objective are in the following actions taken:

- Requiring the hunter to salvage the head, hide, heart liver, and kidneys of a caribou. This places a hardship on our elders and will creates a problem where there wasn't one before
- Restricting hunting for moose and caribou from anywhere else in the state during a regulatory year if you obtain a Tier II Unit 13 permit for that species.
- Imposing an "Income" criterion for the Tier II application which will require applicants to provide a gross or pre-tax income for each member of their household. If the household has four members and together everyone makes more than \$51,640 for that year, then the Tier II applicant will not receive ay points on their application.

Talking Points

• Under state law, if the harvestable portion of a fish or game stock is not sufficient to provide a reasonable opportunity for subsistence uses, the Alaska board of Game is authorized to adopt regulations that eliminate other consumptive uses and make choices among subsistence users based on their customary and direct dependence on the wildlife population, and their ability to obtain food elsewhere if subsistence sues is restricted or eliminated.

• When a reasonable opportunity for subsistence uses cannot be provided, even after eliminating all non-subsistence uses, the Board of Game is required to adopt a "Tier II" permit system which distinguished between Alaskan Residents based on two criteria: customary and direct

dependence on the game population as a mainstay of livelihood (60 points) and the ability to obtain food if subsistence use is restricted or eliminated (40 points).

• The Board of Game has adopted Tier II hunts for certain game units, including the Nelchina caribou herd in GMU 13. As a result of the All-Alaska policy, the Amount Necessary for Subsistence uses (ANS) for the Nelchina caribou herd is "all harvestable surplus" in order to provide subsistence uses for all Alaskans.

• The harvestable surplus of the Nelchina caribou herd has not nor ever will be sufficient to provide a reasonable opportunity for subsistence uses for all Alaskans, resulting in a possible permanent Tier II status for all Alaskans to harvest caribou in GMU 13.

• Subsistence users in the Ahtna region and on the road system have been negatively impacted by the Board of Game's actions over the last year. It is clear to us that the Boards only objective is to find a way to get sport and non-resident hunters into units 11, 12, 13 and 20 and make Tier II user's hunts so difficult and oppressive they will choose to become sport hunters.

• The Ahtna region recognizes that the Tier II application process is flawed, but continues to support the existing Tier II regulation as the best protection for subsistence rights until such time as the Tier II application and point system and process can be revised to ensure that true subsistence users receive permits.

• The Board of Game is potentially establishing precedent with the adoption of additional restrictive regulations for subsistence users which may then be applied to other regions in the state as related to subsistence use.

Conclusion

The Ahtna people will continue to fight for our subsistence user rights. We will continue to attend the Board of Fish and Game meetings to protect our rights. It has been made overly clear to us that the objectives of the Alaska Board of Game have been to promote policies that negatively impact our subsistence way of life. The board of Game is attempting to open certain units to sport and non-resident use in violation of the Tier II regulation in times of shortage.

- We urge the State Boards of Fish and Game to revise the existing Tier II application process by simplifying the application and revising the point system to give extra points for the cost of locally purchased food and gasoline.
- We ask that the Department of Public Safety and ADF&G provide enforcement and punishment of those abusing the existing Tier II application process.
- We ask that the State Board of Game discontinue its efforts to further restrict subsistence users unduly by imposing unwarranted restrictions for means and methods and if such restrictions are adopted to impose the same restrictions on all users to include sport and non-resident users.

Subsistence hunting, fishing and gathering constitute the nutritional, spiritual and cultural foundation of Alaska's indigenous people and our village cultures. We must continue to protect these rights for all Alaskans.

We have a draft letter prepared to the President requesting federal assistance to a state disaster declaration. Earlier this year, due to the Kenai River flood damage, declared a disaster and made financial assistance available. The State was unable at the time to determine the full impact due to ice coverage and as a result requested two extensions to the deadline for federal assistance. The State now has a better understanding of the damage and has compiled estimates of nearly \$1.3 million for local government and state facilities and an additional \$1.35 million to U.S. F&W facilities. Within the last 14 months, the state has seen four disasters that have been federally declared.

The letter needs to get out quickly and I am able to authorize signature; however, I need to sign a notarized affidavit that states that I have personally discussed this matter 1

with you and have your direction to proceed.

Governor,

I'll try to get you some budget comments later in the week, but I first want to follow up on our conversation of earlier this evening regarding notice of oil shale leasing. I did some checking, and the issue apparently involves lease notices. Congress wanted to speed up the leasing process, so it limited states to 14 days for comment -- in addition to time allocated for the usual public comments. It appears the Western states feel rushed at 14 days additional to public comment and want more time.

I suppose the feds could argue they don't want to allow for longer comment periods by the states, as the Interior Department is pushing to open more areas to oil shale leases. But remembering how messed up it got with coalbed methane leases in the MatSu because of a rush job with inadequate public notice, I'd say it's good policy to allow states an additional time -- a reasonable time -- to ensure there are no unresolved problems before opening an area to oil shale leases. Allowing 120 days additional comment on a multi-year lease and potential drilling and production site does not seem unreasonable to me.

Kris Perry,

I have reported from the Mat-Su Valley Frontiersman on plans by the Valley's electric coop Matanuska Electric Association to cut ties with Chugach Electric Association and build its own power generation in the Valley. MEA's plan, consulted by engineering and construction firm CH2M Hill, calls for a 100 megawatt natural gas-fired plant and a 100 megawatt coal-fired plant. This proposition was met in the Valley with skepticism at first and now opposition.

Three main issue underly this opposition; the cost building and operating a coal plant in Alaska at a time when carbon emissions are a growing concern; the risk that coal combustion could cause damage to the Valley's sensitive environment and agricultural lands; and the apparent lack of transparency by MEA administration and staff during the planning process. It is interesting to note that I have encountered very little opposition to the proposed natural gas plant, either for its cleanliness or cost.

Below are some questions for the governor about MEA around which I would like to base an article. Either a phone interview discussing these questions or an email response would work fine.

At MEA's annual meeting in March Gov. Palin challenged the co-op to operate with openness and transparency. Does she feel MEA's administration has taken her challenge to heart?

Does Gov. Palin believe MEA has carried out an effective, open and inclusive public process during its campaign to build new electric generation?

With Gov. Palin's work on AGIA and her attempts to bring natural gas to Alaskans, how does she see MEA's plan to generate its base-load power from coal and not natural gas? MEA's proposed natural gas plant is slated for use only during peak loads.

A recent report by the Alaskan utility consulting firm Mark A. Foster and Associates found that MEA's plan for building the coal plant underestimates the cost of construction and maintenance of a coal-fired generator in Alaska. And the plan underestimates the per ton cost of carbon dioxide emissions. These two miscalculations alone could cost MEA member-owners hundreds of millions of dollars more than MEA's estimate over the 30- to 50year life-cycle of the plant. Does Gov. Palin think MEA should conduct an independent review - give a second opinion - of CH2M Hill's plan. This plan, called the Integrated Resource Plan, has only been seen by the co-op's member-owners in summarized form.

How does it look to someone in Gov. Palin's position to see the main Railbelt co-ops break away from Chugach Electric to develop individualized, local generation?

Gov. Palin's family lives near the two sites proposed in the Meadow Lakes area. How does

she feel about the prospect of a coal plant near her home? Near any Valley resident's home?

As member-owners who will eventually foot the bill for this project, both in money and in health, what does Gov. Palin think Valley residents can do to change the course of their co-op?

The Matanuska Maid dairy is still on track to shut down early next month despite pleas and \$600,000 in already-promised state money from Gov. Sarah Palin.

A creamery board, which oversees the state-owned dairy, met Wednesday in Anchorage and rejected the governor's public request that it keep the dairy open, saying it stands by an earlier decision to close the plant July 7.

In doing so, board members rejected a request from Palin to use a pending \$600,000 appropriation to keep it open.

Board members cited rising expenses, competition from Lower 48 brands and an economic model that simply didn't support staying in business.

"We are being fiduciarily responsible to the state of Alaska and the people of Alaska by doing what we are doing... Nobody wants to be here and make this decision, least of all me," chairman Mac Carter said in an emotional speech after the decision.

Staying in business longer could leave the company more than \$2 million in the red by the end of the year, he said. Closing now means the company will be able to pay its debts, he said.

The board did agree, however, to send cost estimates to the governor of how much it would cost to keep the dairy open and a list of factors that could affect those estimates.

Alaska farmers said the closure will leave them with no place to sell most of their milk and may force them to kill their herds. Matanuska Maid is the largest buyer of milk in the state.

"What am I going to do? said a clearly distraught Craig Trytten, who with his wife,

Vicki, and children run a dairy farm at Point MacKenzie. "Am I going to quit milking cows? Just shut the switch off and hear them scream and scream? Where's the electricity going to come from to milk them?"

Gov. Palin could not immediately be reached for comment. But in a letter to the board Tuesday, she criticized its short notice to farmers about the closure and asked that they use a \$600,000 state grant to keep the dairy open by running a scaled-down operation that would use only local milk.

Board members, however, said Palin's plan was not feasible. Mat Maid currently imports most of its milk, and local farmers do not produce enough to make it worth operating the plant, Carter said.

Matanuska Maid was started as a farmer's cooperative in the 1930s. It was taken over by the state after going bankrupt in 1986 and operated profitably for most of the ensuing years until 2005.

Matanuska Maid CEO Joe Van Treeck said after the meeting the dairy has set July 3 as its last day to pick up milk from farmers.

Meeting Summary, Creamery Corporation Board of Directors 6/13/07, Westmark Hotel

After waiting about an hour for a quorum to arrive, Chairman Mac Carter opened the meting up for public comment.

Barbara Huff of the Teamsters Local 959 spoke on behalf of the dairy's Teamster drivers, expressing concern they'd not been a party to discussion about the closure, and a desire to work with the dairy and/or governor about the collective bargaining issues involved, but that in the absence of consultation, some legal action might become necessary to protect the drivers' interests.

Craig Trytten, a dairy farmer, spoke on behalf of himself and other dairy farmers, saying he hoped the Creamery Corporation directors would resign and throw the issue to the Palin Administration. He also said it would be difficult for his farm to transition to selling milk to the possible Rob Wells Palmer dairy when it might start operating at the end of the year; but he added that Wells only needs 71 cows' production, and he has 200 cows in his farm along.

The board entered executive session for the purpose of discussing employee contracts including Joe Van Treek's, to review the dairy's cash on hand and outstanding obligations to vendors and other contractual obligations, and any potential litigation. After returning to open session about 90 minutes later, the board passed two resolutions without objection.

The first motion called for the Creamery Corporation to authorize the Executive Committee to negotiate, and either accept or reject VanTreek's resignation; and to review the terms of continuing employment should the closure date be extended.

The second motion was to respond to the governor's June 6, 2007 letter by providing monthly cost estimates based on the lowest cost to continue operation, and a list of factors that may affect the costs of such operations, including possible erosion of product quality, loss of sales, the refusal of suppliers and buyers to accept the changes, a loss of employees, and other issues, as laid out by Creamery Corporation staff.

Rhonda Boyles spoke briefly, somewhat in response to the governor's 6/21 letter, saying that the 21 days notice of Mat-Maid's closure was based on the Creamery Corporation's fiduciary responsibility – that the most judicious decision they could make was to close down the dairy, with respect. There are a lot of ways to spend the \$600,000, and if the governor wants to consider other possible markets for Alaska-produced milk, the money would provide some time.

Mac Carter gave a brief statement, saying that the Board has considered its effect on all parties, including the dairy, and its workers, and the dairy farmers, and was making an unpopular, but necessary and responsible decision on behalf of the people of Alaska. Unless someone has a golden goose and can produce enough money to solve the problems, he said, he did not see how the dairy could continue operating. He said if the board waited to close the dairy down in

December 2007, and loses up to \$2 million in the process, the board will be lambasted for not closing it in June when losses would be less.

Tom Tanta (sp?) who had been chairman of the Creamery Corporation board 17 years ago spoke on behalf of the dairy's workforce, saying that the \$600,000 should be spent not on more studies, or on political cover, but on direct benefit to the employees who faced imminent unemployment. He praised Van Treek's management of the dairy.

Joe VanTreek then spoke for about 15 minutes, presenting a history of the dairy's challenges and problems. Among his most salient points:

- The state's support of the dairy industry (Point Mackenzie) was a social experiment
- There has been a test of will between what's best for business and what society thinks it wants in terms of an agriculture industry
- Mat Maid's cost for local milk includes \$19.75 per hundredweight (11.5 gallons), plus \$1/hwt quality bonus, plus cost of transportation from farm to plant. That compares with the outside price of milk at \$12.50/hwt.
- Mat Maid paid farmers all it could; dairy farmers also receive benefits in the form of land credits, some wildlife set-asides, and a \$1 million USDA lump sum to help Alaska dairy farmers write down debt, plus \$500,000 state appropriation that meant a \$2/hwt subsidy for Alaska-produced milk
- "Without significant changes in the underpinnings of this industry, there is no future" for the dairy
- He said there has been no state of Alaska support for agriculture, never has been, and without it we had been hurting people by causing them to believe, and to invest their lives and fortunes, in to a dream that was in reality a fallacy.
- The \$600,000 offered by the state is not a solution; it doesn't even get the dairy started. The dairy told the Ad Hoc Agriculture Committee that it would take \$30-40 million, plus a plan, to make the dairy industry work.
- "We don't have the right economic structure. We've got an Edsel, and we're trying to make it into a Supersonic Transport."
- Mat-Maid's business model demands that they sell milk for about \$20/hwt, but it costs \$26/hwt.
- He understands the decision will have dire impact on dairy farmers.
- "It's a sad day. It's a sad day. But without a plan for the future, it's (the shutdown) the only choice left."

The Creamery Corporation's decision is not final. The Governor still has other options; therefore, the closing was not solidified today.

You did a good job at 5pm stating that the \$600,000 doesn't cover 2 weeks, but then stating that the Governor asked the Legislature for \$600,000 because that's what Mat Maid asked for to continue full operations through the fall. So you really had a good balance of one side versus the other. But the 6pm really only had the Creamery Corporation's side and that's probably because I called with a distracting comment refuting your tag at 5pm. Sorry to confuse matters.

Remember, the Governor's proposal is just to produce the local milk (not import 72% from the Outside) and only produce milk (not cheese and cottage cheese, etc.). So, with the Creamery Corporation's initial request for \$600,000 for full operations through the fall, you would think based on the Creamery Corporation's numbers, a scaled back version could be sustained for the same time period. It was their number, not ours. So for Van Treeck to say that won't even take us two weeks – why did he ask for that amount? The Governor's solution was also backed by financial numbers passed on to the state late last week that showed local only, milk only could be sustained in Alaska with that \$600,000. So did the Creamery Corporation not provide the state with all the right numbers?

Bottom line: to say that Mat Maid will shut down July 7th is the opinion of the Creamery Corporation and based upon the Creamery Corporation. The Governor will continue to work to find solutions so that the rug is not pulled out from underneath the dairy producers.

Regarding Homeland Security, it appears as though that is another fabrication. The contact is McHugh Pierre at 321-2179. He called us to say that Homeland Security is researching to see if that comment applies to anyone. In the meantime, Homeland Security told us that since the Governor is CEO of the state-owned facility, she should have immediate access.

And since she has federal top secret security clearance, access for the Governor is not an issue, especially at the dairy. To confirm at 11:45am that he was on his way to meet the Governor at noon, and to say that no one else in the state was allowed to let her into the back area, and then to come out tonight and say it was a Homeland Security issue seems like a few too many excuses – some of which were never even mentioned to the Governor.

The Matanuska Maid dairy is still on track to shut down early next month despite pleas and

\$600,000 in already-promised state money from Gov. Sarah Palin.

A creamery board, which oversees the state-owned dairy, met Wednesday in Anchorage and rejected the governor's public request that it keep the dairy open, saying it stands by an earlier decision to close the plant July 7.

In doing so, board members rejected a request from Palin to use a pending \$600,000 appropriation to keep it open.

Board members cited rising expenses, competition from Lower 48 brands and an economic model that simply didn't support staying in business.

"We are being fiduciarily responsible to the state of Alaska and the people of Alaska by doing what we are doing... Nobody wants to be here and make this decision, least of all me," chairman Mac Carter said in an emotional speech after the decision.

Staying in business longer could leave the company more than \$2 million in the red by the end of the year, he said. Closing now means the company will be able to pay its debts, he said.

The board did agree, however, to send cost estimates to the governor of how much it would cost to keep the dairy open and a list of factors that could affect those estimates.

Alaska farmers said the closure will leave them with no place to sell most of their milk and may force them to kill their herds. Matanuska Maid is the largest buyer of milk in the state.

"What am I going to do? said a clearly distraught Craig Trytten, who with his wife, Vicki, and children run a dairy farm at Point MacKenzie. "Am I going to quit milking cows? Just shut the switch off and hear them scream and scream? Where's the electricity going to come from to milk them?"

Gov. Palin could not immediately be reached for comment. But in a letter to the board Tuesday, she criticized its short notice to farmers about the closure and asked that they use a \$600,000 state grant to keep the dairy open by running a scaled-down operation that would use only local milk.

Board members, however, said Palin's plan was not feasible. Mat Maid currently imports most of its milk, and local farmers do not produce enough to make it worth operating the plant, Carter said.

Matanuska Maid was started as a farmer's cooperative in the 1930s. It was taken over by the state after going bankrupt in 1986 and operated profitably for most of the ensuing years until 2005.

Matanuska Maid CEO Joe Van Treeck said after the meeting the dairy has set July 3 as its last day to pick up milk from farmers.

Palin addresses farmers protesting dairy closing

WASILLA – Gov. Sarah Palin told a crowd of farmers and concerned Valley residents today that she plans to fix the broken state-run Matanuska Maid dairy.

"Things are kind of a mess right now with what's happening with Mat Maid, and we're going to clean it up," Palin said. "We can revitalize it, and that's what our commitment is."

Palin addressed approximately 100 people gathered at 10 a.m. at a farm near the Trunk and Bogard roads intersection.

Bob Havemeister, a lifelong Valley farmer in whose driveway the group assembled, said the dairy buys the bulk of his milk. If it closes as planned July 7, he'll have to send his cows to slaughter. Asked what will happen to his dairy farm, he said, "It might turn into a subdivision. What else would I do?"

Dairy officials said previously that should the dairy remain open, it would lose \$2 million by the end of the year. Since 2005, it has lost \$1.3 million, including \$700,000 this year, according to statistics cited previously by state creamery board chairman Mac Carter.

The board, citing mounting debts, on Wednesday rejected Palin's call to reconsider its close date.

Palin addresses farmers protesting dairy closing

WASILLA - Gov. Sarah Palin told a crowd of farmers and concerned Valley residents today that she plans to fix the broken state-run Matanuska Maid dairy.

"Things are kind of a mess right now with what's happening with Mat Maid, and we're going to clean it up," Palin said. "We can revitalize it, and that's what our commitment is."

Palin addressed approximately 100 people gathered at 10 a.m. at a farm near the Trunk and Bogard roads intersection.

Bob Havemeister, a lifelong Valley farmer in whose driveway the group assembled, said the dairy buys the bulk of his milk. If it closes as planned July 7, he'll have to send his cows to slaughter. Asked what will happen to his dairy farm, he said, "It might turn into a subdivision. What else would I do?"

Dairy officials said previously that should the dairy remain open, it would lose \$2 million by the end of the year. Since 2005, it has lost \$1.3 million, including \$700,000 this year, according to statistics cited previously by state creamery board chairman Mac Carter.

The board, citing mounting debts, on Wednesday rejected Palin's call to reconsider its close date.

Much has been written about Governor Palin's visit to the Matanuska Maid Dairy and how she was spurned from taking a tour.

What you didn't hear about was the actual behind the scenes events which took place.

June 13,2007

10:00am - The Governor's Office calls Mat-Maid and requests a tour of the plant. They are told by employees that the plant manager is gone and the only person authorized to give tours, the CEO, is at a well publicized board meeting. It is suggested they reschedule for later.

11:00am - Kris Perry from the Governor's Office calls and announces that Governor Palin will be there at noon. Perry is told once again that there will be noone there authorized to give a tour. Mat-Maid is told it is will just be a few people.

11:30am - Unable to reach the CEO on his cell phone because he is in the middle of a presentation to the creamery board, the CEO's wife fields a frantic phone call from the office.

11:45am - The CEO's wife in her car arrives at the Westmark Hotel where she slips a note to the CEO. The public session has just begun and the CEO is unable to leave until he is finished with Q &A. He instructs his office to make the governor as comfortable as possible in the conference room until he can break away.

Noon - The Governor arrives with a large entourage of people, including her husband Todd, daughter Piper, DNR officials, staff and security. Also in tow is several media outlets.

Todd Palin becomes agitated and asks the Mat-Maid employees "are you telling me you won't let the Governor of Alaska tour this facility?"

12:30pm - The CEO finally breaks away from the meeting and calls his office to inform them he is 7 or 8 minutes away from the plant.

Back at Mat-Maid, the Governor decides to wait no longer and leaves before the CEO arives.

Prediction - Next week a new creamery board will be appointed and the head will be Robert Gottstein who has also been recently awarded a grant for \$475,000 from the federal government to open a milk bottling plant in Palmer.

Fact - Did you know that over the last 20 years, Matanuska Maid in an effort to support Alaskan Grown have paid Alaskan Dairy Farmers roughly \$4 million dollars more for locally produced milk than they paid for milk imported from outside Alaska?

-Mat Maid pays farmers 21.08 per hundred weight

-1,264.80 per day to farmers

-461,652.00 per year to each farmer

-2,308,260.00 paid to all farmers

-Approx. 1,288,450 gallons produced yearly by the five dairies.

-At a retail price of 4.79 gallon, equals 6,171,675.00 per year gross

-Since Alaskan milk only comprises about 28% of the Mat Maid product, multiply gallons of Alaskan milk by 3.5 (imported milk) and you get 21,600,864.00 total gross (of course this is using the 4.79 per gallon price and prices vary at different locations)

-Mat Maids wholesale price to retailers in March was around 4.00 per gal. (I know it was 4.14 for convience

stores, less at big stores). That price has probably gone up in the last few months.

Conclusion: If Mat Maid were to go to a 100% Alaskan made product, wholesale it at 4.00 per gallon, the gross after paying the farmers would be 2,845,540.00. The question is, is that enough to sustain a small scale plant? If the wholesale price went up to 5.00 per gallon, gross would go up to 4,133,990.00. We are only talking liquid milk here.

Keep in mind that the dairies have their own problems. Some are debt free and others owe hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Red,

Sorry I haven't gotten much communication back to you, but things have been hopping around here and I didn't want to go through a bunch of what-ifs; I thought it best to utilize your input as a "clean" indication of what folks out there are seeing/hearing. Nevertheless, we are ready to start talking about the plans the Governor has for the BAC and Mat Maid.

First, I can tell you first hand the Governor does not look for (or appreciate) yes men. With new appointments today, she will be looking for people she trusts to go in and take a hard look and make a sound decision about the short-term horizon. Unfortunately, the message(s) we were getting from Mat Maid management and some members of the board were inconsistent—which leads to suspicion in the ag community and puts cracks in the confidence the Governor can have in the message itself. Also, the sudden change in direction by Mat Maid (shutting down in July versus the end of the year) has unfairly put the dairy farmers in the position of having the rug pulled out from under them without time to plan for a total shutdown if that is the necessary result. Bottom line, she needs a frank assessment pretty quick from folks she has confidence in.

Second, this is not just about 5 dairy farms. There are more than 100 jobs at Mat Maideverything from the truckers who pickup and deliver products to support staff in the corporate offices. Also, the dairy farms are the market for farms that grow feed and hay.

And if the dairies stop providing a regular supply of cattle to the slaughterhouse, it could shut down, too. Then the pig farmers wouldn't have anywhere to take their animals. The ripple affect will be felt all over the agricultural industry.

Finally, there is going to be a look at whatever long-term solutions there might be. The Governor needs to know what the range of long-term solutions might look like. If the only way to continue a dairy production industry in Alaska is with long-term subsidies from the State, we need to know that. I can tell you the Governor wants a private sector solution here. But if Mat Maid closes without time for the private sector to respond and fill the market gap, we could lose the dairy industry and it is unlikely those dairies (or new ones) will come back.

ANCSA Agenda – June 19, 2007

* Education - New Commissioner (Press Release)

Almost two weeks ago now, you accepted the resignation of Commissioner Roger Sampson and offered congratulations on the acceptance of his new position as President of Education Commission of the States.

The Education Commission of the States is an interstate compact that exchanges information and ideas among state policymakers and education leaders to develop policy and strategies that will improve the quality of education across the nation.

Impact on national level should have strong benefits for the state of Alaska.

The State Board of Education & Early Development appointed Sampson as the Alaska Commissioner of Education & Early Development on May 9, 2003. The board will conduct a national search for a replacement. Interested candidates may contact the Alaska Department of Education & Early Development. Under state law, the board appoints the commissioner which is subject to the approval of the governor. The commissioner serves at the pleasure of the board.

Commissioner Sampson will serve through August 17, 2007.

* 8a Issue - Statewide impacts and National opportunities (John Katz)

Regarding Section 8(a), we are working very closely with representatives of the Native community to preserve the essential elements of this program for Native entities.

There is a serious threat to the program in Congress. Some members don't understand how

it works, and others have received complaints from constituents who have lost contracts to Alaska Native corporations.

The House has passed legislation which would seriously restrict the program. The Senate is expected to act sometime soon. Discussions involving the Congressional delegation, Native entities, and us have focused on what strategy to pursue in the Senate - whether to propose a compromise or to advocate for the status quo. It is expected that legislation in some form will pass in the current Congress.

State support for the 8(a) program is premised on the significant benefits that accrue to Native corporations and their shareholders and on the beneficial impacts on the Alaska economy in general. There have been some abuses, but these have been rectified. So, our goal has been to maintain the basic elements of the 8(a) program.

I presume that the Native leaders are principally concerned about energy policy in Alaska. Suffice it to say that, at the Federal level, Congress is preoccupied with renewable energy. There is little interest in provisions that would benefit the domestic oil and gas industry. In fact, tax incentives for the industry that were enacted just a couple of years ago may well be repealed in favor of incentives for renewables.

There is no reasonable likelihood that the coastal plain of ANWR will be opened to oil and gas development in the foreseeable future (although Senators Stevens and Murkowski may propose an amendment to include ANWR in the Strategic Petroleum Reserve System).

However, there is strong bipartisan support for commercializing North Slope natural gas. At the moment, we are not asking for anything new here to promote pipeline construction. The focus is on implementing AGIA.

* Gasline (Meghan Stapleton)

My gasline team recently returned from Washington, DC, where they held meetings with White House officials, including Drue Pearce; FERC, including Chairman Kelliher, all three members of the Congressional delegation; and federal agencies, including Department of Energy.

The team is busy working on the Request for Applications (RFA) right now. They are still driving toward an early July timeline for release of the RFA. The RFAs will be due back three months later. At that point, the team will go through the applications and the public will look through the applications which meet the criteria laid out in AGIA. Irwin and Galvin will choose the best candidate (could be a group) and then forward to legislature for approval, as per AGIA.

We are all reaching out to all potential parties / companies to let them know how much we valued their input during the process and the importance of participation in our gasline project.

* Energy policy (From Bethel Energy Speech)

What I hear most often is the worry and concern about the high cost of energy in our villages. And it's not fair. The high cost of living is tough enough – and then you have the burden of high fuel costs – felt every day. Fuel costs touch homes, transportation, and food because villages are not on the road system. I know that energy controls the costs of everything – and that for seven months, everything must come in from the air and that only hurts more.

I know and I understand that people are migrating away from our villages because it costs too much to live there and I know that others still are leaving smaller villages to move to larger

villages, like Bethel, because it's just too costly outside of here.

Homes are for sale... jobs are unfilled... and it's not healthy. And I understand people want to work in the Bush, but just can't afford it because of the high cost of living.

There are a couple of ways I will try to help – first of all, I will continue to manage the state's fish and game for abundance. The one piece of help that you have is subsistence – with the high cost of food. And I will continue to aggressively defend our predator control programs.

Additionally, as promised, I have tasked numerous individuals and departments to focus on and think about renewable energy sources and how we can harness those sources to help you and to reduce your costs. Sources like geothermal and wind, to just name two.

That's why I have requested funds for an Alaska Energy Inventory in my capital budget. We need to identify all sources of energy all over this state and put that information into an electronic map. Once we have done this, we can take the next step and identify the right technology and hardware to convert those alternative sources into energy you can use. If we identify the sources of our energy that are closest to our communities and match it up with the right technology, we can bring down these extraordinary costs to a level that allows people to live where they want.

So please know that we are thinking of you, we are working to help you, and while the solution won't be overnight, please know that you are on our minds and our not forgotten.

* Subsistence

- The state provides a preference for all Alaskans for subsistence. State subsistence regulations allow rural and non-rural residents to hunt and fish on all lands (private, state, and federal) unless the federal government closes its lands to uses other than subsistence harvest by federally qualified individuals.
- The state's approach protects the ability of rural residents who move to urban areas to continue subsistence activities in rural areas. It also protects the ability of rural residents not covered by a customary and traditional (C&T) use determination to continue subsistence activities on federal public lands, unless closed. Once the federal government adopts a C&T determination for a species in an area, rural residents not covered by that determination can only subsistence hunt or fish on federal public lands under state regulations.
- Having dual wildlife regulatory systems (federal subsistence management overlaid on traditional state fish and wildlife management) continues to be an important issue for rural Alaskans. In many areas rural users are moving away from involvement in the state system because the federal subsistence program seems to grant the desires of rural residents, often at the expense of other Alaskans and sometimes to the detriment of the resource.
- Paradoxically, since predator management is not allowed on federal refuges, parks, and preserves, the federal system precludes attempts to increase wildlife abundance, which in turn exacerbates the tensions between local subsistence users and non-locals.

Federal Subsistence Board

The Secretaries of Interior and Agriculture have proposed changes to the list of "rural" and "non-rural" determinations for communities based on the 2000 census and other factors in federal subsistence regulations. These revisions could affect Adak, Prudhoe Bay and parts of the Kenai, Wasilla/Palmer and Homer areas. Saxman has protested being listed as non-rural and part of Ketchikan; and a number of communities connected by road near Kenai might be lumped together. There has been widespread opposition to the Board's decision to authorize subsistence fisheries for residents of Ninilchik, Hope and Cooper Landing on the Kenai and Kasilof Rivers. Kodiak was proposed to change to

non-rural, but under the final rule is still classified as rural. The State took no position on individual communities but protested the lack of evenhandedness in the federal process.

The Federal Board continues to adopt regulations that duplicate State regulations and, thus, create confusion on the ground due to regulatory drift of the two sets of regulations because Federal lands are not marked on the ground. The duplicative regulations also establish a priority for rural residents that are not based on criteria to determine customary and traditional use and without determining the amount of use reasonably necessary for subsistence before restricting other uses. The State frequently protests the Board's inconsistent process and lack of factual evidence for determining customary and traditional uses (e.g., sporadic use anywhere is used instead of evidence of a community pattern of use).

* 50th Anniversary of Statehood

My office is coordinating the anniversary celebration. In particular, Kris Perry is serving as Chairman and they are meeting regularly, preparing for the celebration.

ANCSA Background

The Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) was enacted in 1971. Under the Act, Native corporations received approximately 44 million acres and almost \$1 billion in settlement of their aboriginal land claims in Alaska.

The settlement was distributed to Alaska Native corporations chartered under State law. Significant economic benefits have accrued to many of these corporations, thereby benefitting their shareholders and the Alaska economy in general.

Over the years, ANCSA has been amended on numerous occasions. At the moment, various proposals to amend ANCSA are under discussion:

- A bill that would provide approximately 1.4 million acres of land in Alaska to the 13th Regional Corporation comprised of Alaska Native shareholders who enrolled in this out of state corporation. The Department of Natural Resources and the Governor's DC office are currently analyzing this legislation. Various concerns have been identified, including the impact on State selections called topfilings and on the pace of State selections under the Alaska Statehood Act. Although it had some initial reservations, the Alaska Federation of Natives now supports the bill, according to its proponents. Congressional hearings have not yet been scheduled.
- A bill that would complete Sealaska's land entitlement in the Tongass National Forest by allowing certain selections beyond the areas around villages originally withdrawn for selection. DNR, together with the Governor's DC office, is now examining maps depicting these selections. Legislation has not yet been introduced but undoubtedly will be. Opposition is expected from national environmental organizations and possibly from certain local communities.
- In the past, legislation has been proposed to provide a land entitlement to certain Southeast communities, such as Haines, which did not receive an entitlement under ANCSA. The rationale is that these communities were overlooked by Congress in 1971. No legislation has been introduced in the current Congress.
- The residents of Alexander Creek want to be treated as a village, rather than as a Native group, under ANCSA. This would increase their land entitlement by severalfold. The State is analyzing this proposal. Several issues have been identified, including possible land use conflicts and the precedent for other Native groups.

Rural Issues Talking Points (Nizich)

Commercial Fishing Issues:

ADF&G is working with local organizations on research and monitoring programs.

• Community Development Quota (CDQ) groups are funding important projects in Bristol Bay and the AYK Region to study catch size, gather escapement data and do genetic research. We're working with the Bristol Bay Economic Development Corporation, the Yukon Delta Fisheries Development Association, the Coastal Village Regional Fund, the Kuskokwim Native Association, the Norton Sound Economic Development Corporation, the Kodiak Regional Aquaculture Association and numerous others. Many of these projects are funded by the federal Office of Subsistence Management.

ADF&G is working to improve communication with rural residents regarding fishery management.

- The Alaska Department of Fish and Game (ADF&G) has worked to develop numerous stakeholder groups with which to discuss fishery management and gain input from users.
- Examples of these groups and efforts include weekly Yukon River Drainage Fishery Association meetings, the Kuskokwim River salmon Management Working Group, Prince William Sound Salmon Harvest Task Force, Southeast Alaska Seine Harvest Task Force (and similar groups for the gillnet and troll fisheries), and Kodiak herring fishery preseason stakeholder meetings.

Sport Fishing Issues:

Kodiak:

- The rural town of Kodiak and six villages are concerned with the development of a limited entry program for fresh and saltwater guides. Some residents support a limited entry system, while others do not. Some community members are concerned that a limited entry system will concentrate wealth and reduce the public's ability to receive charter services, which will ultimately hurt the local economy.
- Sport anglers, commercial and subsistence fishermen are concerned about the Litnik sockeye return, which has crashed. These fisheries have been closed for the majority of the past 4 seasons.
- Developing an enhancement project for king salmon along the Kodiak road system is an issue with Kodiak anglers, as well as anglers in Port Lions and Old Harbor, who would also like to see enhancement efforts in their communities.

<u>Anchorage/North Gulf Coast/Prince William Sound:</u>

- In these areas, many people are concerned about the impact of urban users on rural natural resources. For example, in Prince William Sound, sport anglers with boats that can go farther from port to find prime halibut fishing areas are causing consternation with some rural users (especially in areas like Chenega). They see recreational anglers in greater numbers or in new areas and the impact their presence has on the rural fishing experience. Likewise, in Cordova, the new fast ferry makes it convenient for anglers to get to a once semi-inaccessible area and the growth of those fisheries is likely to increase.
- In Prince William Sound, some residents are concerned that the federal subsistence halibut regulations will negatively impact their ability to sport fish halibut. This same issue regarding higher federal limits and means and methods for salmon is an issue on the Copper River Delta.

• Kenai Peninsula:

• A number of rural users feel there are undue restrictions on their access to fish. In other words if they were the primary users they would be able to consumptively use the resource (for example, with fall spawning closures for Dolly Varden in Upper Kenai

tributaries or tight limits on upper Kenai Rainbow Trout).

• These same users object to the level of commercial harvest of northern bound sockeye and coho salmon in the central district.

Bristol Bay:

- Resource development (mining and offshore oil and gas development) and its impacts on fish and wildlife populations and on subsistence, recreational, and commercial fisheries are seen by many in the region as a threat. This is especially true in regards to the possible development of the Pebble Mine and its potential impacts on the fish and wildlife resources of the Nushagak and Iliamna drainages.
- Some rural residents have also expressed concern about the possible future implementation of limited entry on guided sport fisheries in the area and its impacts on opportunity and the local economy.
- The Kvichak drainage sockeye salmon is currently a Stock of Management Concern and recent low returns have impacted all user groups. Additionally, reductions of daily sport bag limits, based on escapements and in accordance with the Kvichak In-river Sockeye Salmon Management Plan have raised issues as to whether or not it will be necessary to reduce sport bag limits for conservation.

• Interior:

- There is a perception among some rural residents that sport fisheries (or personal use and urban subsistence users) compete with rural subsistence users (and rural sport anglers) for fishing and harvest opportunities. This is usually the result of increasing use of an area by non-local (whether urban residents, non-residents or guided anglers) and/or a decrease in subsistence fishing opportunity due to declining abundance of target species.
- Another area of concern is maintaining access to sport fisheries in rural areas and addressing some confusion by non-rural anglers as to which lands are public and which are private (Native corporation and private) when trying to participate in sport fisheries.

Predator Management:

- Due to tradition, preference, availability, as well as the high cost of store-bought foods, rural Alaskans depend heavily on harvesting wild game. As such they are pragmatic about wildlife management and generally support predator management programs to increase the size of moose and caribou herds and to decrease competition between people and predators.
- Many rural residents would like to see expanded efforts by the State to reduce predator densities in their area. However, it is less widely recognized that the high cost and time necessary for collecting scientific data needed to defend such programs affects our ability to plan and implement predator control in new areas.
- Also, since predator control is not allowed on Fish & Wildlife Service or Park Service lands, the state cannot effectively reduce predation in regions of the state with large proportions of federal conservation unit lands.

Endangered Species Act:

• **Polar Bear**. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) proposed listing the polar bear as threatened throughout its entire range, solicited public comment, and expects to make a final decision by the end of this year. If it is listed, the Service will consider designating critical habitat along the north and west coastline of Alaska which could affect ongoing and proposed activities, such as shipping, oil and gas leasing, land and offshore developments. North

Slope residents are very concerned about increasing erosion, increasing late-summer ice free areas, and other effects of Arctic climate change, but the State does not believe listing the polar bear or designating critical habitat will be helpful and may actually be detrimental to conservation of polar bear.

- **Cook Inlet Beluga**. The National Marine Fisheries Service published a proposed rule to list Cook Inlet Beluga as Endangered with Extinction. If it is listed and critical habitat is designated in Cook Inlet, activities throughout the watershed of the entire Cook Inlet as well as in the marine areas could be subject to ESA permit stipulations or restrictions, such as recreational, personal use, and commercial fishing; waste water treatment of the Kenai Borough, City of Anchorage, Mat-Su Borough, and other communities; oil and gas leasing; proposed coal and other mining; the proposed Knik Bridge; fast ferry; small boat traffic, shipping, and other transportation activities both in the water and in the air. Communities throughout Cook Inlet could suffer economic impacts. The State is concerned that this listing is being proposed and the conservation plan has never been funded to provide population and habitat information.
 - o The National Marine Fisheries Service has scheduled Beluga Whale hearings for Homer on July 19th and for Anchorage on July 20th. The State will provide a witness.
- Yellow-Billed Loon. USFWS announced it intends to do a 90-day status review of the Yellow-Billed Loon population in northern and western Alaska based on possible impacts due to disturbance and loss of habitat in the coastal and low tundra areas. This could affect village activities, including fishing and hunting, development, motorized access, and other activities throughout the area if critical habitat is designated. The state recently participated in a multi-party effort to develop a conservation plan for this species, hoping that the plan would deal with loon conservation issues and obviate the need to consider a listing process.

Avian Influenza:

- In many rural areas, waterfowl and other birds taken in the spring and summer subsistence hunts form an important source of fresh meat. Although the threat to human health should wild birds arrive carrying a highly pathogenic form of avian influenza is very low, the fact that there is ANY risk of human infection has caused great concern.
- ADF&G has partnered with other state agencies through the Multi-Agency Coordination Group established by governor's proclamation to bring solid information to communities around the state. The agencies have emphasized information on how citizens can protect themselves against exposure to HPAI virus, as well as the need to prepare for community emergencies such as a flu pandemic.
- Also, ADF&G has cooperated with federal agencies in an early detection program designed to find the HPAI virus if it occurs in wild birds migrating to Alaska. State community outreach efforts and wild bird sampling are continuing this summer.

Fuel Prices:

• Rural hunters, fishers, and trappers are being affected by rising fuel prices, which affects their ability to harvest wild resources for personal consumption, sharing within the community, and (in the case of fur) income. To the extent that this reduces trapping effort and participation, wildlife management efforts to change predation levels could be affected, which could in turn result in reduced availability of wild meat.

Anchorage, Alaska: June 19, 2007 -- Leaders of the Anchorage SportsDome, a large non-profit sports facility that is slated to receive a \$1.5m State grant, have notified Governor Sarah Palin that they are withdrawing their grant request due to concerns that it promotes misunderstandings about the SportsDome's mission. Thanks to the financial support of ChangePoint church, private individuals, businesses and community sports organizations, the SportsDome has raised over 95% of its \$17 million funding from private sources. The \$1.5 million State grant was intended to help cover weather-related construction cost overruns. The SportsDome intends to replace the grant monies through additional private fundraising.

Leaders of many community organizations supported the SportsDome's State grant application, including the University of Alaska Anchorage, the Anchorage School District, the Municipality of Anchorage, and numerous soccer, baseball, softball and track-and-field organizations such as American Legion Baseball, Cook Inlet Soccer Club and Alaska RUSH Soccer. These supporters believe that a \$1.5 million investment of State money makes good sense for a number of reasons:

- Many Alaskans will benefit from the SportsDome. Literally tens of thousands of soccer players, runners, baseball and softball players, football players, walkers, etc. will use the facility for personal health maintenance and training for competition.
- Anchorage's athletes will no longer be disadvantaged by weathershortened seasons. Field-based athletics across Alaska will benefit from a facility capable of hosting state-wide competitions.
- According to ASD Superintendent Carol Comeau the year-round sports opportunities made possible by the SportsDome are, "a

deterrent to the increasing gang and youth violence issues in our community."

- Private investors and contributors desiring to benefit our community have paid over 95% of the SportsDome's development costs. It is remarkable that our community can enjoy such a facility with so little public funding.
- For the Anchorage School District, the SportsDome provides space and opportunity equivalent to eight new high-school gymnasiums—a value to the State of over \$60 million.
- The state of Alaska takes no financial risk with the SportsDome; ChangePoint church is responsible for any operational losses.

Leaders of the SportsDome project had intended this grant to strengthen this unique partnership between public and private non-profit sectors, allowing this facility to operate with minimal user fees and to benefit as many Alaskans as possible. Regrettably, misinformation generated by that effort has created such public confusion that to receive the grant at this point would compromise the SportsDome's primary mission. In particular, the SportsDome and ChangePoint boards want Alaskans to know that this facility is a gift to the community, not one built at its expense.

ABOUT ANCHORAGE SPORTSPLEX AND CHANGEPOINT:

ChangePoint is a non-denominational church in Anchorage with an average weekend attendance of 4,000 people. A central element of ChangePoint's mission is to demonstrate God's love for people by caring for practical needs in the community. ChangePoint's leadership is excited about the contribution the SportsDome will make to the health and well-being of Alaskans.

Anchorage Sportsplex, Inc. is an Alaskan 501(c)3 non-profit whose mission is to provide yearround track-and-field sports facilities for Alaskan athletes. It is currently constructing the Anchorage SportsDome, a four-acre indoor sports facility on the campus of ChangePoint church. The Anchorage Sportsplex's Board of Directors, appointed by ChangePoint's corporate board, includes members of the public who have no affiliation with the church.

Change Point notified the media that you will be there. Begich will be there, too, today.

Briefing books will be in your car which include the ANCSA briefing points, Change Point press release, and Kohring's resignation information.

Since you will be at Change Point, the media will jump on the opportunity to ask you about Vic Kohring's resignation and the BAC dismissal of the Creamery Board (did it this morning).

I will be at Change Point to assist and to make it orderly. I've told them that you have limited time there because you have to be at a 3pm meeting.

Anticipated questions:

BAC – dismissed Creamery Board. The BAC 7 appointed themselves temporarily as the Creamery Board. Did you order this? What have you asked them to do?

I did tell Dave Donaldson this morning (off air) that there will come a point where the Governor will step back and give the chance for the BAC to work. That you are not ordering their moves, but rather have tasked them with finding answers, and providing solutions and alternatives. It's up to the BAC now.

ChangePoint – were you going to veto anyway? Did you feel that appropriation was appropriate?

The dome will be a tremendous asset for the community. As such an asset, it should not be difficult for the private sector to step in and fund the dome for the benefit of Alaskans. There were of course questions regarding this one as to church and state and whether the money was used best. I have not made any final determinations as to a veto, but certainly there were red flags surrounding this one.

Kohring – surprised? How will his replacement happen? What are you looking for? (From a previous email from you): I will appoint someone with the acknowledgment that I believe it needs to be an even playing field when the seat is open for election nnex year. My appointment won't be the usual – loyalist who will receive my endorsement in the next election. It is the voters' choice whom they want to represent them and I will responsibly select Vic's replacement with some humbleness. I will respect the power that I hold.

Replacement must happen within 30 days of the resignation. Vic is resigning on July 19th. You will have 30 days from that date – looks like August 18th.

Your quote in the press release: "I do think that Representative Vic Kohring's resignation is not only in his best interest, but it's also in the state's best interest," said Governor Sarah Palin. "He has a lot on his plate in terms of a defense that he has to mount, and Kohring's constituents expect full-time representation without FBI probes and indictments and anything else that certainly casts a cloud over the individual legislator and the legislature as a whole."

Governor,

I had a brief opportunity to update Joe Balash last night on the LNG Export License discussions with ConocoPhillips and Marathon, but I'm not sure he will be able to provide you an update before your calls to the Producer CEO's today. It is possible Jim Mulva may raise the LNG Export License issue and I want you to know the latest information. As I advised last week, the attorney for the Consumer Advocacy Office, DNR's Oil & Gas staff and Craig Tillery, also with the Dept of Law, have been meeting with counterparts from Conoco & Marathon to determine if there was any common ground to be found on our three issues associated with the LNG Export License Extension. As of late yesterday it appears that we have found agreement on how to address two of the three issues: 1) access to the LNG plant for non-owner gas producers (through purchases of gas) and; & 2) replacing depleting reserves in the Cook Inlet in two ways (through future development of Marathon and Conoco's producing properties in the Cook Inlet & access to their geological and

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geophysical data). We are now starting to draft the agreement that ensures the companies follow-through on these two issues.

That leaves one issue outstanding and that is our requirement there be no export of LNG unless all the utilities have full supply contracts in-place (negotiated and approved by the RCA) before they may "lift" LNG for export (load cargos - referred to as "boats on the water"). The companies have indicated this demand is not commercially reasonable and they can find no way to accomodate this requirement. However, the companies seem satisfied that we have eliminated two of our demands and they are content to proceed to the Dept of Energy (DOE) with one issue outstanding. It is obvious they are comfortable they can make a convincing argument to DOE when the issue is heard. Therefore, the state's filing will be amended to reflect only one outstanding issue, and that amended filing must be presented to DOE by June 26th (unless some extension is granted). In the meantime Kevin Banks (DOG) will be developing detail on how our resolved issues have been addressed so that you (or DNR, whichever you prefer) have the material for a press release and information to respond to enquiries from the press. Kevin will provide this detail to Meghan Stapleton, Joe Balash and Mike Tibbles. This material will be completed by end of the day tomorrow (Thursday). One cautionary note: amending the filing and developing press materials all assumes that the agreement we are just beginning to develop on the two "resolved" issues is finalized and the companies don't back away from the verbal agreements.

Finally, just an FYI. The AGIA Team has been working very diligently on developing the RFA and we seem to be on schedule. We are still intending to get the RFA on the street on July 2nd, although we are simply telling people our "goal" is the first week of July. This all presumes nothing insurmountable presents over the next week. Let me know if you need any additional information. Marty R

Brief comments on three items -

* BLM Landscape legislation (Orrie Williams)

* This legislation would give the BLM specific authority to = identify and manage important landscapes. We and others have been = concerned that the legislation could be interpreted to restrict the BLM's = multiple use mandate and might be used by the environmental community to = litigate management decisions.

* Orrie Williams should know that we are coordinating the State's ad= vocacy with Doyon's

legal counsel. Right now, we are looking at a = tripartite solution that involves a general disclaimer, Alaska specific = language, and legislative history.

* The House SubCommittee Chairman and the BLM swear that they are not = trying to change existing policy. The SubCommittee Chair has told = Congressman Young that he will do whatever is necessary to address our = concerns. So, I am optimistic at the moment.

* We will continue our efforts in coordination with the Congressional = delegation, BLM, Alaska Miners Association, and Doyon.

* Section 8(a) Contracting

* It sounds like this discussion went well. We will stay in = contact with the Native community and members of Congress in order to = develop and implement a strategy that preserves the essential elements of = the program.

* This could be a tough fight in the Senate, but the program is = important enough to Native corporations and the Alaska economy to warrant = our full participation.

* Subsistence

* I don't claim to have the "Silver Bullet" either, but I'd like to help = you think through the issues at the appropriate time. Perhaps, it = should disqualify me, but I've worked on various permeations of this issue = since 1969.

* The closest the State ever came was a tripartite solution = involving an amendment to the State Constitution and revisions = to State and Federal statutory law. Even this approach incurred the = wrath of people at each end of the subsistence spectrum. Unfortunatel= y, many rural people now seem to favor federal management. =

* The Alaska Congressional delegation usually says that they won't act = at the federal level without a consensus among Alaskans about how to = proceed. Successive Secretaries of the Interior have seen subsistence= as the third rail of Alaska politics and have been reluctant to participat= e in the dialogue, citing their trust relationship to Alaska Natives. =

* None of this is said to discourage you but to restate the obvious. = ; That is, it will take a truly concerted effort (and, as you said, = perhaps Devine intervention) to move the parties toward a solution. =

* I wish the Alaska Supreme Court would decide the Manning case. = This could help in reframing the issue.

It sounds like you had a really good meeting with the Native = leaders.

Hi Kari,

I hope this note finds you well! Nikki Guilford and Susan Dotchin mentioned that you were inquiring about the typical participation in the Govs' Youth Program during our Annual Meetings. I wanted to get back to you to provide some background information.

As you may know, our Annual Meetings often have a smaller turnout of Governors (as opposed to our Winter Meeting here in Washington, DC). This summer, we are expecting about 35 governors to attend. In recent years, the Youth Program has had about 15-20 participants. The kids range in age generally from ages 5-6 up to mid-teens. We have had older teens and even college-age govs' kids occasionally participate in selected activities (usually water-themed activities---such as water parks, day at the beach, Duck ride/tour of waterfront in Seattle, etc.).

I have attached a chart showing the potential pool of govs' youth who might participate in this year's program. Since we have 12 new govs this year (including one who is not married and does not have any children/grandchildren), it is a little more difficult to predict how many youth will attend the annual meeting and participate in the Youth Program. Based on past history, however, govs' children (grandchildren) from Louisiana, Maine, Michigan, Montana, New Hampshire, Puerto Rico, South Carolina, South Dakota, Utah, and Wyoming have participated in the program. From anecdotal reports, I have heard that kids from Colorado, Iowa, Minnesota, and Oklahoma may also participate this year.

Additionally, if you are interested in learning more about states' policies and practices re: use of a state plane by the Governor and First Family, I will be happy to post a question on the Spouses' Staff listserv. The spouses' staff are very active listserv participants and may be able to provide useful information to you. Also, during our Spouses' Seminar this year in Oklahoma, the spouses themselves were discussing this issue!

I cc'd myself so that you can add my new email address to your contact list.

I talked with Mike yesterday about how we can recognize State employees who work long hours on big projects for the State - coming in on weekends and staying late just to get the job done. In DOA, two of these projects are the ALDER and Microsoft Exchange changeover. The bureaucratic Administrative Manual allows for hats, vests, etc. - no gift certificates because those are taxable - etc.

The Directors of these two divisions have asked what they can do ("we're way beyond pizza here") to recognize the approximately 75 State employees and contractors who have been working side by side for months to finish these projects. I've struggled with this particular request to help keep up morale with recognition of jobs well done. We looked at Tram tickets, jackets/vests, even a whale watching cruise (\$2,100) - but, the perception of such a reward to State employees would not be good. The Division directors understand that. What they asked for in further discussion is whether the Governor would consider a reception at the Governor's residence in recognition of their hard work? I said I thought that was a reasonable request and would ask. The timing is tight - because they will scatter back to other projects following July, the timeframe is the last two weeks of July or first several days of August.

Thank you for your consideration of this request. I think it's a bit unusual, but it does say something about what they think of their Governor that they think a reception would be very honoring for the employees. I think so, too, but you get what I'm saying.

Water-Mining Initiative Fails Legal Test

June 22, 2007, Anchorage, Alaska - Lieutenant Governor Sean Parnell denied certification yesterday of an application for an initiative related to water and mining. The initiative would have set out water quality-related prohibitions for any new metallic mining operations over 640 acres in size.

According to Lieutenant Governor Parnell, "The initiative would impermissibly allocate public lands and waters away from mining uses. The people, via Alaska's constitution and statutes, reserved these powers of appropriation to the legislature."

Lieutenant Governor Parnell's decision was supported by an Alaska Department of Law legal opinion, dated June 21, 2007, which concluded that "the initiative goes beyond regulation and is an impermissible allocation of public assets." The Department of Law relied on Alaska Supreme Court case precedent to conclude that the initiative improperly prevents concurrent use of resources by allocating both public land and water away from mining activity. The lieutenant governor's decision may be appealed within 30 days.

Hello Governor,

You certainly may use the state credit card to purchase meals. In Alaska, the daily meal allowance (per diem) is \$60.00 per day and covers breakfast (\$12.00), lunch (\$16.00) and dinner (\$32.00). Outside the state the allowance follows federal per diem and varies by location. You and Mr. Palin do not need to keep receipts for meals as we are only able to reimburse/pay the allowance amount. These meal allowance limits apply only to your personal meals. The specific meal "allowance" would not apply to the cost of your or the First Gentleman/family meals at official lunches or dinners, etc., that you, as Governor, may host while on travel status.

In travel status, you are entitled to the meal allowances except for in those instances where meals are provided... ie, if lunch is provided to you at an official event, your daily meal allowance reimbursement would be reduced by the lunch portion. If you use the state credit card for meals, when we process the TA close-out, we either pay you any additional eligible meal allowance or we deduct over-charges from other reimbursement checks. For example, if you charge \$40.00 for meals on a given day you will be reimbursed an additional \$20 for that day. If your state credit card meal charges are \$70.00 for a day, we will deduct \$10.00 from your overall reimbursements. We do need to know if the card charges include meals for other travelers in addition to yourself. That way we can include all eligible meal allowances when determining if additional meal allowance is to be reimbursed or if a portion of the charges need to be reduced from other or future reimbursements.

Governor, as you are the state employee and your duty station is Juneau, you are in travel status the entire time you are out of Juneau unless you advise us otherwise. For Mr. Palin and your family, if they travel on official business or in their official capacity as the First Family, we view them as being in travel status for: the duration of travel to and from an event and for the actual time spent at the event for meal allowance purposes (unless the meal was provided.) As requested, we have not paid any meal allowances for your daughters to date. But as I mentioned to Mr. Palin, at any time you or Mr. Palin request, we will calculate and pay applicable meal allowances for any of your daughters' trips.

For Mr. Palin's official travel we are reimbursing for meal allowances when we receive enough information to close out the TA. I believe we are 'batching' Mr. Palin's reimbursements so each trip does not generate a check but rather one check for several trips. I would be happy to provide a breakdown of what's been reimbursed and what's still pending that we're aware of to date. On your travel and the family's travel, we're unable to complete final processing until my shop receives the travel schedules and trip specifics and in some instances we may still be waiting information to close out TAs. Anytime you do not want a meal reimbursement we've included on a TA, please just scratch it out when we send the TA to you for review and signature and we will adjust the payment calculations. Sorry to be so long-winded. Please let me know if you want any further info or specific travel reimbursement breakdowns, etc.

Mike Nizich asked me to respond to your request for further information concerning my previous email on riders in the House Appropriations process.

The Interior Appropriations Bill will be debated on the House Floor tomorrow. Several amendments are expected, including at least four that would affect Alaska. We don't yet know exactly which amendments will be proposed.

• The Udall Amendment would prevent the use of recordable disclaimers of interest to confirm RS 2477 Rights of Way and would prohibit the use of a series of decisions issued by former Secretary Gale Norton. Recordable disclaimers can be issued by the BLM to confirm Rights of Way or navigable waters decisions. They are seen as a cost effective alternative to protracted litigation. Secretary Norton's RS 2477 decisions were based on a Tenth Circuit Court decision deemed favorable to the Western public land states.

The state has opposed a previous version of the Udall Amendment, and we have consulted with DNR on this one. The amendment would probably have no significant impact now, but it could later on. Alaska and Utah would be the principal victims.

• The King Cove Amendment, if introduced, would prohibit the proposed land exchange between Interior, the State, and the village of King Cove. Recently, the Congressional delegation proposed legislation to consummate the exchange, and you have previously expressed your support for the exchange.

The legislation is pending before the House Resources Committee. The amendment would have the effect of preempting the normal legislative process in favor of an appropriations rider.

- The Tongass Amendment would prohibit the use of Federal funds to construct timber roads in roadless areas. The amendment has been opposed previously by the state and the timber industry, because it would preempt the Tongass planning process and cripple the industry by denying access to certain timber sales. Our current concern with the amendment is premised on the state's recent comments to the Forest Service regarding TLMP revisions.
- The Polar Bear Amendment would prohibit the importation of bear parts from Canada. The Department of Fish and Game, Interior, and the International Association of Fish and Wildlife agencies oppose the

amendment.

Trophy hunting of Polar Bears is extremely important to the indigenous people of Canada. Guided hunts provide income and an incentive to conserve the resource. Some of the funds are used to implement the polar bear management program in Canada.

The amendment would have the effect of curtailing hunting, but the USFWS doesn't believe that hunting is the problem. The amendment does nothing to deal with the loss of critical habitat, which is the factor that the USFWS has identified as the problem.

• During committee consideration, the House Appropriations Committee adopted legislative history requiring that certain studies occur in Bristol Bay before lease sales could occur. These studies would focus on environmental, economic, and oil spill considerations. Because these studies are similar to what would be required in any event under the National Environmental Policy Act, Interior and the oil industry had no objection. Also, there is legislation pending before the House Resources Committee that would prohibit a lease sale.

Accordingly, it is thought that an amendment will not be proposed or, if it is, it will be opposed on the grounds that the committee report language already addresses the subject.

With all of this in mind, I felt comfortable contacting Congressman Young's staff to offer our assistance. Our opposition to the above amendments seems consistent with positions you have taken on related issues and/or with discussions with members of the Cabinet. The situation here is moving so quickly that I felt the need to express our concerns as soon as the news of the amendments became public.

Tony Soprano has nothing on Sarah Palin. A small town hockey mom with the clout of a mob boss. She has the business community nervous, oil companies shaking in their oily boots, politicians terrified.

Have you ever seen anything like it? I haven't.

Let's do a body count. Randy Ruedrich, Gregg Renkes, Jim Clark, Frank Murkowski, John Binkley, The Republican Machine, Andrew Halcro, Tony Knowles, Paul Jenkins, Bill Allen, Voice of the Times, Exxon, BP, Conoco Phillips and, yes, now the Alaska Board of Agriculture and The Alaska Creamery Board. She whacked them all and didn't suffer a scratch. Barracuda Palin can have you swimming with the fishes, never to be heard from again. Lisa Murkowski is U.S. senator today because Palin decided not to run against her. But she may still. Lisa, Don and, yes, even Ted, you better hope she feels at home at the mansion. Can you imagine running against her? What do you say, "I am the anti-truth-andtransparency candidate"?

Every time someone challenges this woman something bad happens to them. She slays her foes like the Israelites struck down enemies in the Old Testament. I'm not saying divine intervention is in play, but if you believe in that kind of thing, this would be close. What is it about Sarah Palin? While she's whacking people left and right she also charms the public and the media. She has more juice than any Alaska politician in recent memory. How does she do it? In view of your previous inquiry, I want to update you on the final = outcome of House action on the Alaska related amendments to the Interior = Appropriations bill.

In my opinion, these actions are significant for two reasons. = First, the amendments address important issues of public land = management and use in Alaska. Second, the House action may tell us = something about voting patterns regarding Alaska resource issues in the = current Congress.

Given the circumstances, I think we did quite well:

* By a healthy margin, the House defeated an amendment that would have = jeopardized polar bear management in Canada. This amendment was = opposed by the Canadian government, US Fish and Wildlife Service, various = wildlife groups, and us.

* Congressman Udall withdrew his amendment to restrict claims of access = under RS 2477 in the western public land states. Instead, legislative= history requests the Bush administration to report to Congress when = certain procedures and policies are implemented. This should not be = a significant barrier to RS 2477 claims.

* Amendments to prohibit the King Cove land exchange and oil and gas = leasing in Bristol Bay were not considered on the House floor.

* Our only real defeat was the House's adoption by a 2 to 1 margin of = the Chabot amendment, which would prohibit the construction of timber = roads through any roadless areas of the Tongass. At the moment, = there is no similar rider in the Senate's version of the Interior = Appropriations bill, and the Bush administration can be expected to oppose = the Chabot amendment because it would derogate from the Tongass planning = process.

Of course, this is just he first salvo in what may be a long campaign = in the current Congress. However, we will take victories where we = can, and perhaps our opponents will take heed that anti-Alaska resource = legislation may not be so easy to enact after all.

When I talked to Diane, she mentioned that she was sent an email. She read it to me- and it mentioned that the Palin family would not be returning until the fall. I'm not sure if I would've even been aware of the reporter/interview/email situation if I hadn't approached <u>Privileged</u> after her phone call with Mike and asked her what was happening- even then it took a phone call and more questions to kind of put it together and a phone call to Diane (after you & I talked).

As for the House schedule- it is common knowledge with the contractor/workers that the your family will not be in Juneau the month of July due to the window project and that

First I would like ot thank you for extending Senior Care benefits for seniors until July 31, 2007. This act prompted the Legislature to take up the bill in a special session and do the right thing in getting theese much needed benefits for low income Alaskan seniors in place.

Second: With your capital budget vetoes, our agency, Senior Citizens of Kodiak, Inc. was vetoed \$15,000 for equipment and maintenance projects. I understand your need to hold budgets in line. What is disappointing to me as an Executive Director is that our agency has taken advantage to write grants for capital projects every time a grant proposal for deferred maintenance is available from the state. There have been several deferred maintenance grants available just for senior centers, and agencies who serve seniors and other Alaska Mental Health Trust beneficiaries in the last two years. Many of the senior agencies who were not vetoed for capital projects in the 2008 capital budget have not done taken the time or used the opportunity to write proposals for these grants, but yet they have been awarded maintenance and equipment funds in the FY2008 capital budget.

So the message I am receiving from the state is those agencies who do not write grants (our last one for deferred maintenance was 231 pages in length), get funded and rewarded for NOT writing grants and we who do, get penalized. The reason given for our agency's veto was that the "funds were duplicate." I am guessing this referral was to the recent

grant award we received from the 231 pages-the grant amount was \$68,000. When I reviewed the capital budget and noted projects in Sterling, Soldotna, Nikiski and all around the state and I went back to review to see if any of these agencies had written deferred maintenance grants, (I always ask for the list of agencies who have written the grants and the scores for each at the end of the grant process), I was amazed to see that none had done so. So, our agency writes the grant (and you can only do so on weekends and week nights to complete the grant proposal) and we get \$15,000 taken away-those funds which could have been used!

for OTHER maintenance projects for our building (built in 1985).

It is discouraging to have taken such time and efforts on behalf of our staff and Board of Directors to continue to seek grants funds, write the proposals, get awarded the funds, only to know that there is an "easier" way of getting those funds. I only wish I had known this ahead of time.

Governor,

Joan and I looked through the backup regarding the projects listed in Mayor Begich's comments. After reading his comments, the inconsistency that comes to mind is Begich's ability to accurately read a spreadsheet.

He claims that Chugiak Benefit Society was funded even though it was nothing they asked for. In fact, we vetoed the benefits society money.

He claims that Chugiak Volunteer fire rescue was funded but Station 11 in Eagle River was not (and Eagle River serves more people). Chugiak requested \$75,000 to replace equipment including changing their 3 inch hoses to 5 inch. This is a life safety issue. Eagle River requested money to improve their fitness and dorm rooms (not life safety and not as high of a priority). He claims we funded the Chugiak historical society but not the Port of Anchorage. Again, he has his facts wrong. The historical society was appropriated \$5,000 for restoration of material (not even close to the \$10 million requested by the Port in which other avenues of financing could have been obtained). We vetoed all the money because it was not a priority of the state.

He compares Chugiak High's turf to Dimond's. They are different. Dimond was not a priority of the school district. We have a process by which communities can request funds for major projects (maintenance and construction). That is to put the project to the voters and seek school debt reimbursement from the State (usually 70% State and 30% local). Juneau voters just approved a project through this process. Chugiak's request was very similar, it was forwarded through the Municipality (why would the Mayor complain), received local support not only through a local vote but through a local mill levy to help support the project.

The recent budget decisions made by you demonstrate that, in spite of record revenues, we do not have sufficient funds for all the programs we would like to fund. Simply put, we need to put the money where it provides the maximum overall benefit for state and its residents.

To that end, I would like to bring to your attention a budget item that you can affect that can save millions of dollars, money that you could redirect to more worthy causes. I am referring to the state's decision to implement a Cisco telephone system and replace the installed Nortel system. Although the migration has already started, and Anchorage's "core" system was recently displaced, the same is scheduled to occur in Juneau in this fiscal year. Once this is done, there is a vague plan to extend out the migration to the "other" locations. In truth, the state can migrate the existing Nortel systems at a fraction of the cost that it is going to spend moving to a different platform. There is nothing the Cisco systems can do that the Nortel systems cannot do, and the savings is in the millions, perhaps tens of millions.

If you actually read this and decide to inquire on the validity of my statements, you should choose your advisers carefully, since Cisco is an excellent marketing company and has done an excellent job of making sure that it is present in any planning sessions. But if you look at the facts, you will find the state is squandering huge sums buying Cisco telephone system when it does not need to make these investments. For perhaps 1/3 the cost, you can migrate the Nortel system, and you can do it gradually.

You may be fed a line of bull stating that the Cisco systems are less expensive. This is probably because the bulk of the Cisco costs are being put into the "network" budget, not where it belongs if you are looking to compare apples to apples.

The state of Alaska spent 10 years creating a Nortel network, and it will spend 10 years displacing it. Although I did not agree with what the state did the first time, I see even less need for us to spend the amount of money it will take to move to a different platform. The task at hand is staggering. That is why it took 10 years. But if you go into any state office except your office and recently, the Anchorage offices, you will find a Nortel system. In your travels, take a close look. You will find that your "migration" to Cisco has just begun, and it will take years, perhaps a decade, to change all the systems out. And the cost will be staggering.

Do not listen to those who say the state has not invested in the Nortel system and that technology has passed them by. This is plain misinformation. In truth, the Nortel systems are extremely robust, and their cpu's can be replaced at a fraction of the cost of replacing the whole system, giving you VOIP where you want or need it, and leaving things alone where they are fine.

I don't expect an answer except that this has been given "appropriate" attention. But when I see the number of capital programs that you had to turn down, and when I see the amount of money being squandered on needlessly changing platforms, I believe you need to know what is going on and how you can get some of these programs funded that would otherwise not get done.

If you want to get an understanding of the extent of the Nortel systems installed or the effort that you are really going to have to make to totally go Cisco, you may want to contact John Cammeron. He used to work for the state when the Nortel systems were installed and was one of the main architects of the plan. He's retired now, but I suspect you could hire him as a consultant. You also have a few employees left from the original core telecom group that survived the "outsourcing" such as Ed Williams, and you can talk with them. I think you will find the state is throwing away an extremely valuable asset and spending a lot of money replacing something that does not need replacing and will be difficult or impossible to duplicate in today's environment.

I just have to send a message regarding the treatment of our wounded soldiers

due to my recent experience. For the sacrifices our troops make, when they need us, they should be given the best care possible. Maybe one of the best ways to say thank you.

My husband was wounded in an RFP IED incident. The Command back here in Anchorage doesn't even have the full or correct story. I have learned through emails with some of my husbands "guys" on what happened. With that aside, I havn't received any updates from my Command in about 5 days.

I was lucky that when my husband was wounded (June 24th), I was in DC lobbying on behalf of ACLU. During a meeting with Sen. Lisa Murkowski's office (June 25th), I was put in contact

with a member of her staff who works with Military Families. Any help or

information has come from his hard work. Nathan Bergerbest got me some needed information and got me in touch

with

my husbands Doctor there in Germany. (June 30th)

My husbands care and travel plans have changed almost on a daily basis. While in Germany he was diagnosed with TBI (Tramatic Brain Injury). I still do not know the extent of that diagnosis. Instead of being transferred to the hospital

here at home (which was the original plan), he has stopped over at Andrews Air Force Base in DC, awaiting transfer to Brooks Army Center in Texas. As of a call from my husband last night (July 1st), he doesn't know when he will be leaving DC. Seems they can't find the proper plane on an Air Force Base.

During this time, nothing new has been done to treat him. He still has an open wound on his thigh and several burns on the same leg and buttocks. His wound has not even been cleaned since leaving Germany. Their reason is that they are not capable of safely "putting him under", to clean it. The pain of this cleaning is way too severe for him to be awake. He is not on any antibiotics, which to me would be a first and necessary procedure. There have not been anymore tests on his brain, because they want to wait until he arrives

at Brooks.

So in short now, He was wounded a week ago, is in no better condition, and possibly worse. He has a slight infection, fainting spells, and reoccuring system shock.

I would like to see ALL of our troops given the needed care in a timely, expedited manner. That is what they deserve. I can only imagine what other soldiers are experiencing from their medical treatment.

If there is a "bandwagon" for this cause, I am ready to hop aboard or drive it myself.
